Conversant as an Adjective

Definitions of "Conversant" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “conversant” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Well informed about or knowing thoroughly.*
- *Familiar with or knowledgeable about something.*
- *(usually followed by `with') well informed about or knowing thoroughly.*



Synonyms of "Conversant" as an adjective (4 Words)

acquainted with Having fair knowledge of.

familiar Informal or intimate to an inappropriate degree.
*A day like any other filled with **familiar** duties and experiences.*

familiar with Having mutual interests or affections; of established friendship.

no stranger to Quantifier; used with either mass nouns or plural count nouns for indicating a complete or almost complete lack or zero quantity of.



Usage Examples of "Conversant" as an adjective

- *You need someone who is conversant with the new technology.*
- *Conversant with business trends.*



Associations of "Conversant" (30 Words)

- acquaintance** Acquaintances considered collectively.
*A wide circle of friends and **acquaintances**.*
- acquainted** Having fair knowledge of.
*Fully **acquainted** with the facts.*
- advised** Acting in a way that would be recommended; sensible; wise.
*Be kept **advised**.*
- ambient** Relating to ambient music.
***Ambient** sound.*
- close** Engage at close quarters.
*She finished a **close** second.*
- closely** In a collective or unified way.
*A **closely** guarded plan.*

<u>closeness</u>	A feeling of being intimate and belonging together. <i>The geographical closeness of our two countries.</i>
completely	To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent (‘whole’ is often used informally for ‘wholly’). <i>Was completely at fault.</i>
<u>confidant</u>	Someone to whom private matters are confided. <i>A close confidante of the princess.</i>
connected	Stored in, controlled by, or in direct communication with a central computer. <i>A connected series of cargo holds.</i>
<u>cozy</u>	Having or fostering a warm or friendly and informal atmosphere. <i>A cozy arrangement with the police.</i>
enlightened	Characterized by full comprehension of the problem involved. <i>An enlightened electorate.</i>
entire	Constituting the undiminished entirety lacking nothing essential especially not damaged. <i>An entire town devastated by an earthquake.</i>
<u>familiar</u>	A spirit (usually in animal form) that acts as an assistant to a witch or wizard. <i>He was familiar with those roads.</i>
<u>familiarity</u>	Close acquaintance with or knowledge of something. <i>The reassuring familiarity of his parents home.</i>
familiarly	In an intimately familiar manner.
<u>friendship</u>	The emotions or conduct of friends; the state of being friends. <i>The foreign ministers extended to eastern Europe the hand of friendship.</i>
fully	Sufficiently; more than adequately. <i>He didn't fully understand.</i>
informed	Having much knowledge or education. <i>An informed readership.</i>
intimacy	A cosy and private or relaxed atmosphere. <i>The room had a peaceful sense of intimacy about it.</i>
intimate	Involving very close connection. <i>An intimate knowledge of the software.</i>
intimately	In a way that involves a close link or relationship. <i>He is intimately familiar with her work.</i>
<u>involvement</u>	The condition of sharing in common with others (as fellows or partners etc). <i>She knew that involvement with Adam would only complicate her life.</i>

know	Have knowledge or information concerning. <i>We know this movie.</i>
prevailing	Most frequent or common. <i>Prevailing winds.</i>
proficient	A person who is proficient. <i>She felt reasonably proficient in Italian.</i>
skillful	Having or showing knowledge and skill and aptitude. <i>A lesser known but no less skillful composer.</i>
snug	Enjoying or affording comforting warmth and shelter especially in a small space. <i>A snug little apartment.</i>
sociality	The tendency to associate with others and to form social groups. <i>Mammals as a class are not strong on sociality.</i>
whole	Acting together as a single undiversified whole. <i>The subjects of the curriculum form a coherent whole.</i>
