## Associations of "Contradicting" (30 Words)

<b>abnegation</b>	Renunciation of your own interests in favor of the interests of others. <i><b>Abnegation</b> of the Holy Trinity.</i>
<b>belie</b>	Represent falsely. <i>The quality of the music seems to <b>belie</b> the criticism.</i>
<b>conflicting</b>	In disagreement- John Morley. <i><b>Conflicting</b> opinions.</i>
<b>contravene</b>	Offend against the prohibition or order of (a law, treaty, or code of conduct). <i>The Privy Council held that the prosecution <b>contravened</b> the rights of the individual.</i>
<b>contravention</b>	Coming into conflict with. <i>There were repeated raids by one side upon the other in <b>contravention</b> of treaty terms.</i>
<b>controvert</b>	Be resistant to. <i>The views in the article have been <b>controverted</b>.</i>
<b>deny</b>	Deny formally an allegation of fact by the opposing party in a legal suit. <i>Both firms <b>deny</b> any responsibility for the tragedy.</i>
<b>disavow</b>	Refuse to acknowledge; disclaim knowledge of; responsibility for, or association with. <i>Her husband <b>disavowed</b> her after 30 years of marriage and six children.</i>
<b>disavowal</b>	Denial of any connection with or knowledge of. <i>His <b>disavowal</b> of his previous writings.</i>
<b>disclaim</b>	Make a disclaimer about. <i>The school <b>disclaimed</b> any responsibility for his death.</i>
<b>disown</b>	Refuse to acknowledge or maintain any connection with. <i>Lovell s rich family had <b>disowned</b> him because of his marriage.</i>
<b>dispute</b>	Take exception to. <i>The estate <b>disputes</b> that it is responsible for the embankment.</i>

<b>impugn</b>	Dispute the truth, validity, or honesty of (a statement or motive); call into question. <i>The father does not <b>impugn</b> her capacity as a good mother.</i>
<b>inadmissible</b>	Not to be allowed or tolerated. <i><b>Inadmissible</b> evidence.</i>
<b>misrepresent</b>	Give a false or misleading account of the nature of. <i>This statement <b>misrepresents</b> my intentions.</i>
<b>negate</b>	Make ineffective by counterbalancing the effect of. <i>This action will <b>negate</b> the effect of my efforts.</i>
<b>neutralize</b>	Make (something) ineffective by applying an opposite force or effect. <i>The double agent was <b>neutralized</b>.</i>
<b>no</b>	Quantifier used with either mass nouns or plural count nouns for indicating a complete or almost complete lack or zero quantity of. <i>Did it with <b>no</b> help.</i>
<b>nullify</b>	Show to be invalid. <i>Insulin can block the release of the hormone and thereby <b>nullify</b> the effects of training.</i>
<b>objection</b>	The act of protesting; a public (often organized) manifestation of dissent. <i>They have raised no <b>objections</b> to the latest plans.</i>
<b>oppose</b>	Actively resist (a person or system). <i>A workers movement <b>opposed</b> the regime.</i>
<b>rebut</b>	Claim or prove that (evidence or an accusation) is false. <i>He had to <b>rebut</b> charges of acting for the convenience of his political friends.</i>
<b>rebuttal</b>	(law) a pleading by the defendant in reply to a plaintiff's surrejoinder.
<b>refutation</b>	The action of proving a statement or theory to be wrong or false. <i>His <b>refutation</b> of the charges was short and persuasive.</i>
<b>refute</b>	Deny or contradict (a statement or accusation). <i>These claims have not been convincingly <b>refuted</b>.</i>
<b>reject</b>	Reject with contempt. <i>The journal <b>rejected</b> the student s paper.</i>
<b>renounce</b>	Leave (a job, post, or position) voluntarily. <i>They <b>renounced</b> the armed struggle.</i>
<b>repudiate</b>	Cast off. <i>She has <b>repudiated</b> policies associated with previous party leaders.</i>
<b>rescind</b>	Revoke, cancel, or repeal (a law, order, or agreement). <i>The government eventually <b>rescinded</b> the directive.</i>
