According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "cook" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *(of food) be heated so that the state required for eating is reached.*
- *Prepare a hot meal.*
- *Transform and make suitable for consumption by heating.*
- *Be happening or planned.*
- *Prepare (food, a dish, or a meal) by mixing, combining, and heating the ingredients.*
- *Be in an inescapably bad situation.*
- *Perform or proceed vigorously or very well.*
- *Alter dishonestly; falsify.*
- *Transform by heating.*

- *Prepare for eating by applying heat.*
- *Tamper, with the purpose of deception.*

alter	Make an alteration to. <i>Plans to alter the dining hall.</i>
crackle	Make a crushing noise. <i>The blazing sun crackled the desert sand.</i>
doctor	Alter the content of (food or drink) by adding strong or harmful ingredients. <i>I will doctor him everyday until he is better.</i>
fake	Pretend to feel or have (an emotion, illness, or injury). <i>He faked his own death.</i>
falsify	Insert words into texts often falsifying it thereby. <i>Changes falsify individual expectations.</i>

fix	Make fixed stable or stationary. <i>The international community should not rely on the UN to fix the world's problems.</i>
fizz	Make a buzzing or crackling sound. <i>Anticipation began to fizz through his veins.</i>
fudge	Adjust or manipulate (facts or figures) so as to present a desired picture. <i>The authorities have fudged the issue.</i>
get	Take vengeance on or get even. <i>Where did she get these news.</i>
go on	Begin or set in motion.
happen	Happen occur or be the case in the course of events or by chance. <i>I happened on a street with a few modest restaurants.</i>
hiss	Express or utter with a hiss. <i>The escaping gas was hissing.</i>
interfere with	Get involved, so as to alter or hinder an action, or through force or threat of force.
make	Make by combining materials and parts. <i>He had been trying to make Cynthia for two years now.</i>
<u>manipulate</u>	Manipulate in a fraudulent manner. <i>He manipulated public opinion in his favor.</i>
<u>massage</u>	Give a massage to. <i>The accounts had been massaged to suit the government.</i>
misrepresent	Give a false or misleading account of the nature of. <i>You are misrepresenting the views of the government.</i>
occur	To be found to exist. <i>Sexism occurs in many workplaces.</i>
<u>prepare</u>	To prepare verbally either for written or spoken delivery. <i>Schools should prepare children for life.</i>
put together	Arrange thoughts, ideas, temporal events.
ready	Make ready or suitable or equip in advance for a particular purpose or for some use event etc. <i>Get the children ready for school.</i>
rig	Provide a sailing boat with sails and rigging. <i>A gaff rigged cutter.</i>
sizzle	Make a sound like frying fat. <i>The fat sizzled in the pan.</i>

snap	Move with a snapping sound. <i>He snapped indignantly.</i>
spit	(of a cat) make a hissing noise as a sign of anger or hostility. <i>It began to spit.</i>
sputter	Climb awkwardly, as if by scrambling. <i>But but she sputtered.</i>
take place	Be seized or affected in a specified way.
tamper with	Intrude in other people's affairs or business; interfere unwantedly.
wangle	Achieve something by means of trickery or devious methods. <i>I wangled an invitation to her party.</i>

- *Shall I cook dinner tonight?*
- *The band used to get up on the bandstand and really cook.*
- *A narcotics team who cooked the evidence.*

- *While the rice is cooking, add the saffron to the stock.*
- *My husband doesn't cook.*
- *What's cooking on the alternative fuels front?*
- *Cook the books.*
- *If I can't talk to him I'm cooked.*
- *She cooked me eggs and bacon.*
- *I told you I could cook.*
- *These potatoes have to cook for 20 minutes.*

bake	A social gathering at which baked food of a specified kind is eaten. <i>The soil in the desert is baked dry by the fierce heat of the sun.</i>
baked	(of food) cooked by dry heat in an oven. <i>Land lying baked in the heat.</i>
baste	Cover with liquid before cooking. <i>Slip herbs under the skin and baste the chicken constantly.</i>
bread	Cover with bread crumbs. <i>Altar bread.</i>
burner	A part of a cooker, lamp, etc. that emits a flame. <i>He bought a burner to get in touch with Shapiro.</i>
cake	Form a coat over. <i>A cake shop.</i>
chef	Work as a chef. <i>He cheffed on a yacht in the Riviera for two years.</i>
cooked	Having been prepared for eating by the application of heat. <i>A cooked breakfast.</i>
cookery	The act of preparing something (as food) by the application of heat. <i>Italian regional cookery.</i>
cooking	Suitable for or used in cooking. <i>Cooking can be a great art.</i>
crispy	Tender and brittle. <i>Crispy fried bacon.</i>
crust	Form a crust or form into a crust. <i>The earth s crust.</i>
cuisine	Food cooked in a certain way. <i>We spent the evening sampling the local cuisine.</i>
culinary	Of or relating to or used in cooking. <i>Culinary skills.</i>
flour	Cover with flour. <i>Flour fish or meat before frying it.</i>
fried	Under the influence of alcohol or drugs. <i>Ronnie broke out a bottle of Scotch we all got pretty fried.</i>
goody	Something attractive or desirable, especially something tasty to eat.
grill	Cook food using a grill. <i>Grill the trout for five minutes.</i>

homemade	Made or produced in the home or by yourself. <i>Homemade bread.</i>
microwave	An oven that uses microwaves to cook or heat food. <i>He microwaved some steak out of the freezer.</i>
miller	A person who owns or works in a corn mill.
oven	A small furnace or kiln. <i>Bake the dish in a preheated oven.</i>
pastry	An item of food consisting of sweet pastry with a cream jam or fruit filling. <i>Spread the mixture over the pastry.</i>
prepare	To prepare verbally either for written or spoken delivery. <i>She took time off to prepare for her exams.</i>
recipe	Something which is likely to lead to a particular outcome. <i>A traditional Yorkshire recipe.</i>
roast	A particular type of roasted coffee. <i>This is the roast most likely to be used in espresso.</i>
stew	Food prepared by stewing especially meat or fish with vegetables. <i>Beef stewed in wine.</i>
tamp	A tool for tamping e.g. for tamping tobacco into a pipe bowl or a charge into a drill hole etc. <i>When the hole was tamped to the top gunpowder was inserted.</i>
toaster	A DJ who accompanies reggae with improvised rhythmic speech.
