Prepared to agree or consent.

*They were **agreeable** to its publication.*

**appropriate**

Suitable or proper in the circumstances.

*This isn't the **appropriate** time or place.*

**auspicious**

Auguring favorable circumstances and good luck.

*He was respectful to his **auspicious** customers.*

**beneficial**

Resulting in good; favourable or advantageous.

*The **beneficial** effects of a temperate climate.*

**close to**

Strictly confined or guarded.

**commodious**

Convenient.

*A **commodious** building suitable for conventions.*

**encouraging**

Giving someone support or confidence; supportive.

***Encouraging** advances in medical research.*

<b>expedient</b>	Serving to promote your interest. <i>Either side could break the agreement if it were <b>expedient</b> to do so.</i>
<b>favourable</b>	Giving consent. <i>The exhibitions received <b>favourable</b> reviews.</i>
<b>felicitous</b>	Marked by good fortune. <i>A <b>felicitous</b> speaker.</i>
<b>fit</b>	Meeting adequate standards for a purpose. <i>In no <b>fit</b> state to continue.</i>
<b>fitting</b>	Being precisely fitting and right. <i>Loose <b>fitting</b> trousers.</i>
<b>fortuitous</b>	Happening by a lucky chance; fortunate. <i><b>Fortuitous</b> encounters strange accidents of fortune.</i>
<b>fruitful</b>	(of a person) producing many offspring. <i>And God said unto them Be <b>fruitful</b> and multiply.</i>
<b>gainful</b>	Serving to increase wealth or resources; providing money or other benefit. <i>He soon found <b>gainful</b> employment.</i>
<b>handy for</b>	Easy to reach.
<b>happy</b>	Fortunate and convenient. <i>I m <b>happy</b> with his performance.</i>
<b>heaven-sent</b>	Peculiarly fortunate or appropriate; as if by divine intervention.
<b>helpful</b>	Providing assistance or serving a useful function. <i><b>Helpful</b> staff.</i>
<b>just around the corner from</b>	Used especially of what is legally or ethically right or proper or fitting- A.Lincoln.
<b>near</b>	Located on the nearside of a vehicle. <i>Walking in these shoes is the <b>nearest</b> thing to floating on air.</i>
<b>near to</b>	Very close in resemblance.
<b>not far from</b>	Located at a great distance in time or space or degree.
<b>opportune</b>	Done or occurring at a favourable time; well timed. <i>An <b>opportune</b> place to make camp.</i>
<b>profitable</b>	(of a business or activity) yielding profit or financial gain. <i><b>Profitable</b> speculation on the stock market.</i>
<b>promising</b>	Full or promise. <i>A <b>promising</b> start to the season.</i>

propitious

Presenting favorable circumstances; likely to result in or show signs of success.

***Propitious*** omens.

**providential**

Peculiarly fortunate or appropriate; as if by divine intervention.  
*They took it for granted that the order of the world reflects a designing **providential** hand.*

**rewarding**

Providing satisfaction; gratifying.

*A **rewarding** career as a paramedic.*

suitable

Worthy of being chosen especially as a spouse.

*These toys are not **suitable** for children under five.*

suited

Meant or adapted for an occasion or use.

*A dark **suited** man.*

timely

Done or occurring at a favourable or useful time; opportune.

*With **timely** treatment the patient has a good chance of recovery.*

**trouble-free**

Without problems or difficulties.

**useful**

Having a useful function.

*The girl felt motherly and **useful**.*

**valuable**

Extremely useful or important.

*A **valuable** antique.*

**welcome**

Used to indicate relief at relinquishing the control or possession of something to someone else.

*Made the children feel **welcome**.*

**well placed for**

Resulting favorably.

**well situated for**

In good health especially after having suffered illness or injury.

**well timed**

Wise or advantageous and hence advisable.

Capable of being read with comprehension.

*Making learning opportunities more **accessible** to adults.*

### assuage

Make (an unpleasant feeling) less intense.

*The letter **assuaged** the fears of most members.*

### available

Obtainable or accessible and ready for use or service.

*Do you think he s **available**.*

### casual

A youth belonging to a subculture characterized by the wearing of expensive casual clothing and frequently associated with football hooliganism.

*A **casual** correspondence with a former teacher.*

### clarification

The act of removing solid particles from a liquid.

*Please advise us if you require further **clarification**.*

<b>comfortable</b>	Providing or experiencing physical well-being or relief (‘comfy’ is informal. <i>The antihistamine made her feel more <b>comfortable</b>.</i>
<b>conveniently</b>	In a convenient manner. <i>The switch was <b>conveniently</b> located.</i>
<b>cozy</b>	Suggesting connivance. <i>A <b>cozy</b> arrangement with the police.</i>
<b>ease</b>	Of share prices interest rates etc decrease in value or amount. <i>I <b>eased</b> down the slope with care.</i>
<b>easiness</b>	The quality of being easy in behavior or style. <i>A natural <b>easiness</b> of manner.</i>
<b>easy</b>	With ease easy is sometimes used informally for easily. <i>The house is <b>easy</b> to heat.</i>
<b>facilitate</b>	Make (an action or process) easy or easier. <i>You could <b>facilitate</b> the process by sharing your knowledge.</i>
<b>facilitation</b>	The enhancement of the response of a neuron to a stimulus following prior stimulation. <i>The response is dependent on the frequency of stimulation and on neuromuscular <b>facilitation</b>.</i>
<b>handy</b>	Placed or occurring conveniently. <i>Found a <b>handy</b> spot for the can opener.</i>
<b>niche</b>	Place something in a niche or recess. <i>He is now a partner at a leading law firm and feels he has found his <b>niche</b>.</i>
<b>obtainable</b>	Capable of being obtained. <i>Savings of up to 50 percent are <b>obtainable</b>.</i>
<b>pacify</b>	Bring peace to (a country or warring factions), especially by the use or threat of military force. <i>The U N troops are working to <b>pacify</b> Bosnia.</i>
<b>pushover</b>	A try in which one side in a scrum pushes the ball over the opponents’ goal line. <i>This is going to be a <b>pushover</b>.</i>
<b>relaxation</b>	An occurrence of control or strength weakening. <i>I guided my patient into a state of hypnotic <b>relaxation</b>.</i>
<b>relieve</b>	Relieve oneself of troubling information. <i>He <b>relieved</b> her of her baggage.</i>
<b>roomy</b>	(especially of accommodation) having plenty of room; spacious. <i><b>Roomy</b> trousers.</i>



<b>shuck</b>	Remove the shucks from. <b>Shuck</b> corn.
<b>simple</b>	(of a leaf or stem) not divided or branched. <i>A quiet unassuming man with <b>simple</b> tastes.</i>
<b>simplicity</b>	A thing that is plain or uncomplicated. <i>The grandeur and <b>simplicity</b> of Roman architecture.</i>
<b>simplification</b>	Elimination of superfluous details. <i>He is proposing <b>simplification</b> of the planning system.</i>
<a href="#"><u>simplify</u></a>	Make simpler or easier or reduce in complexity or extent. <i>We had to <b>simplify</b> the instructions.</i>
<a href="#"><u>straightforward</u></a>	Uncomplicated and easy to do or understand. <i>A <b>straightforward</b> set of instructions.</i>
<b>useful</b>	Having a useful function. <i>Aspirins are <b>useful</b> for headaches.</i>
<b>utilizable</b>	Capable of being put to a profitable or practical use.
<b>well</b>	Often used as a combining form in a good or proper or satisfactory manner or to a high standard good is a nonstandard dialectal variant for well. <i>It would be some time before Sarah was completely <b>well</b>.</i>
