<a href="#">accomplice</a>	A person who joins with another in carrying out some plan (especially an unethical or illegal plan). <i>An <b>accomplice</b> in the murder.</i>
<b>adviser</b>	A person who gives advice in a particular field. <i>An <b>adviser</b> helped students select their courses.</i>
<b>advisor</b>	An expert who gives advice. <i>The United States sent military <b>advisors</b> to Guatemala.</i>
<b>collaborate</b>	Cooperate as a traitor. <i>He <b>collaborated</b> with the Nazis when they occupied Paris.</i>
<b>collaborative</b>	Accomplished by collaboration. <i><b>Collaborative</b> research.</i>
<b>communicate</b>	Share or exchange information, news, or ideas. <i>The rooms <b>communicated</b>.</i>
<b>communication</b>	The activity of communicating; the activity of conveying information. <i>Satellite <b>communications</b>.</i>
<b>concerted</b>	Done with great effort or determination. <i>You must make a <b>concerted</b> effort to curb this.</i>
<b>consultant</b>	An expert who gives advice. <i>He acted as campaign <b>consultant</b> to the president.</i>
<b>cooperate</b>	Work jointly towards the same end. <i>The leaders promised to <b>cooperate</b> in ending the civil war.</i>
<a href="#">cooperative</a>	(of a farm, business, etc.) owned and run jointly by its members, with profits or benefits shared among them. <i>We run the agency as a workers <b>cooperative</b>.</i>
<b>employed</b>	Put to use. <i>Up to 40 per cent of <b>employed</b> people are in part time jobs.</i>

<b>employment</b>	The act of using. <i>He is looking for <b>employment</b>.</i>
<b>friendship</b>	A state of mutual trust and support between allied nations. <i>Because of the <b>friendship</b> between our countries we had a very frank exchange.</i>
<b>headhunter</b>	A person who identifies and approaches suitable candidates employed elsewhere to fill business positions. <i>A <b>headhunter</b> offering you a wonderful new position at a higher salary.</i>
<b>interact</b>	Communicate or be involved directly. <i>All the stages in the process <b>interact</b>.</i>
<b>joint</b>	Cut the body of an animal into joints for cooking. <i><b>Joint</b> ownership.</i>
<b>mutuality</b>	A reciprocal relation between interdependent entities (objects or individuals or groups). <i>The <b>mutuality</b> of love between father and son.</i>
<b>overtime</b>	Payment for overtime. <i>His brain was working <b>overtime</b>.</i>
<b>partnership</b>	An association of two or more people as partners. <i>The action teams worked in <b>partnership</b> with the government.</i>
<b>producer</b>	Someone who finds financing for and supervises the making and presentation of a show (play or film or program or similar work). <i>An oil <b>producer</b>.</i>
<b>project</b>	Draw a projection of. <i>A <b>project</b> to build a new power station.</i>
<b>recruitment</b>	The action of finding new people to join an organization or support a cause. <i>Methods of military <b>recruitment</b>.</i>
<b>subcontract</b>	Work under a subcontract engage in a subcontract. <i><b>Subcontract</b> labour.</i>
<b>sync</b>	Synchronize. <i>Let s <b>synchronize</b> our efforts.</i>
<b>talk</b>	Discussion talk about is a less formal alternative for discussion of. <i>Within days I was the <b>talk</b> of the town.</i>
<b>team</b>	Form a team. <i>We <b>teamed</b> up for this new project.</i>
<b>together</b>	In combination; collectively. <i>She held her hands <b>together</b> as if she was praying.</i>
