- *An abundant supply of good things of a specified kind.*
- *A symbol of plenty consisting of a goat's horn overflowing with flowers, fruit, and corn.*
- *A goat's horn filled with grain and flowers and fruit symbolizing prosperity.*



Synonyms of "Cornucopia" as a noun (10 Words)

- abundance** (chemistry) the ratio of the total mass of an element in the earth's crust to the total mass of the earth's crust; expressed as a percentage or in parts per million.
*Estimates of the **abundance** of harp seals.*
- horn of plenty** A noise made by the driver of an automobile to give warning.
- host** A person who acts as host at formal occasions makes an introductory speech and introduces other speakers.
*They were always gracious **hosts** at the numerous dinner parties they held for friends.*
- lot** The choice resulting from deciding something by lot.
*He will need a second **lot** of tills to handle the second currency.*

<u>mass</u>	The quantity of matter which a body contains, as measured by its acceleration under a given force or by the force exerted on it by a gravitational field. <i>A mass of cyclists.</i>
plenitude	An abundance. <i>The plenitude of the Pope's powers.</i>
profuseness	The property of being extremely abundant.
profusion	An abundance or large quantity of something. <i>The profusion of detail.</i>
richness	The property of producing abundantly and sustaining vigorous and luxuriant growth. <i>The richness and diversity of human culture.</i>
<u>riot</u>	A highly amusing or entertaining person or thing. <i>Everyone thought she was a riot.</i>

fecundity	The intellectual productivity of a creative imagination. <i>Age related decline in female fecundity.</i>
fertility	The ability to conceive children or young. <i>Anxiety and stress affect fertility in both men and women.</i>
lot	Divide items into lots for sale at an auction. <i>They were an angry lot.</i>
magnificence	The quality of being magnificent. <i>The magnificence of the surrounding countryside.</i>
many	The majority of people. <i>Too many clouds to see.</i>
mellowness	A soft shade of a color. <i>A mellowness of light and shade not attainable in marble.</i>
opulent	Rich and superior in quality. <i>The opulent comfort of a limousine.</i>
overflow	Overflow with a certain feeling. <i>Boxes overflowing with bright flowers.</i>
plenitude	An abundance. <i>The plenitude of the Pope's powers.</i>
plenteous	Plentiful. <i>The meal was astonishingly plenteous.</i>
plentiful	Existing in great number or quantity. <i>Food is plentiful.</i>
plentitude	A full supply.
plenty	A large number or amount or extent. <i>It must have cost plenty.</i>
profusion	The property of being extremely abundant. <i>The profusion of detail.</i>

prosper	Make successful. <i>The state hopes to prosper from free trade with the United States.</i>
prosperity	The state of being prosperous. <i>A long period of peace and prosperity.</i>
richness	The property of producing abundantly and sustaining vigorous and luxuriant growth. <i>He was well aware of the richness of his own appearance.</i>
substantially	For the most part; essentially. <i>Substantially higher pension costs.</i>
teem	Be teeming be abuzz. <i>Every garden is teeming with wildlife.</i>
wealth	A plentiful supply of a particular desirable thing. <i>Great wealth is not a sign of great intelligence.</i>
