- *(of food) be heated so that the state required for eating is reached.*
- *Prepare a hot meal.*
- *Transform and make suitable for consumption by heating.*
- *Be happening or planned.*
- *Prepare (food, a dish, or a meal) by mixing, combining, and heating the ingredients.*
- *Be in an inescapably bad situation.*
- *Perform or proceed vigorously or very well.*
- *Alter dishonestly; falsify.*
- *Transform by heating.*

- *Prepare for eating by applying heat.*
- *Tamper, with the purpose of deception.*

<b>fudge</b>	Adjust or manipulate (facts or figures) so as to present a desired picture. <i>The authorities have <b>fudged</b> the issue.</i>
<b>get</b>	Take vengeance on or get even. <i>Where did she <b>get</b> these news.</i>
<b>go on</b>	Begin or set in motion.
<b>happen</b>	Happen occur or be the case in the course of events or by chance. <i>I <b>happened</b> on a street with a few modest restaurants.</i>
<b>hiss</b>	Express or utter with a hiss. <i>The escaping gas was <b>hissing</b>.</i>
<b>interfere with</b>	Get involved, so as to alter or hinder an action, or through force or threat of force.
<b>make</b>	Make by combining materials and parts. <i>He had been trying to <b>make</b> Cynthia for two years now.</i>
<b><u>manipulate</u></b>	Manipulate in a fraudulent manner. <i>He <b>manipulated</b> public opinion in his favor.</i>
<b><u>massage</u></b>	Give a massage to. <i>The accounts had been <b>massaged</b> to suit the government.</i>
<b>misrepresent</b>	Give a false or misleading account of the nature of. <i>You are <b>misrepresenting</b> the views of the government.</i>
<b>occur</b>	To be found to exist. <i>Sexism <b>occurs</b> in many workplaces.</i>
<b><u>prepare</u></b>	To prepare verbally either for written or spoken delivery. <i>Schools should <b>prepare</b> children for life.</i>
<b>put together</b>	Arrange thoughts, ideas, temporal events.
<b>ready</b>	Make ready or suitable or equip in advance for a particular purpose or for some use event etc. <i>Get the children <b>ready</b> for school.</i>
<b>rig</b>	Provide a sailing boat with sails and rigging. <i>A gaff <b>rigged</b> cutter.</i>
<b>sizzle</b>	Make a sound like frying fat. <i>The fat <b>sizzled</b> in the pan.</i>

<b>snap</b>	Move with a snapping sound. <i>He <b>snapped</b> indignantly.</i>
<b>spit</b>	(of a cat) make a hissing noise as a sign of anger or hostility. <i>It began to <b>spit</b>.</i>
<b>sputter</b>	Climb awkwardly, as if by scrambling. <i>But but she <b>sputtered</b>.</i>
<b>take place</b>	Be seized or affected in a specified way.
<b>tamper with</b>	Intrude in other people's affairs or business; interfere unwantedly.
<b>wangle</b>	Achieve something by means of trickery or devious methods. <i>I <b>wangled</b> an invitation to her party.</i>

<b>crispy</b>	Tender and brittle. <i><b>Crispy</b> fried bacon.</i>
<b>crust</b>	Form a crust or form into a crust. <i>The earth s <b>crust</b>.</i>
<b>cuisine</b>	Food cooked in a certain way. <i>We spent the evening sampling the local <b>cuisine</b>.</i>
<b>culinary</b>	Of or relating to or used in cooking. <i><b>Culinary</b> skills.</i>
<b>flour</b>	Cover with flour. <i><b>Flour</b> fish or meat before frying it.</i>
<b>fried</b>	Under the influence of alcohol or drugs. <i>Ronnie broke out a bottle of Scotch we all got pretty <b>fried</b>.</i>
<b>goody</b>	Something attractive or desirable, especially something tasty to eat.
<b>grill</b>	Cook food using a grill. <i><b>Grill</b> the trout for five minutes.</i>

<b>homemade</b>	Made or produced in the home or by yourself. <i><b>Homemade</b> bread.</i>
<b>microwave</b>	An oven that uses microwaves to cook or heat food. <i>He <b>microwaved</b> some steak out of the freezer.</i>
<b>miller</b>	A person who owns or works in a corn mill.
<b>oven</b>	A small furnace or kiln. <i>Bake the dish in a preheated <b>oven</b>.</i>
<b>pastry</b>	An item of food consisting of sweet pastry with a cream jam or fruit filling. <i>Spread the mixture over the <b>pastry</b>.</i>
<b>prepare</b>	To prepare verbally either for written or spoken delivery. <i>She took time off to <b>prepare</b> for her exams.</i>
<b>recipe</b>	Something which is likely to lead to a particular outcome. <i>A traditional Yorkshire <b>recipe</b>.</i>
<b>roast</b>	A particular type of roasted coffee. <i>This is the <b>roast</b> most likely to be used in espresso.</i>
<b>stew</b>	Food prepared by stewing especially meat or fish with vegetables. <i>Beef <b>stewed</b> in wine.</i>
<b>tamp</b>	A tool for tamping e.g. for tamping tobacco into a pipe bowl or a charge into a drill hole etc. <i>When the hole was <b>tamped</b> to the top gunpowder was inserted.</i>
<b>toaster</b>	A DJ who accompanies reggae with improvised rhythmic speech.
