According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “corporeal” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

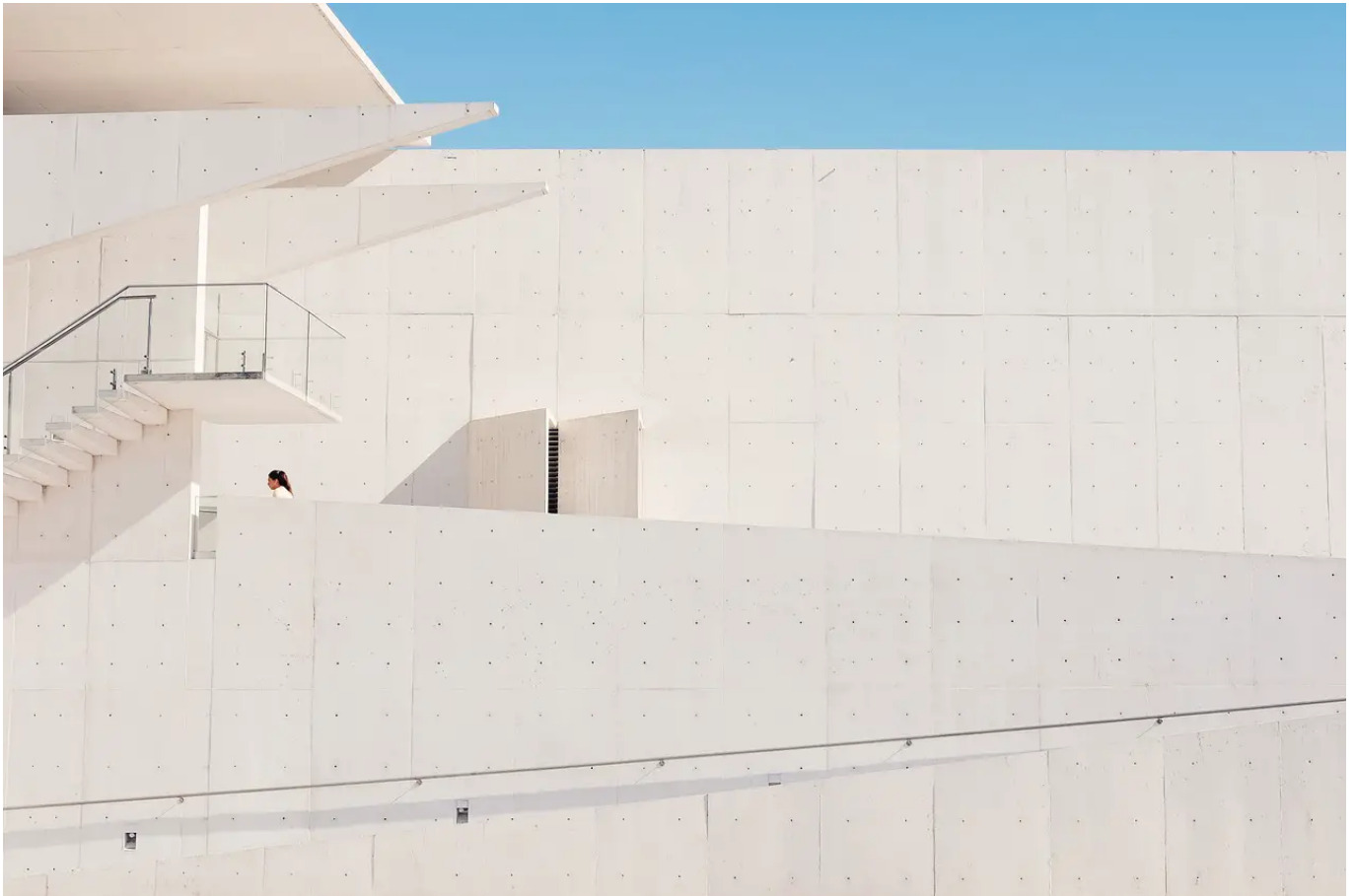
- *Affecting or characteristic of the body as opposed to the mind or spirit.*

Synonyms of "Corporeal" as an adjective (10 Words)

