### Definitions of "Conveys" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “conveys” as a verb can have the following definitions:

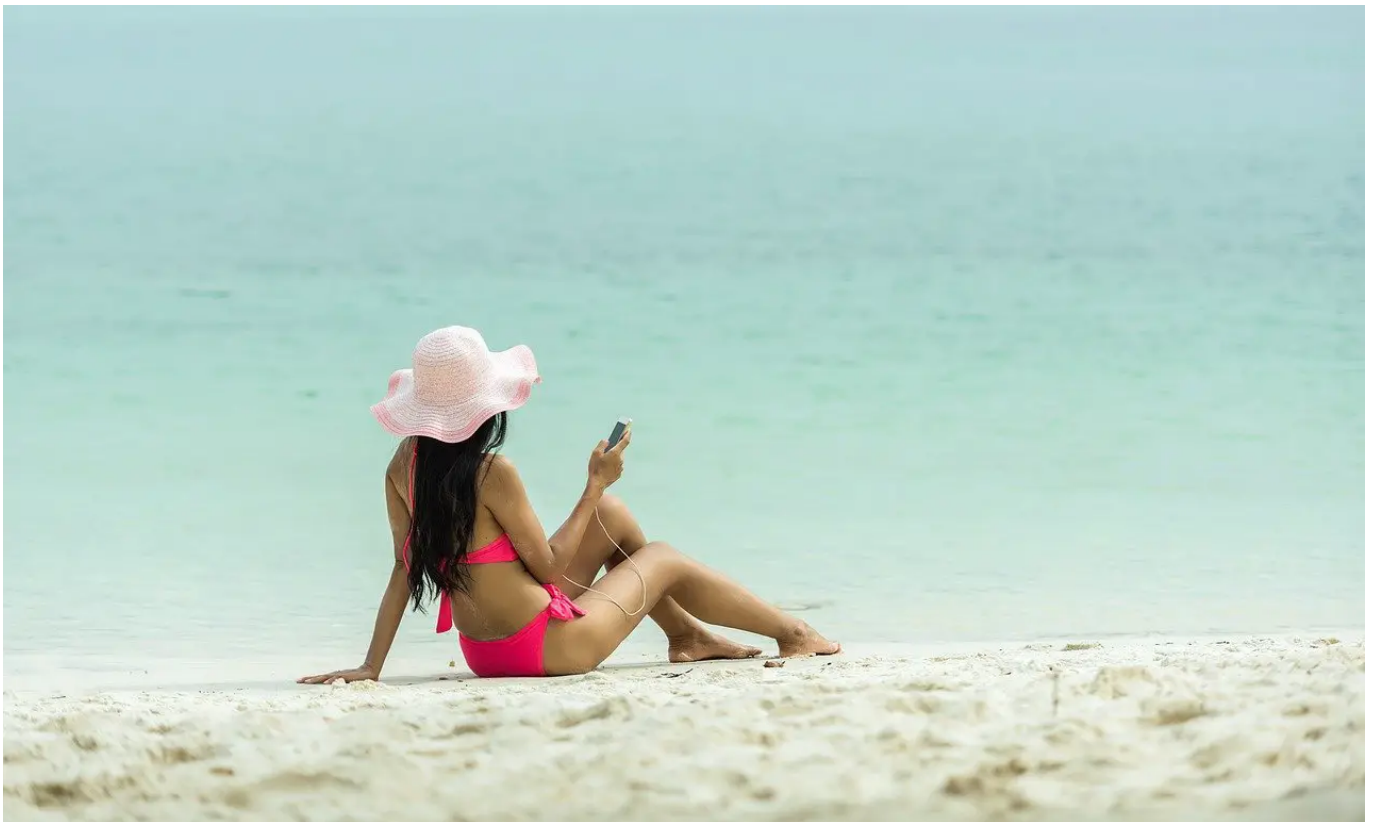
- *Transfer to another.*
- *(of information) make known; pass on.*
- *Go or come after and bring or take back.*
- *Transmit or serve as the medium for transmission.*
- *Take something or somebody with oneself somewhere.*
- *Serve as a means for expressing something.*
- *Make known; pass on, of information.*
- *Transmit a title or property.*



## Synonyms of "Conveys" as a verb (11 Words)

- bring** Go or come after and bring or take back.  
*This **brings** me to the main point.*
- carry** Have on one's person.  
*I **carry** these thoughts in the back of my head.*
- channel** Direct the flow of.  
*Many countries **channel** their aid through charities.*
- communicate** (of two rooms) have a common connecting door.  
*He **communicated** his anxieties to the psychiatrist.*
- conduct** Transmit a form of energy such as heat or electricity by conduction.  
*Bernstein **conducted** Mahler like no other **conductor**.*
- express** Give expression to.  
*He **expressed** complete satisfaction.*
- fetch** Take a (breath); heave (a sigh).  
*The dog **fetch**ed the hat.*

