affiliated Being joined in close association.
***Affiliated** union members.*

appertain	Be appropriate or applicable. <i>The institutional arrangements which appertain under the system.</i>
attached	Married or having an established romantic or sexual partner; not single. <i>Please complete the attached form.</i>
connected	Wired together to an alarm system. <i>All the window alarms are connected.</i>
connection	An instrumentality that connects. <i>The plane was late and he missed his connection in Atlanta.</i>
<u>correlate</u>	Bring into a mutual, complementary, or reciprocal relation. <i>The study found that success in the educational system correlates highly with class.</i>
correlative	Either of two or more related or complementary variables. <i>The child's right to education is a correlative of the parent's duty to send the child to school.</i>
corresponding	Conforming in every respect. <i>All rights carry with them corresponding responsibilities.</i>
embedded	(of a microprocessor) designed and built as an integral part of a system or device. <i>The embedded sentence has no overt introducer.</i>
entangle	Entrap. <i>They were suspicious of becoming entangled in a civil war.</i>
guesswork	An estimate based on little or no information. <i>Answering this question will involve you in a certain amount of guesswork.</i>
<u>implicated</u>	Culpably involved. <i>An innocent person implicated by circumstances in a crime.</i>
included	Enclosed in the same envelope or package. <i>The included check.</i>
<u>indirectly</u>	Not in a forthright manner. <i>The losses indirectly affect us all.</i>
inextricable	Impossible to escape from. <i>Inextricable unity.</i>
interconnect	Cause to be interconnected or interwoven. <i>The bones are interconnected via the muscle.</i>
interlinear	Written or printed between the lines of a text. <i>A Greek English interlinear New Testament.</i>

involve

Make complex or intricate or complicated.
*Angela told me she was **involved** with someone else.*

involved

Emotionally involved.
*The **involved** muscles.*

link

Link with or as with a yoke.
*It turns out he reads my blogs and was very pleased I d **linked** to his article.*

linked

Connected by a link, as railway cars or trailer trucks.

pertain

Be in effect or existence in a specified place or at a specified time.
*Matters **pertaining** to the organization of government.*

positively

With certainty; so as to leave no room for doubt.
*It was **positively** monumental.*

referent

Something referred to; the object of a reference.
*The Morning Star and the Evening Star have the same **referent** the planet Venus.*

relate

Give an account of; narrate.
*I cannot **relate** these events at all.*

related

Being connected either logically or causally or by shared characteristics.
*Sleeping sickness and **related** diseases.*

relation

The way in which two or more people or groups feel about and behave towards each other.
*The meetings helped cement Anglo American **relations**.*

relatively

In relation, comparison, or proportion to something else.
*The situation is **relatively** calm now.*
