abnegation	Renunciation of your own interests in favor of the interests of others. <i>People are capable of abnegation and unselfishness.</i>
belie	Fail to fulfil or justify (a claim or expectation). <i>His lively alert manner belied his years.</i>
conflicting	In disagreement- John Morley. <i>Conflicting opinions.</i>
contravene	Go against, as of rules and laws. <i>He contravened the Official Secrets Act.</i>
contravention	An action which offends against a law, treaty, or other ruling. <i>There were repeated raids by one side upon the other in contravention of treaty terms.</i>
controvert	Prove to be false or incorrect. <i>Subsequent work from the same laboratory controverted these results.</i>
deny	Deny oneself something restrain especially from indulging in some pleasure. <i>There was no way that I was going to deny myself ice cream.</i>
disavow	Refuse to acknowledge; disclaim knowledge of; responsibility for, or association with. <i>Her husband disavowed her after 30 years of marriage and six children.</i>
disavowal	The denial of any responsibility or support for something; repudiation. <i>His disavowal of his previous writings.</i>
disclaim	Make a disclaimer about. <i>He disclaimed any responsibility.</i>
disown	Refuse to acknowledge or maintain any connection with. <i>Lovell s rich family had disowned him because of his marriage.</i>
dispute	Question whether (a statement or alleged fact) is true or valid. <i>He taught and disputed with local poets.</i>

impugn	Attack as false or wrong. <i>The father does not impugn her capacity as a good mother.</i>
inadmissible	Not deserving to be admitted. <i>An inadmissible interference in the affairs of the Church.</i>
misrepresent	Represent falsely. <i>This statement misrepresents my intentions.</i>
negate	Deny the existence of. <i>Alcohol negates the effects of the drug.</i>
neutralize	Make ineffective by counterbalancing the effect of. <i>The double agent was neutralized.</i>
no	Quantifier used with either mass nouns or plural count nouns for indicating a complete or almost complete lack or zero quantity of. <i>His no was loud and clear.</i>
nullify	Declare invalid. <i>Judges were unwilling to nullify government decisions.</i>
objection	The act of expressing earnest opposition or protest. <i>They have raised no objections to the latest plans.</i>
oppose	Set into opposition or rivalry. <i>The board opposed his motion.</i>
rebut	Drive back or repel (a person or attack). <i>He had to rebut charges of acting for the convenience of his political friends.</i>
rebuttal	(law) a pleading by the defendant in reply to a plaintiff's surrejoinder.
refutation	The action of proving a statement or theory to be wrong or false. <i>He fails to give a clear refutation of the argument.</i>
refute	Prove to be false or incorrect. <i>His voice challenging his audience to rise and refute him.</i>
reject	Reject with contempt. <i>These explanations of criminal behaviour have been rejected by sociologists.</i>
renounce	Turn away from; give up. <i>Isabella offered to renounce her son's claim to the French Crown.</i>
repudiate	Refuse to fulfil or discharge (an agreement, obligation, or debt). <i>The woman repudiated the divorce settlement.</i>
rescind	Cancel officially. <i>The government eventually rescinded the directive.</i>
