Definitions of "Conveys" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “conveys” as a verb can have the following definitions:

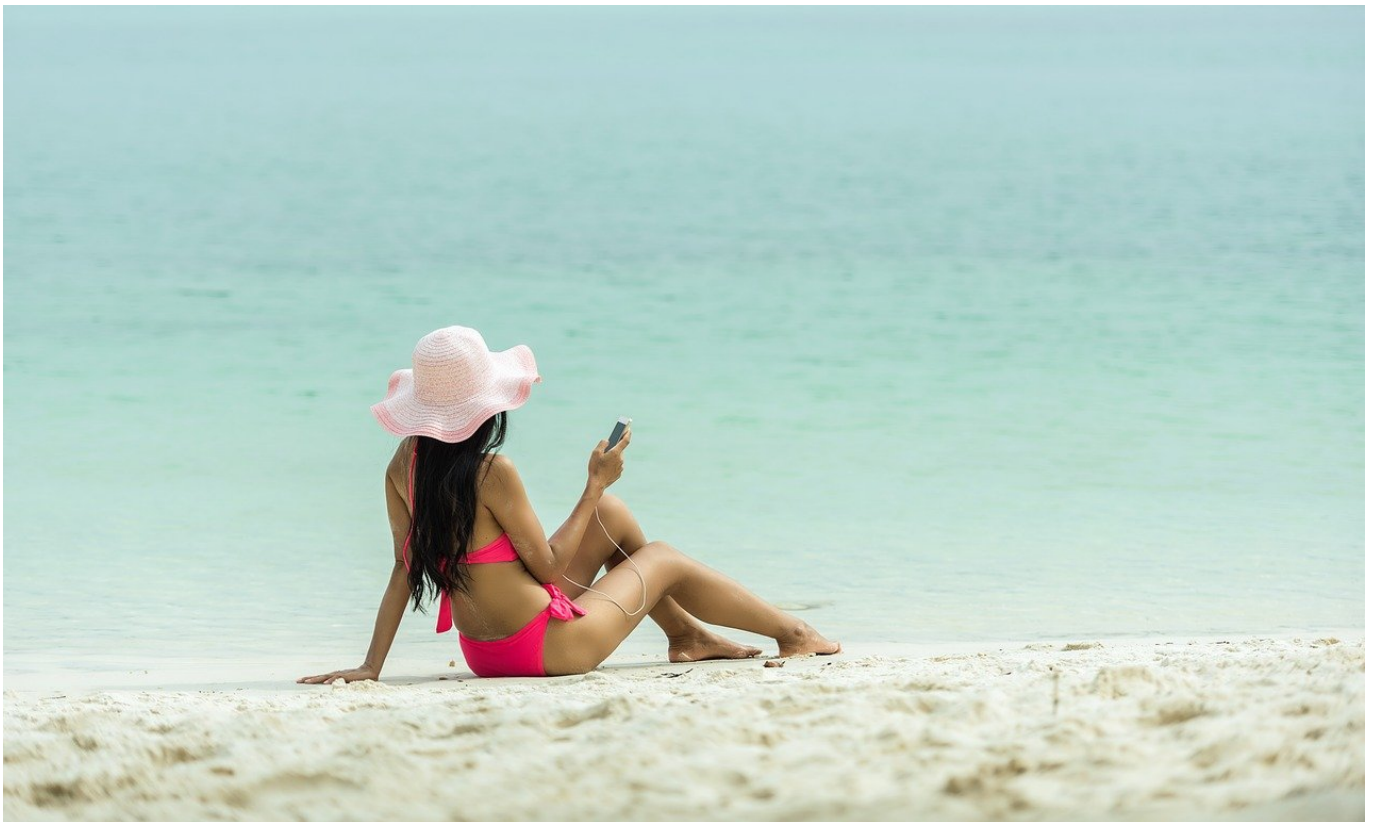
- *Transfer to another.*
- *(of information) make known; pass on.*
- *Go or come after and bring or take back.*
- *Transmit or serve as the medium for transmission.*
- *Take something or somebody with oneself somewhere.*
- *Serve as a means for expressing something.*
- *Make known; pass on, of information.*
- *Transmit a title or property.*