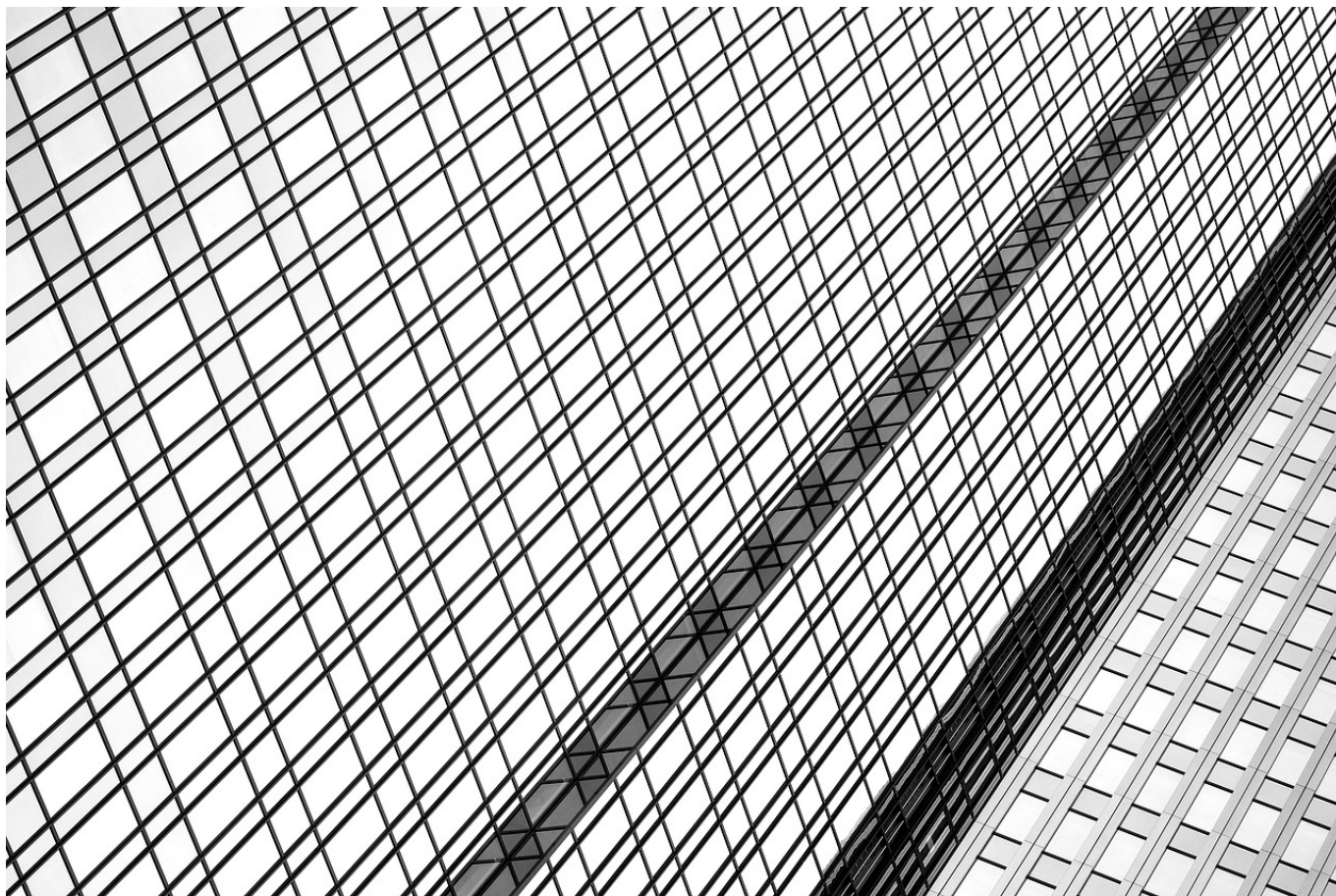

| carnal | Of or relating to the body or flesh. <i>Carnal knowledge.</i> |
| corporal | Possessing or existing in bodily form. <i>What seemed corporal melted as breath into the wind.</i> |
| <u>earthly</u> | Relating to humankind's material existence as distinct from a spiritual or heavenly one. <i>All earthly happiness is but vanity.</i> |
| fleshly | Having an actual physical presence. <i>Fleshly desire.</i> |
| human | Having human form or attributes as opposed to those of animals or divine beings. <i>Human frailty.</i> |
| in the flesh | Holding office. |

- material** Having material or physical form or substance Benjamin Jowett.
*Information that could be **material** to a murder inquiry.*
- mortal** Unrelenting and deadly.
***Mortal** enemy.*
- somatic** Relating to the soma.
*A **somatic** symptom or **somatic** illness.*

| byproduct | A secondary and sometimes unexpected consequence. |
| contents | (usually plural) everything that is included in a collection and that is held or included in something. <i>He emptied the contents of his pockets.</i> |
| crux | The most important point. <i>Herein lies the crux of the issue.</i> |
| drapery | The depiction of folds of cloth in sculpture or painting. <i>The effigy is notable for its flowing drapery.</i> |
| embodied | Possessing or existing in bodily form. |
| expressive | Conveying (a specified quality or idea). <i>She has big expressive eyes.</i> |

| item | Used to introduce each item in a list. <i>Item two statute books item two drums.</i> |
| lined | Having a lining or a liner; often used in combination. <i>A silk lined jacket.</i> |
| material | Having material or physical form or substance Benjamin Jowett. <i>Material living standards have risen.</i> |
| materialistic | Marked by materialism. <i>We re living in a highly materialistic society.</i> |
| matter | A particular substance. <i>Several matters to attend to.</i> |
| packing | A charge made when delivering goods to cover the cost of packing them. <i>The backpacking of oxygen is essential for astronauts.</i> |
| physical | Impelled by physical force especially against resistance. <i>The physical characteristics of the earth.</i> |
| <u>qualitative</u> | Of high quality; excellent. <i>Qualitative change.</i> |
| qualitatively | With regard to the quality or qualities of something rather than its quantity. <i>Security levels can be qualitatively assessed.</i> |
| <u>somatic</u> | Relating to the soma. <i>Patients completed a questionnaire about their somatic and psychological symptoms.</i> |
| <u>subject</u> | A person who is subjected to experimental or other observational procedures someone who is an object of investigation. <i>Maths is not my best subject.</i> |
| substance | The most important or essential part of something; the real or essential meaning. <i>He was suspended for using a banned substance.</i> |
| substratum | Any stratum or layer lying underneath another. <i>The plant will grow very rapidly and send out runners above the substratum.</i> |

textile

Of or relating to fabrics or fabric making.

*A fascinating range of pottery jewellery and **textiles**.*

theme

Give a particular theme or setting to a leisure venue event etc.

*The first violin takes up the **theme** high up in its register.*

thing

An example or type of something.

*That s the **thing** about style no two people are completely alike.*

valance

A decorative framework to conceal curtain fixtures at the top of a window casing.

vinyl

Synthetic resin or plastic consisting of polyvinyl chloride or a related polymer used for wallpapers and other covering materials and for records.

*A **vinyl** group.*

weft

(in weaving) the crosswise threads on a loom that are passed over and under the warp threads to make cloth.

***Weft** threads.*
