agreeable	Prepared to agree or consent. They were agreeable to its publication.
appropriate	Suitable or proper in the circumstances. This isn t the appropriate time or place.
auspicious	Auguring favorable circumstances and good luck. <i>He was respectful to his auspicious customers.</i>
beneficial	Resulting in good; favourable or advantageous. The beneficial effects of a temperate climate.
close to	Strictly confined or guarded.
commodious	Convenient. A <i>commodious</i> building suitable for conventions.
encouraging	Giving someone support or confidence; supportive. <i>Encouraging</i> advances in medical research.



expedient	Serving to promote your interest. Either side could break the agreement if it were expedient to do so.
favourable	Giving consent. The exhibitions received favourable reviews.
felicitous	Marked by good fortune. A felicitous speaker.
fit	Meeting adequate standards for a purpose. In no fit state to continue.
fitting	Being precisely fitting and right. Loose fitting trousers.
<u>fortuitous</u>	Happening by a lucky chance; fortunate. <i>Fortuitous</i> encounters strange accidents of fortune.
<u>fruitful</u>	(of a person) producing many offspring. And God said unto them Be fruitful and multiply.
gainful	Serving to increase wealth or resources; providing money or other benefit. <i>He soon found gainful employment.</i>
handy for	Easy to reach.
happy	Fortunate and convenient. I m happy with his performance.
heaven-sent	Peculiarly fortunate or appropriate; as if by divine intervention.
helpful	Providing assistance or serving a useful function. <i>Helpful staff.</i>
just around the corner from	Used especially of what is legally or ethically right or proper or fitting- A.Lincoln.
near	Located on the nearside of a vehicle. <i>Walking in these shoes is the nearest thing to floating on air.</i>
near to	Very close in resemblance.
not far from	Located at a great distance in time or space or degree.
<u>opportune</u>	Done or occurring at a favourable time; well timed. An opportune place to make camp.
<u>profitable</u>	(of a business or activity) yielding profit or financial gain. Profitable speculation on the stock market.
promising	Full or promise. A promising start to the season.



<u>propitious</u>	Presenting favorable circumstances; likely to result in or show signs of success. Propitious omens.
providential	Peculiarly fortunate or appropriate; as if by divine intervention. They took it for granted that the order of the world reflects a designing providential hand.
rewarding	Providing satisfaction; gratifying. A rewarding career as a paramedic.
<u>suitable</u>	Worthy of being chosen especially as a spouse. These toys are not suitable for children under five.
<u>suited</u>	Meant or adapted for an occasion or use. A dark suited man.
<u>timely</u>	Done or occurring at a favourable or useful time; opportune. With timely treatment the patient has a good chance of recovery.
trouble-free	Without problems or difficulties.
useful	Having a useful function. The girl felt motherly and useful .
valuable	Extremely useful or important. A valuable antique.
welcome	Used to indicate relief at relinquishing the control or possession of something to someone else. <i>Made the children feel welcome</i> .
well placed for	Resulting favorably.
well situated for	In good health especially after having suffered illness or injury.
well timed	Wise or advantageous and hence advisable.

- The new car park will make shopping much more convenient.
- Guests were relaxing beneath a convenient palm tree.
- *I* phoned your office to confirm that this date is convenient.

assuage	Make (an unpleasant feeling) less intense. The letter assuage d the fears of most members.
available	Obtainable or accessible and ready for use or service. <i>Do you think he s available</i> .
<u>casual</u>	A youth belonging to a subculture characterized by the wearing of expensive casual clothing and frequently associated with football hooliganism. A casual correspondence with a former teacher.
<u>clarification</u>	The act of removing solid particles from a liquid. <i>Please advise us if you require further clarification</i> .



comfortable	Providing or experiencing physical well-being or relief (`comfy' is informal. <i>The antihistamine made her feel more comfortable.</i>
conveniently	In a convenient manner. The switch was conveniently located.
<u>cozy</u>	Suggesting connivance. A cozy arrangement with the police.
<u>ease</u>	Of share prices interest rates etc decrease in value or amount. I ease d down the slope with care.
easiness	The quality of being easy in behavior or style. A natural easiness of manner.
easy	With ease easy is sometimes used informally for easily. <i>The house is easy to heat.</i>
facilitate	Make (an action or process) easy or easier. You could facilitate the process by sharing your knowledge.
facilitation	The enhancement of the response of a neuron to a stimulus following prior stimulation. The response is dependent on the frequency of stimulation and on neuromuscular facilitation .
<u>handy</u>	Placed or occurring conveniently. Found a handy spot for the can opener.
niche	Place something in a niche or recess. <i>He is now a partner at a leading law firm and feels he has found his</i> niche .
obtainable	Capable of being obtained. Savings of up to 50 percent are obtainable .
pacify	Bring peace to (a country or warring factions), especially by the use or threat of military force. The UN troops are working to pacify Bosnia.
<u>pushover</u>	A try in which one side in a scrum pushes the ball over the opponents' goal line. This is going to be a pushover .
relaxation	An occurrence of control or strength weakening. I guided my patient into a state of hypnotic relaxation .
relieve	Relieve oneself of troubling information. He relieve d her of her baggage.
roomy	(especially of accommodation) having plenty of room; spacious. <i>Roomy trousers.</i>



shuck	Remove the shucks from. <i>Shuck corn.</i>
simple	(of a leaf or stem) not divided or branched. A quiet unassuming man with simple tastes.
simplicity	A thing that is plain or uncomplicated. The grandeur and simplicity of Roman architecture.
simplification	Elimination of superfluous details. <i>He is proposing simplification of the planning system.</i>
<u>simplify</u>	Make simpler or easier or reduce in complexity or extent. We had to simplify the instructions.
<u>straightforward</u>	Uncomplicated and easy to do or understand. A straightforward set of instructions.
useful	Having a useful function. Aspirins are useful for headaches.
utilizable	Capable of being put to a profitable or practical use.
well	Often used as a combining form in a good or proper or satisfactory manner or to a high standard good is a nonstandard dialectal variant for well.
