- *A location where airflows or ocean currents meet, characteristically marked by upwelling (of air) or downwelling (of water).*

<b><u>conjunction</u></b>	The grammatical relation between linguistic units words or phrases or clauses that are connected by a conjunction. <i>A <b>conjunction</b> of favourable political and economic circumstances.</i>
<b>convergency</b>	The act of converging (coming closer).
<b>converging</b>	The act of converging coming closer.
<b>crossing</b>	The action of crossing something. <i>The <b>crossing</b> of the Pennines.</i>
<b>fork</b>	A flash of forked lightning. <i>A hot <b>fork</b> buffet.</i>
<b>interchange</b>	The act of changing one thing for another thing. <i>Turn left at the next <b>interchange</b>.</i>
<b><u>intersection</u></b>	The set of elements common to two or more sets. <i>The set of red hats is the <b>intersection</b> of the set of hats and the set of red things.</i>
<b>junction</b>	The action or fact of joining or being joined. <i>The <b>junction</b> of the two rivers.</i>
<b>meeting point</b>	A casual or unexpected convergence.
<b><u>overlap</u></b>	A part or amount which overlaps. <i>There is some <b>overlap</b> in requirements.</i>
<b><u>union</u></b>	A part of a flag with an emblem symbolizing national union typically occupying the upper corner next to the staff. <i>He was opposed to closer political or economic <b>union</b> with Europe.</i>
<b>vertex</b>	A meeting point of two lines that form an angle.

<b>absorbed</b>	Having one's attention fully engaged; greatly interested. <i>The <b>absorbed</b> light intensity.</i>
<b>boulevard</b>	A wide street or thoroughfare. <i>Sunset <b>Boulevard</b>.</i>
<b>centered</b>	Being or placed in the center.
<b>collect</b>	Gather or collect. <i>He lost control of the truck and <b>collected</b> two cats.</i>
<b>compile</b>	Produce (a list or book) by assembling information collected from other sources. <i>The figures were <b>compiled</b> from a survey of 2 000 schoolchildren.</i>
<b>concentrate</b>	A concentrated example of something. <i>A threatened tax rise <b>concentrates</b> the mind wonderfully.</i>
<b>concentration</b>	Strengthening the concentration as of a solute in a mixture by removing diluting material. <i>The gas can collect in dangerous <b>concentrations</b>.</i>
<b>confluent</b>	A branch that flows into the main stream. <i>These <b>confluent</b> tones helped to fuse and unite his landscapes.</i>
<b>converge</b>	(of lines) tend to meet at a point. <i>The crowd <b>converged</b> on the movie star.</i>
<b>convergent</b>	Coming closer together; converging. <i>One of the most bizarre examples of <b>convergent</b> evolution concerns the so called periodical cicadas.</i>
<b>crossing</b>	The action of crossing something. <i>A short ferry <b>crossing</b>.</i>
<b>emphasize</b>	Make (something) more clearly defined. <i>Dr Jones <b>emphasizes</b> exercise in addition to a change in diet.</i>
<b>emphasized</b>	Spoken with emphasis.
<b>emphatically</b>	In a forceful way. <i>She closed the door behind her <b>emphatically</b>.</i>
<b>focus</b>	Put an image into focus. <i>She <b>focused</b> her eyes on his face.</i>
<b>focused</b>	(of light rays) converging on a point. <i><b>Focused</b> light rays can set something afire.</i>
<b>gather</b>	A part of a garment that is gathered. <i>I <b>gathered</b> that they were old friends.</i>

<b><u>intensive</u></b>	An intensive adjective adverb or particle an intensifier. <i><b>Intensive</b> care.</i>
<b><u>intently</u></b>	With earnest and eager attention. <i>Everybody was listening <b>intently</b>.</i>
<b>intersect</b>	Divide (something) by passing or lying across it. <i>The area is <b>intersected</b> only by minor roads.</i>
<b><u>intersection</u></b>	The act of intersecting (as joining by causing your path to intersect your target's path). <i>His course is on a direct <b>intersection</b> with ours.</i>
<b>leadership</b>	The body of people who lead a group. <i>The party prospered under his <b>leadership</b>.</i>
<b>leading</b>	Having the leading position or higher score in a contest. <i>The <b>leading</b> man.</i>
<b>locally</b>	To a restricted area of the body. <i>Should the data be stored <b>locally</b> or remotely.</i>
<b><u>overlap</u></b>	A part or amount which overlaps. <i>The union's commitments <b>overlapped</b> with those of NATO.</i>
<b><u>partially</u></b>	To some extent; in some degree; not wholly. <i>The work <b>partially</b> fulfills the function of a historical memoir.</i>
<b><u>portion</u></b>	A part of something divided between two or more people; a share. <i>They <b>portioned</b> the meat perfectly.</i>
<b>roadway</b>	The part of a road intended for vehicles, in contrast to the pavement or verge.
<b>superimpose</b>	Place or lay (one thing) over another, typically so that both are still evident. <i>Can you <b>superimpose</b> the two images.</i>
<b>tributary</b>	Flowing into a larger stream. <i>A <b>tributary</b> colony.</i>
