- *A symbol of plenty consisting of a goat's horn overflowing with flowers, fruit, and corn.*
- *A goat's horn filled with grain and flowers and fruit symbolizing prosperity.*



## Synonyms of "Cornucopia" as a noun (10 Words)

- abundance** (chemistry) the ratio of the total mass of an element in the earth's crust to the total mass of the earth's crust; expressed as a percentage or in parts per million.  
*Estimates of the **abundance** of harp seals.*
- horn of plenty** A noise made by the driver of an automobile to give warning.
- host** A person who acts as host at formal occasions makes an introductory speech and introduces other speakers.  
*They were always gracious **hosts** at the numerous dinner parties they held for friends.*
- lot** The choice resulting from deciding something by lot.  
*He will need a second **lot** of tills to handle the second currency.*

<b><u>mass</u></b>	The quantity of matter which a body contains, as measured by its acceleration under a given force or by the force exerted on it by a gravitational field. <i>A <b>mass</b> of cyclists.</i>
<b>plenitude</b>	An abundance. <i>The <b>plenitude</b> of the Pope s powers.</i>
<b>profuseness</b>	The property of being extremely abundant.
<b>profusion</b>	An abundance or large quantity of something. <i>The <b>profusion</b> of detail.</i>
<b>richness</b>	The property of producing abundantly and sustaining vigorous and luxuriant growth. <i>The <b>richness</b> and diversity of human culture.</i>
<b><u>riot</u></b>	A highly amusing or entertaining person or thing. <i>Everyone thought she was a <b>riot</b>.</i>

<b>considerably</b>	By a notably large amount or to a notably large extent; greatly. <i>The house has fallen <b>considerably</b> in value.</i>
<b>fecundation</b>	Making fertile as by applying fertilizer or manure.
<b>fecundity</b>	The intellectual productivity of a creative imagination. <i>Age related decline in female <b>fecundity</b>.</i>
<b>fertility</b>	The ability to conceive children or young. <i>Anxiety and stress affect <b>fertility</b> in both men and women.</i>
<b>lot</b>	Divide items into lots for sale at an auction. <i>They were an angry <b>lot</b>.</i>
<b>magnificence</b>	The quality of being magnificent. <i>The <b>magnificence</b> of the surrounding countryside.</i>
<b>many</b>	The majority of people. <i>Too <b>many</b> clouds to see.</i>
<b>mellowness</b>	A soft shade of a color. <i>A <b>mellowness</b> of light and shade not attainable in marble.</i>
<b>opulent</b>	Rich and superior in quality. <i>The <b>opulent</b> comfort of a limousine.</i>
<b>overflow</b>	Overflow with a certain feeling. <i>Boxes <b>overflowing</b> with bright flowers.</i>
<b>plenitude</b>	An abundance. <i>The <b>plenitude</b> of the Pope's powers.</i>
<b>plenteous</b>	Plentiful. <i>The meal was astonishingly <b>plenteous</b>.</i>
<b>plentiful</b>	Existing in great number or quantity. <i>Food is <b>plentiful</b>.</i>
<b>plentitude</b>	A full supply.
<b>plenty</b>	A large number or amount or extent. <i>It must have cost <b>plenty</b>.</i>
<b>profusion</b>	The property of being extremely abundant. <i>The <b>profusion</b> of detail.</i>

<b>prosper</b>	Make successful. <i>The state hopes to <b>prosper</b> from free trade with the United States.</i>
<b>prosperity</b>	The state of being prosperous. <i>A long period of peace and <b>prosperity</b>.</i>
<b>richness</b>	The property of producing abundantly and sustaining vigorous and luxuriant growth. <i>He was well aware of the <b>richness</b> of his own appearance.</i>
<b>substantially</b>	For the most part; essentially. <i><b>Substantially</b> higher pension costs.</i>
<b>teem</b>	Be teeming be abuzz. <i>Every garden is <b>teeming</b> with wildlife.</i>
<b>wealth</b>	A plentiful supply of a particular desirable thing. <i>Great <b>wealth</b> is not a sign of great intelligence.</i>
