yardbird A new military recruit, especially one assigned to menial tasks.






Usage Examples of "Convict" as a noun

#### Definitions of "Convict" as a verb

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "convict" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- Declare (someone) to be guilty of a criminal offence by the verdict of a jury or the decision of a judge in a court of law.
- Find or declare guilty.





Synonyms of "Convict" as a verb (3 Words)

declare guilty Designate (a trump suit or no-trump) with the final bid of a hand.find guilty Accept and make use of one's personality, abilities, and situation.pronounce guilty Pronounce judgment on.






# Usage Examples of "Convict" as a verb

- Twelve people were convicted for their part in an attempted coup.
- The man was convicted of fraud and sentenced.

**apprehend** Take into custody.

**capture** A person or thing that has been captured.

The religious body or Church sharing a confession of faith.

His words are a political **confession** of faith.

(criminal law) a final judgment of guilty in a criminal case and the

**conviction** punishment that is imposed.

A prisonlike situation a place of seeming confinement.

Both men were sent to **prison**.

A person who is confined especially a prisoner of war.

She may have been held **prisoner** before being killed.

repent Feel or express sincere regret or remorse about one's wrongdoing or sin.

Marian came to **repent** her hasty judgement.

The action of repenting; sincere regret or remorse.

**repentance** Each person who turns to God in genuine **repentance** and faith will be

saved.

repentant Expressing or feeling sincere regret and remorse; remorseful.

He is truly **repentant** for his incredible naivety and stupidity.

A person who sins (without repenting.

God forgives repentant **sinner**s.

unrepentant Stubbornly persistent in wrongdoing.

**In repentant** He was **unrepentant** and said that his comments were completely accurate.
