
Coquettish as an Adjective

Synonyms of "Coquettish" as an adjective (14 Words)

amorous	Expressive of or exciting sexual love or romance. <i>Amorous</i> glances.
<u>arch</u>	(used of behavior or attitude) characteristic of those who treat others with condescension. $% \left({\left[{{{\rm{ch}}} \right]_{{\rm{ch}}}} \right)_{{\rm{ch}}} \right)$
<u>coy</u>	Making a pretence of shyness or modesty that is intended to be alluring (typically used of a woman. Like a wild young colt very inquisitive but very coy and not to be easily cajoled.
<u>flighty</u>	Unpredictably excitable (especially of horses. <i>Flighty</i> young girls.
flirtatious	Expressing a playful sexual attraction. A <i>flirtatious</i> smile.
flirty	Suggesting or expressing a playful sexual attraction. Dates full of flirty banter.



frisky	Playful and full of energy. <i>He bounds about like a frisky pup.</i>
<u>inviting</u>	Attractive and tempting. An inviting offer.
kittenish	Playful, lively, or flirtatious. Her voice had that kittenish quality.
<u>playful</u>	Fond of games and amusement; light-hearted. A playful tomboy who loves to dress up.
<u>provocative</u>	Serving or tending to provoke, excite, or stimulate; stimulating discussion or exciting controversy- Anthony Trollope. <i>A provocative sidelong glance.</i>
<u>seductive</u>	Tempting and attractive; enticing. A seductive voice.
<u>skittish</u>	(of a person) playfully frivolous or unpredictable. My skittish and immature mother.
<u>teasing</u>	Intended to provoke or make fun of someone in a playful way. <i>Teasing</i> comments.

<u>charm</u>	Protect through supernatural powers or charms. She charm ed him into giving her all his money.
<u>charming</u>	Possessing or using or characteristic of or appropriate to supernatural powers. A charming little cottage.
<u>chic</u>	Elegance by virtue of being fashionable. <i>Chic elegance</i> .
delusive	Inappropriate to reality or facts. <i>Delusive</i> expectations.
<u>desirable</u>	A desirable person or thing. You re a very desirable woman.
<u>enchant</u>	Hold spellbound. You have been enchant ed by some spirits.
engaging	Attracting or delighting. An engaging frankness.
<u>entice</u>	Attract or tempt by offering pleasure or advantage. <i>The treat is offered to entice the dog to eat.</i>
enticing	Highly attractive and able to arouse hope or desire. An enticing prospect.
<u>entrance</u>	The right, means, or opportunity to enter somewhere or be a member of an institution, society, or other body. <i>They waited at the entrance to the garden.</i>
<u>fascinate</u>	Cause to be interested or curious. The snake charmer fascinate s the cobra.
glamorize	Interpret romantically. This new wallpaper really glamorize s the living room.
glamorous	Having an air of allure, romance and excitement. Being a singer must be such a glamorous lifestyle.
ingratiating	Calculated to please or gain favor. A smooth ingratiating manner.
<u>inviting</u>	Attractive and tempting. An inviting offer.



<u>lure</u>	Something used to lure fish or other animals into danger so they can be trapped or killed. <i>The film industry always has been a glamorous lure for young girls.</i>
seductive	Tempting and attractive; enticing. A seductive voice.
spellbind	To render motionless, as with a fixed stare or by arousing terror or awe. The singer held the audience spellbound.
<u>tempt</u>	Give rise to a desire by being attractive or inviting. How is it that ye have agreed together to tempt the Spirit of the Lord.
tempting	Very pleasantly inviting. It is often tempting to bring about change rapidly.
winsome	Charming in a childlike or naive way. A winsome smile.
