- Take something or somebody with oneself somewhere.
- Serve as a means for expressing something.
- Make known; pass on, of information.
- Transmit a title or property.

fetch Take a (breath); heave (a sigh).

The dog **fetch**ed the hat.



Take vengeance on or get even.

The operator couldn t **get** Kobe because of the earthquake.


Transmit or serve as the medium for transmission.

Make undertake or perform an action or task.

**transmit** Transmit or serve as the medium for transmission. *Knowledge is transmitted from teacher to pupil.*

transmit Transmit or serve as the medium for transmission.

The theatrical gift of being able to **transmit** emotion.

Something that serves as a means of transportation.

The bulk of freight traffic was **transport**ed by lorry.

The United States federal department that institutes and coordinates

**transportation** national transportation programs created in 1966.

The sentence was one of **transportation** for life.
