Synonyms of "Coquettish" as an adjective (14 Words)

- amorous** Expressive of or exciting sexual love or romance.
Amorous glances.
- arch** (used of behavior or attitude) characteristic of those who treat others with condescension.
- coy** Making a pretence of shyness or modesty that is intended to be alluring (typically used of a woman).
Like a wild young colt very inquisitive but very coy and not to be easily cajoled.
- flighty** Unpredictably excitable (especially of horses).
Flighty young girls.
- flirtatious** Expressing a playful sexual attraction.
A flirtatious smile.
- flirty** Suggesting or expressing a playful sexual attraction.
Dates full of flirty banter.

frisky	Playful and full of energy. <i>He bounds about like a frisky pup.</i>
inviting	Attractive and tempting. <i>An inviting offer.</i>
kittenish	Playful, lively, or flirtatious. <i>Her voice had that kittenish quality.</i>
playful	Fond of games and amusement; light-hearted. <i>A playful tomboy who loves to dress up.</i>
provocative	Serving or tending to provoke, excite, or stimulate; stimulating discussion or exciting controversy- Anthony Trollope. <i>A provocative sidelong glance.</i>
seductive	Tempting and attractive; enticing. <i>A seductive voice.</i>
skittish	(of a person) playfully frivolous or unpredictable. <i>My skittish and immature mother.</i>
teasing	Intended to provoke or make fun of someone in a playful way. <i>Teasing comments.</i>

allure	The quality of being powerfully and mysteriously attractive or fascinating. <i>Will sponsors really be allured by such opportunities.</i>
alluring	Powerfully and mysteriously attractive or fascinating; seductive. <i>The town offers alluring shops and restaurants.</i>
appealing	Evoking empathic or sympathetic feelings. <i>He added an appealing and memorable figure to popular American mythology.</i>
attract	Be attractive to. <i>I was attracted to the idea of working for a ballet company.</i>
attractive	Pleasing or appealing to the senses. <i>A stunningly attractive charismatic man.</i>

catchy	Having concealed difficulty. <i>A catchy title for a movie.</i>
charisma	A personal attractiveness or interestingness that enables you to influence others. <i>He has tremendous charisma and stage presence.</i>
charm	Protect through supernatural powers or charms. <i>She charmed him into giving her all his money.</i>
charming	Possessing or using or characteristic of or appropriate to supernatural powers. <i>A charming little cottage.</i>
chic	Elegance by virtue of being fashionable. <i>Chic elegance.</i>
delusive	Inappropriate to reality or facts. <i>Delusive expectations.</i>
desirable	A desirable person or thing. <i>You re a very desirable woman.</i>
enchant	Hold spellbound. <i>You have been enchanted by some spirits.</i>
engaging	Attracting or delighting. <i>An engaging frankness.</i>
entice	Attract or tempt by offering pleasure or advantage. <i>The treat is offered to entice the dog to eat.</i>
enticing	Highly attractive and able to arouse hope or desire. <i>An enticing prospect.</i>
entrance	The right, means, or opportunity to enter somewhere or be a member of an institution, society, or other body. <i>They waited at the entrance to the garden.</i>
fascinate	Cause to be interested or curious. <i>The snake charmer fascinates the cobra.</i>
glamorize	Interpret romantically. <i>This new wallpaper really glamorizes the living room.</i>
glamorous	Having an air of allure, romance and excitement. <i>Being a singer must be such a glamorous lifestyle.</i>
ingratiating	Calculated to please or gain favor. <i>A smooth ingratiating manner.</i>
inviting	Attractive and tempting. <i>An inviting offer.</i>

<u>lure</u>	Something used to lure fish or other animals into danger so they can be trapped or killed. <i>The film industry always has been a glamorous lure for young girls.</i>
<u>seductive</u>	Tempting and attractive; enticing. <i>A seductive voice.</i>
spellbind	To render motionless, as with a fixed stare or by arousing terror or awe. <i>The singer held the audience spellbound.</i>
<u>tempt</u>	Give rise to a desire by being attractive or inviting. <i>How is it that ye have agreed together to tempt the Spirit of the Lord.</i>
<u>tempting</u>	Very pleasantly inviting. <i>It is often tempting to bring about change rapidly.</i>
winsome	Charming in a childlike or naive way. <i>A winsome smile.</i>
