Associations of "Cooperatively" (30 Words)

accomplice	A person who joins with another in carrying out some plan (especially an unethical or illegal plan). <i>An accomplice in the murder.</i>
adviser	A person who gives advice in a particular field. <i>An adviser helped students select their courses.</i>
advisor	An expert who gives advice. <i>The United States sent military advisors to Guatemala.</i>
collaborate	Cooperate as a traitor. <i>He collaborated with the Nazis when they occupied Paris.</i>
collaborative	Accomplished by collaboration. <i>Collaborative research.</i>
communicate	Share or exchange information, news, or ideas. <i>The rooms communicated.</i>
communication	The activity of communicating; the activity of conveying information. <i>Satellite communications.</i>
concerted	Done with great effort or determination. <i>You must make a concerted effort to curb this.</i>
consultant	An expert who gives advice. <i>He acted as campaign consultant to the president.</i>
cooperate	Work jointly towards the same end. <i>The leaders promised to cooperate in ending the civil war.</i>
cooperative	(of a farm, business, etc.) owned and run jointly by its members, with profits or benefits shared among them. <i>We run the agency as a workers cooperative.</i>
employed	Put to use. <i>Up to 40 per cent of employed people are in part time jobs.</i>

employment	The act of using. <i>He is looking for employment.</i>
friendship	A state of mutual trust and support between allied nations. <i>Because of the friendship between our countries we had a very frank exchange.</i>
headhunter	A person who identifies and approaches suitable candidates employed elsewhere to fill business positions. <i>A headhunter offering you a wonderful new position at a higher salary.</i>
interact	Communicate or be involved directly. <i>All the stages in the process interact.</i>
joint	Cut the body of an animal into joints for cooking. <i>Joint ownership.</i>
mutuality	A reciprocal relation between interdependent entities (objects or individuals or groups). <i>The mutuality of love between father and son.</i>
overtime	Payment for overtime. <i>His brain was working overtime.</i>
partnership	An association of two or more people as partners. <i>The action teams worked in partnership with the government.</i>
producer	Someone who finds financing for and supervises the making and presentation of a show (play or film or program or similar work). <i>An oil producer.</i>
project	Draw a projection of. <i>A project to build a new power station.</i>
recruitment	The action of finding new people to join an organization or support a cause. <i>Methods of military recruitment.</i>
subcontract	Work under a subcontract engage in a subcontract. <i>Subcontract labour.</i>
sync	Synchronize. <i>Let s synchronize our efforts.</i>
talk	Discussion talk about is a less formal alternative for discussion of. <i>Within days I was the talk of the town.</i>
team	Form a team. <i>We teamed up for this new project.</i>
together	In combination; collectively. <i>She held her hands together as if she was praying.</i>