Synonyms of "Conveys" as a verb (11 Words)

- bring** Go or come after and bring or take back.
*This **brings** me to the main point.*
- carry** Have on one's person.
*I **carry** these thoughts in the back of my head.*
- channel** Direct the flow of.
*Many countries **channel** their aid through charities.*
- communicate** (of two rooms) have a common connecting door.
*He **communicated** his anxieties to the psychiatrist.*
- conduct** Transmit a form of energy such as heat or electricity by conduction.
*Bernstein **conducted** Mahler like no other **conductor**.*
- express** Give expression to.
*He **expressed** complete satisfaction.*
- fetch** Take a (breath); heave (a sigh).
*The dog **fetch**ed the hat.*

get	Take vengeance on or get even. <i>The operator couldn't get Kobe because of the earthquake.</i>
impart	Transmit or serve as the medium for transmission. <i>The teachers imparted a great deal of knowledge to their pupils.</i>
take	Make undertake or perform an action or task. <i>He only takes size 5 boots.</i>
transmit	Transmit or serve as the medium for transmission. <i>Knowledge is transmitted from teacher to pupil.</i>



Usage Examples of "Conveys" as a verb

- *She conveyed the message to me.*

Associations of "Conveys" (30 Words)

carriage	The conveying of goods or passengers from one place to another. <i>A typewriter carriage.</i>

carry	The act of carrying something. <i>Carry too far.</i>
communicate	Succeed in conveying one's ideas or in evoking understanding in others. <i>The disease is communicated from one person to another.</i>
conveyance	The action or process of transporting or carrying someone or something from one place to another. <i>The wife s solicitors will submit a draft conveyance or transfer to the husband s solicitors.</i>
dispatch	An official report (usually sent in haste). <i>It was done with dispatch.</i>
dock	A device in which a laptop smartphone or other mobile device may be placed for charging providing access to a power supply and to peripheral devices or auxiliary features a docking station. <i>The tanker was coming into dock.</i>
email	A message sent by email. <i>Call fax or email for a free demo.</i>
embarkation	The act of passengers and crew getting aboard a ship or aircraft.
ferry	Transport by ferry. <i>Ambulances ferried the injured to hospital.</i>
ferryboat	A boat that transports people or vehicles across a body of water and operates on a regular schedule.
ferryman	A man who operates a ferry.
fetch	The action of fetching. <i>The devil will fetch you.</i>
interact	Act together or towards others or with others. <i>People who interact daily.</i>
mail	Email. <i>His site is OK and I can even mail him direct.</i>
mailing	An item sent by mail, especially a piece of mass advertising. <i>The candidate sent out three large mailings.</i>
messenger	Send a document or package by messenger. <i>Nitric oxide is an intercellular messenger.</i>
passenger	A traveler riding in a vehicle (a boat or bus or car or plane or train etc) who is not operating it. <i>More than 50 passengers escaped injury when a train was derailed.</i>
pier	A support for two adjacent bridge spans.

port	Land at or reach a port. <i>The big ship was slowly porting.</i>
post	Assign to a post put into a post. <i>She posted a photo of herself with the singer on Twitter.</i>
reassign	Allocate or distribute (work or resources) differently. <i>He had been reassigned to another post.</i>
recipient	A person who receives something. <i>The recipient of the Nobel Peace Prize.</i>
relay	A signal or broadcast transmitted by a relay. <i>The wagons were pulled by relays of horses.</i>
send	Send a message or letter. <i>Send me your latest results.</i>
sender	A person who sends or transmits a message, letter, email, etc. <i>Senders of unwanted emails.</i>
spam	Send unwanted or junk e-mail. <i>An autogenerated spam website.</i>
transfer	Someone who transfers or is transferred from one position to another. <i>Transfer the packet from his trouser pockets to a pocket in his jacket.</i>
transmit	Transmit or serve as the medium for transmission. <i>The theatrical gift of being able to transmit emotion.</i>
transport	Something that serves as a means of transportation. <i>The bulk of freight traffic was transported by lorry.</i>
transportation	The United States federal department that institutes and coordinates national transportation programs created in 1966. <i>The sentence was one of transportation for life.</i>
