- *The act of converging (coming closer).*
- *The occurrence of two or more things coming together.*
- *The tendency of unrelated animals and plants to evolve superficially similar characteristics under similar environmental conditions.*
- *The process or state of converging.*
- *A representation of common ground between theories or phenomena.*
- *The approach of an infinite series to a finite limit.*
- *A location where airflows or ocean currents meet, characteristically marked by upwelling (of air) or downwelling (of water).*



Synonyms of "Convergence" as a noun (18 Words)

- abutment** The process of supporting something with an abutment.
*The first bridge was of timber with stone **abutments**.*
- apex** The point in turning a corner when the vehicle is closest to the edge of the track.
*The **apex** of the roof.*
- branching** The act of branching out or dividing into branches.
- coming together** The moment of most intense pleasure in sexual intercourse.
- concourse** A crowd or assembly of people.
*The **concourse** of bodies.*
- confluence** A place where things merge or flow together (especially rivers).
*Pittsburgh is located at the **confluence** of the Allegheny and Monongahela rivers.*

<u>conjunction</u>	The grammatical relation between linguistic units words or phrases or clauses that are connected by a conjunction. <i>A conjunction of favourable political and economic circumstances.</i>
convergency	The act of converging (coming closer).
converging	The act of converging coming closer.
crossing	The action of crossing something. <i>The crossing of the Pennines.</i>
fork	A flash of forked lightning. <i>A hot fork buffet.</i>
interchange	The act of changing one thing for another thing. <i>Turn left at the next interchange.</i>
<u>intersection</u>	The set of elements common to two or more sets. <i>The set of red hats is the intersection of the set of hats and the set of red things.</i>
junction	The action or fact of joining or being joined. <i>The junction of the two rivers.</i>
meeting point	A casual or unexpected convergence.
<u>overlap</u>	A part or amount which overlaps. <i>There is some overlap in requirements.</i>
<u>union</u>	A part of a flag with an emblem symbolizing national union typically occupying the upper corner next to the staff. <i>He was opposed to closer political or economic union with Europe.</i>
vertex	A meeting point of two lines that form an angle.

absorbed	Having one's attention fully engaged; greatly interested. <i>The absorbed light intensity.</i>
boulevard	A wide street or thoroughfare. <i>Sunset Boulevard.</i>
centered	Being or placed in the center.
collect	Gather or collect. <i>He lost control of the truck and collected two cats.</i>
compile	Produce (a list or book) by assembling information collected from other sources. <i>The figures were compiled from a survey of 2 000 schoolchildren.</i>
concentrate	A concentrated example of something. <i>A threatened tax rise concentrates the mind wonderfully.</i>
concentration	Strengthening the concentration as of a solute in a mixture by removing diluting material. <i>The gas can collect in dangerous concentrations.</i>
confluent	A branch that flows into the main stream. <i>These confluent tones helped to fuse and unite his landscapes.</i>
converge	(of lines) tend to meet at a point. <i>The crowd converged on the movie star.</i>
convergent	Coming closer together; converging. <i>One of the most bizarre examples of convergent evolution concerns the so called periodical cicadas.</i>
crossing	The action of crossing something. <i>A short ferry crossing.</i>
emphasize	Make (something) more clearly defined. <i>Dr Jones emphasizes exercise in addition to a change in diet.</i>
emphasized	Spoken with emphasis.
emphatically	In a forceful way. <i>She closed the door behind her emphatically.</i>
focus	Put an image into focus. <i>She focused her eyes on his face.</i>
focused	(of light rays) converging on a point. <i>Focused light rays can set something afire.</i>
gather	A part of a garment that is gathered. <i>I gathered that they were old friends.</i>

<u>intensive</u>	An intensive adjective adverb or particle an intensifier. <i>Intensive care.</i>
<u>intently</u>	With earnest and eager attention. <i>Everybody was listening intently.</i>
intersect	Divide (something) by passing or lying across it. <i>The area is intersected only by minor roads.</i>
<u>intersection</u>	The act of intersecting (as joining by causing your path to intersect your target's path). <i>His course is on a direct intersection with ours.</i>
leadership	The body of people who lead a group. <i>The party prospered under his leadership.</i>
leading	Having the leading position or higher score in a contest. <i>The leading man.</i>
locally	To a restricted area of the body. <i>Should the data be stored locally or remotely.</i>
<u>overlap</u>	A part or amount which overlaps. <i>The union's commitments overlapped with those of NATO.</i>
<u>partially</u>	To some extent; in some degree; not wholly. <i>The work partially fulfills the function of a historical memoir.</i>
<u>portion</u>	A part of something divided between two or more people; a share. <i>They portioned the meat perfectly.</i>
roadway	The part of a road intended for vehicles, in contrast to the pavement or verge.
superimpose	Place or lay (one thing) over another, typically so that both are still evident. <i>Can you superimpose the two images.</i>
tributary	Flowing into a larger stream. <i>A tributary colony.</i>
