<b>attached</b>	Married or having an established romantic or sexual partner; not single. <i>Please complete the <b>attached</b> form.</i>
<b>connected</b>	Wired together to an alarm system. <i>All the window alarms are <b>connected</b>.</i>
<b>connection</b>	An instrumentality that connects. <i>The plane was late and he missed his <b>connection</b> in Atlanta.</i>
<b>correlate</b>	Bring into a mutual, complementary, or reciprocal relation. <i>The study found that success in the educational system <b>correlates</b> highly with class.</i>
<b>correlative</b>	Either of two or more related or complementary variables. <i>The child's right to education is a <b>correlative</b> of the parent's duty to send the child to school.</i>
<b>corresponding</b>	Conforming in every respect. <i>All rights carry with them <b>corresponding</b> responsibilities.</i>
<b>embedded</b>	(of a microprocessor) designed and built as an integral part of a system or device. <i>The <b>embedded</b> sentence has no overt introducer.</i>
<b>entangle</b>	Entrap. <i>They were suspicious of becoming <b>entangled</b> in a civil war.</i>
<b>guesswork</b>	An estimate based on little or no information. <i>Answering this question will involve you in a certain amount of <b>guesswork</b>.</i>
<b>implicated</b>	Culpably involved. <i>An innocent person <b>implicated</b> by circumstances in a crime.</i>
<b>included</b>	Enclosed in the same envelope or package. <i>The <b>included</b> check.</i>
<b>indirectly</b>	Not in a forthright manner. <i>The losses <b>indirectly</b> affect us all.</i>
<b>inextricable</b>	Impossible to escape from. <i><b>Inextricable</b> unity.</i>
<b>interconnect</b>	Cause to be interconnected or interwoven. <i>The bones are <b>interconnected</b> via the muscle.</i>
<b>interlinear</b>	Written or printed between the lines of a text. <i>A Greek English <b>interlinear</b> New Testament.</i>



<b><u>involve</u></b>	Make complex or intricate or complicated. <i>Angela told me she was <b>involved</b> with someone else.</i>
<b><u>involved</u></b>	Emotionally involved. <i>The <b>involved</b> muscles.</i>
<b><u>link</u></b>	Link with or as with a yoke. <i>It turns out he reads my blogs and was very pleased I d <b>linked</b> to his article.</i>
<b>linked</b>	Connected by a link, as railway cars or trailer trucks.
<b><u>pertain</u></b>	Be in effect or existence in a specified place or at a specified time. <i>Matters <b>pertaining</b> to the organization of government.</i>
<b>positively</b>	With certainty; so as to leave no room for doubt. <i>It was <b>positively</b> monumental.</i>
<b>referent</b>	Something referred to; the object of a reference. <i>The Morning Star and the Evening Star have the same <b>referent</b> the planet Venus.</i>
<b><u>relate</u></b>	Give an account of; narrate. <i>I cannot <b>relate</b> these events at all.</i>
<b>related</b>	Being connected either logically or causally or by shared characteristics. <i>Sleeping sickness and <b>related</b> diseases.</i>
<b>relation</b>	The way in which two or more people or groups feel about and behave towards each other. <i>The meetings helped cement Anglo American <b>relations</b>.</i>
<b><u>relatively</u></b>	In relation, comparison, or proportion to something else. <i>The situation is <b>relatively</b> calm now.</i>