<b>get</b>	Take vengeance on or get even. <i>The operator couldn't <b>get</b> Kobe because of the earthquake.</i>
<b>impart</b>	Transmit or serve as the medium for transmission. <i>The teachers <b>imparted</b> a great deal of knowledge to their pupils.</i>
<b>take</b>	Make undertake or perform an action or task. <i>He only <b>takes</b> size 5 boots.</i>
<b>transmit</b>	Transmit or serve as the medium for transmission. <i>Knowledge is <b>transmitted</b> from teacher to pupil.</i>



## Usage Examples of "Conveys" as a verb

## Associations of "Conveys" (30 Words)

<b>carriage</b>	The conveying of goods or passengers from one place to another. <i>A typewriter <b>carriage</b>.</i>

<b>carry</b>	The act of carrying something. <i>Carry too far.</i>
<b>communicate</b>	Succeed in conveying one's ideas or in evoking understanding in others. <i>The disease is <b>communicated</b> from one person to another.</i>
<b>conveyance</b>	The action or process of transporting or carrying someone or something from one place to another. <i>The wife s solicitors will submit a draft <b>conveyance</b> or transfer to the husband s solicitors.</i>
<b>dispatch</b>	An official report (usually sent in haste). <i>It was done with <b>dispatch</b>.</i>
<b>dock</b>	A device in which a laptop smartphone or other mobile device may be placed for charging providing access to a power supply and to peripheral devices or auxiliary features a docking station. <i>The tanker was coming into <b>dock</b>.</i>
<b>email</b>	A message sent by email. <i>Call fax or <b>email</b> for a free demo.</i>
<b>embarkation</b>	The act of passengers and crew getting aboard a ship or aircraft.
<b>ferry</b>	Transport by ferry. <i>Ambulances ferried the injured to hospital.</i>
<b>ferryboat</b>	A boat that transports people or vehicles across a body of water and operates on a regular schedule.
<b>ferryman</b>	A man who operates a ferry.
<b>fetch</b>	The action of fetching. <i>The devil will <b>fetch</b> you.</i>
<b>interact</b>	Act together or towards others or with others. <i>People who <b>interact</b> daily.</i>
<b>mail</b>	Email. <i>His site is OK and I can even <b>mail</b> him direct.</i>
<b>mailing</b>	An item sent by mail, especially a piece of mass advertising. <i>The candidate sent out three large <b>mailings</b>.</i>
<b>messenger</b>	Send a document or package by messenger. <i>Nitric oxide is an intercellular <b>messenger</b>.</i>
<b>passenger</b>	A traveler riding in a vehicle (a boat or bus or car or plane or train etc) who is not operating it. <i>More than 50 <b>passengers</b> escaped injury when a train was derailed.</i>
<b>pier</b>	A support for two adjacent bridge spans.

<b>port</b>	Land at or reach a port. <i>The big ship was slowly <b>porting</b>.</i>
<b>post</b>	Assign to a post put into a post. <i>She <b>posted</b> a photo of herself with the singer on Twitter.</i>
<b>reassign</b>	Allocate or distribute (work or resources) differently. <i>He had been <b>reassigned</b> to another post.</i>
<b>recipient</b>	A person who receives something. <i>The <b>recipient</b> of the Nobel Peace Prize.</i>
<b>relay</b>	A signal or broadcast transmitted by a relay. <i>The wagons were pulled by <b>relays</b> of horses.</i>
<b>send</b>	Send a message or letter. <i><b>Send</b> me your latest results.</i>
<b>sender</b>	A person who sends or transmits a message, letter, email, etc. <i><b>Senders</b> of unwanted emails.</i>
<b>spam</b>	Send unwanted or junk e-mail. <i>An autogenerated <b>spam</b> website.</i>
<b>transfer</b>	Someone who transfers or is transferred from one position to another. <i><b>Transfer</b> the packet from his trouser pockets to a pocket in his jacket.</i>
<b>transmit</b>	Transmit or serve as the medium for transmission. <i>The theatrical gift of being able to <b>transmit</b> emotion.</i>
<b>transport</b>	Something that serves as a means of transportation. <i>The bulk of freight traffic was <b>transported</b> by lorry.</i>
<b>transportation</b>	The United States federal department that institutes and coordinates national transportation programs created in 1966. <i>The sentence was one of <b>transportation</b> for life.</i>
