
## **Coquettish as an Adjective**

## Synonyms of "Coquettish" as an adjective (14 Words)

amorous	Expressive of or exciting sexual love or romance. <i>Amorous</i> glances.
<u>arch</u>	(used of behavior or attitude) characteristic of those who treat others with condescension. $% \left( {\left[ {{{\rm{ch}}} \right]_{{\rm{ch}}}} \right)_{{\rm{ch}}} \right)$
<u>coy</u>	Making a pretence of shyness or modesty that is intended to be alluring (typically used of a woman. Like a wild young colt very inquisitive but very <b>coy</b> and not to be easily cajoled.
<u>flighty</u>	Unpredictably excitable (especially of horses. <i>Flighty</i> young girls.
flirtatious	Expressing a playful sexual attraction. A <i>flirtatious</i> smile.
flirty	Suggesting or expressing a playful sexual attraction. Dates full of <b>flirty</b> banter.



frisky	Playful and full of energy. <i>He bounds about like a <b>frisky</b> pup.</i>
<u>inviting</u>	Attractive and tempting. An <b>inviting</b> offer.
kittenish	Playful, lively, or flirtatious. Her voice had that <b>kittenish</b> quality.
<u>playful</u>	Fond of games and amusement; light-hearted. A <b>playful</b> tomboy who loves to dress up.
<u>provocative</u>	Serving or tending to provoke, excite, or stimulate; stimulating discussion or exciting controversy- Anthony Trollope. <i>A provocative sidelong glance.</i>
<u>seductive</u>	Tempting and attractive; enticing. A <b>seductive</b> voice.
<u>skittish</u>	(of a person) playfully frivolous or unpredictable. My <b>skittish</b> and immature mother.
<u>teasing</u>	Intended to provoke or make fun of someone in a playful way. <i>Teasing</i> comments.

<u>charm</u>	Protect through supernatural powers or charms. She <b>charm</b> ed him into giving her all his money.
<u>charming</u>	Possessing or using or characteristic of or appropriate to supernatural powers. A <b>charming</b> little cottage.
<u>chic</u>	Elegance by virtue of being fashionable. <i>Chic elegance</i> .
delusive	Inappropriate to reality or facts. <i>Delusive</i> expectations.
<u>desirable</u>	A desirable person or thing. You re a very <b>desirable</b> woman.
<u>enchant</u>	Hold spellbound. You have been <b>enchant</b> ed by some spirits.
engaging	Attracting or delighting. An <b>engaging</b> frankness.
<u>entice</u>	Attract or tempt by offering pleasure or advantage. <i>The treat is offered to <b>entice</b> the dog to eat.</i>
enticing	Highly attractive and able to arouse hope or desire. An <b>enticing</b> prospect.
<u>entrance</u>	The right, means, or opportunity to enter somewhere or be a member of an institution, society, or other body. <i>They waited at the <b>entrance</b> to the garden.</i>
<u>fascinate</u>	Cause to be interested or curious. The snake charmer <b>fascinate</b> s the cobra.
glamorize	Interpret romantically. This new wallpaper really <b>glamorize</b> s the living room.
glamorous	Having an air of allure, romance and excitement. Being a singer must be such a <b>glamorous</b> lifestyle.
ingratiating	Calculated to please or gain favor. A smooth <b>ingratiating</b> manner.
<u>inviting</u>	Attractive and tempting. An <b>inviting</b> offer.



<u>lure</u>	Something used to lure fish or other animals into danger so they can be trapped or killed. <i>The film industry always has been a glamorous lure for young girls.</i>
seductive	Tempting and attractive; enticing. A <b>seductive</b> voice.
spellbind	To render motionless, as with a fixed stare or by arousing terror or awe. The singer held the audience spellbound.
<u>tempt</u>	Give rise to a desire by being attractive or inviting. How is it that ye have agreed together to <b>tempt</b> the Spirit of the Lord.
tempting	Very pleasantly inviting. It is often <b>tempting</b> to bring about change rapidly.
winsome	Charming in a childlike or naive way. A <b>winsome</b> smile.
