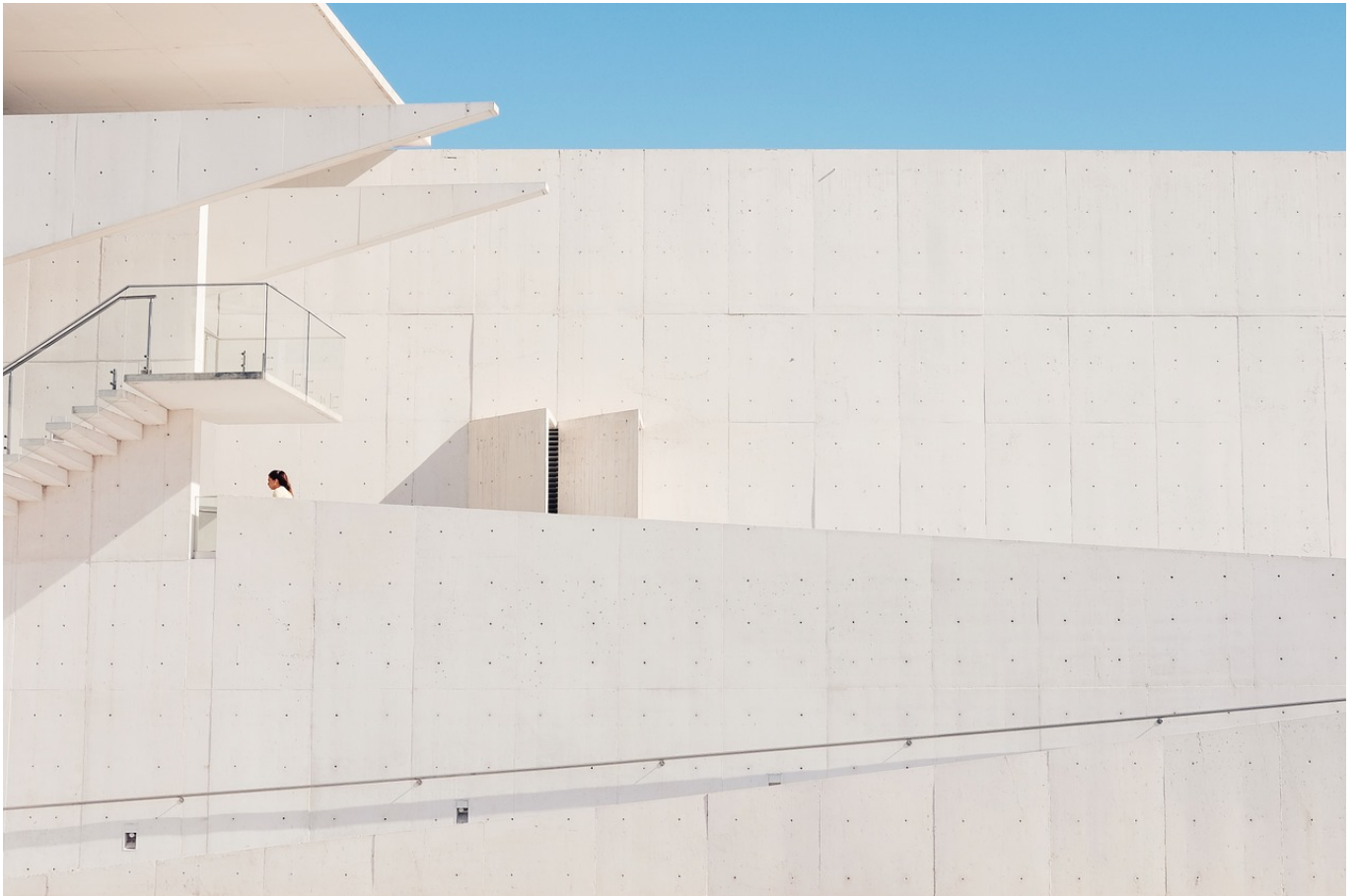
- *Affecting or characteristic of the body as opposed to the mind or spirit.*

Synonyms of "Corporeal" as an adjective (10 Words)

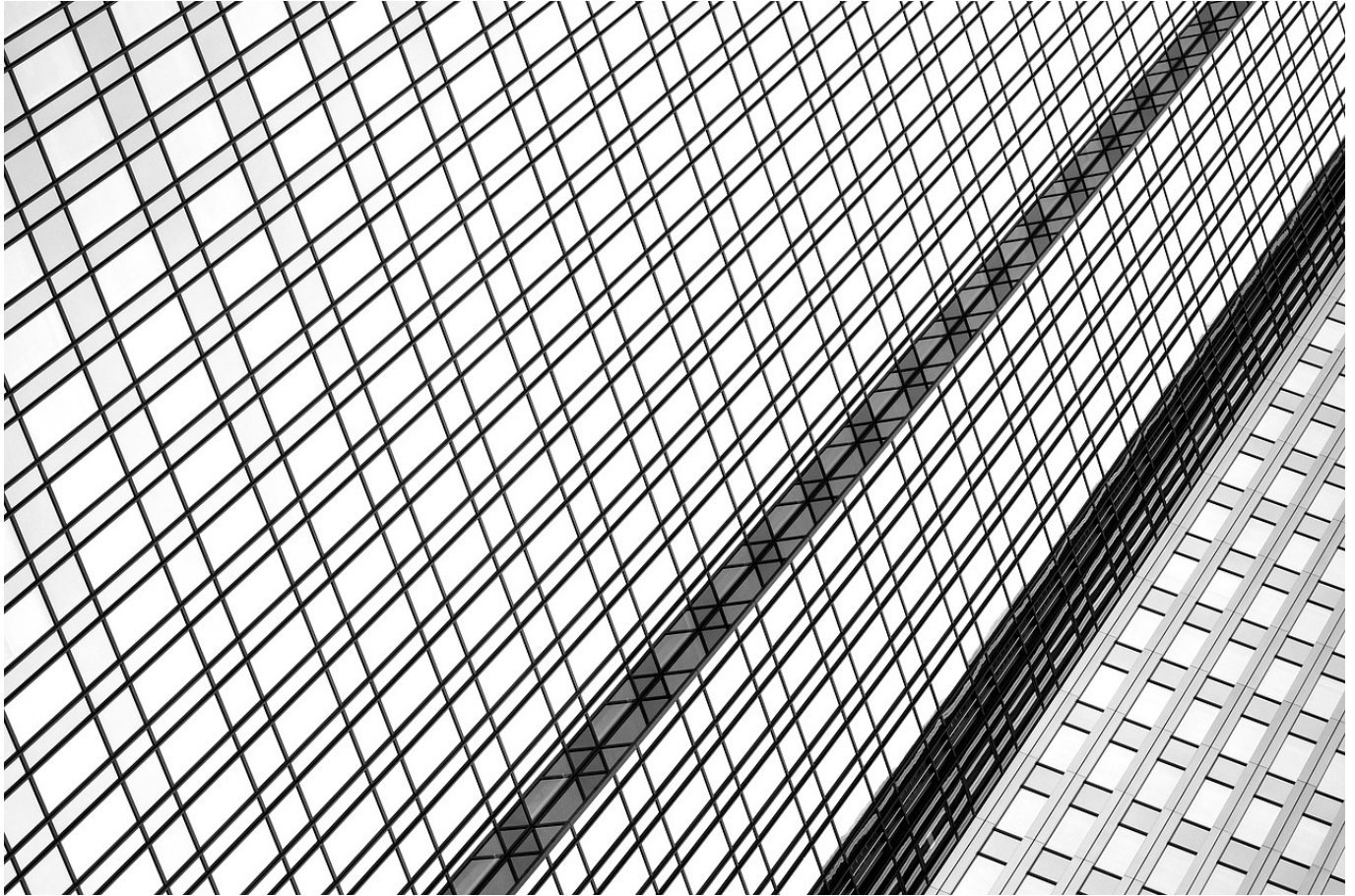
- carnal** Of or relating to the body or flesh.
Carnal knowledge.
- corporal** Possessing or existing in bodily form.
*What seemed **corporal** melted as breath into the wind.*
- [earthly](#)** Relating to humankind's material existence as distinct from a spiritual or heavenly one.
*All **earthly** happiness is but vanity.*
- fleshly** Having an actual physical presence.
***Fleshly** desire.*
- human** Having human form or attributes as opposed to those of animals or divine beings.
***Human** frailty.*
- in the flesh** Holding office.

- adipose** (especially of body tissue) used for the storage of fat.
Adipose tissue constitutes the fat of meat.
- byproduct** A secondary and sometimes unexpected consequence.
- contents** (usually plural) everything that is included in a collection and that is held or included in something.
*He emptied the **contents** of his pockets.*
- crux** The most important point.
*Herein lies the **crux** of the issue.*
- drapery** The depiction of folds of cloth in sculpture or painting.
*The effigy is notable for its flowing **drapery**.*
- embodied** Possessing or existing in bodily form.
- expressive** Conveying (a specified quality or idea).
*She has big **expressive** eyes.*

felt	Change texture so as to become matted and felt like. <i>Care must be taken in washing or the wool will shrink and felt.</i>
filling	The act of filling something. <i>When he yawned I could see the gold fillings in his teeth.</i>
freon	Any one or more chlorofluorocarbons (or related compounds) that are used as an aerosol propellant, organic solvent, or refrigerant.
item	Used to introduce each item in a list. <i>Item two statute books item two drums.</i>
lined	Having a lining or a liner; often used in combination. <i>A silk lined jacket.</i>
material	Having material or physical form or substance Benjamin Jowett. <i>Material living standards have risen.</i>
materialistic	Marked by materialism. <i>We re living in a highly materialistic society.</i>
matter	A particular substance. <i>Several matters to attend to.</i>
packing	A charge made when delivering goods to cover the cost of packing them. <i>The backpacking of oxygen is essential for astronauts.</i>
physical	Impelled by physical force especially against resistance. <i>The physical characteristics of the earth.</i>
qualitative	Of high quality; excellent. <i>Qualitative change.</i>
qualitatively	With regard to the quality or qualities of something rather than its quantity. <i>Security levels can be qualitatively assessed.</i>
somatic	Relating to the soma. <i>Patients completed a questionnaire about their somatic and psychological symptoms.</i>
subject	A person who is subjected to experimental or other observational procedures someone who is an object of investigation. <i>Maths is not my best subject.</i>
substance	The most important or essential part of something; the real or essential meaning. <i>He was suspended for using a banned substance.</i>
stratum	Any stratum or layer lying underneath another. <i>The plant will grow very rapidly and send out runners above the stratum.</i>

- textile** Of or relating to fabrics or fabric making.
*A fascinating range of pottery jewellery and **textiles**.*
- theme** Give a particular theme or setting to a leisure venue event etc.
*The first violin takes up the **theme** high up in its register.*
- thing** An example or type of something.
*That's the **thing** about style no two people are completely alike.*
- valance** A decorative framework to conceal curtain fixtures at the top of a window casing.
- vinyl** Synthetic resin or plastic consisting of polyvinyl chloride or a related polymer used for wallpapers and other covering materials and for records.
*A **vinyl** group.*
- weft** (in weaving) the crosswise threads on a loom that are passed over and under the warp threads to make cloth.
***Weft** threads.*
