according	In a manner corresponding or conforming to. <i>The outlook for investors is not bright according to financial experts.</i>
affect	Have an emotional or cognitive impact upon. <i>Will the new rules affect me.</i>
affiliation	A social or business relationship. <i>The group has no affiliation to any preservation society.</i>
ally	A state formally cooperating with another for a military or other purpose. <i>He s a good ally in fight.</i>
associate	A person who joins with others in some activity or endeavor. <i>She has been associated with the project from the first.</i>
association	The process of bringing ideas or events together in memory or imagination. <i>Flints were found in association with the prehistoric remains of the bear.</i>
combine	Combine so as to form a whole mix. <i>These forces combined with others.</i>
connection	An arrangement or opportunity for catching a connecting train, bus, aircraft, etc. <i>The connection between church and state is inescapable.</i>
contain	Contain or hold have within. <i>The government has already taken steps to contain the disease.</i>
correlated	Mutually related.
correlation	A statistic representing how closely two variables co vary it can vary from 1 perfect negative correlation through 0 no correlation to 1 perfect positive correlation. <i>What is the correlation between those two variables.</i>
embedded	Inserted as an integral part of a surrounding whole. <i>A gold ring with nine embedded stones.</i>

enclosed	Surrounded or closed off on all sides. <i>An enclosed yard.</i>
entail	A property bequeathed under an entail. <i>The spinning mills were not part of the entail.</i>
entangle	Involve (someone) in difficulties or complicated circumstances from which it is difficult to escape. <i>They were suspicious of becoming entangled in a civil war.</i>
implicate	Impose, involve, or imply as a necessary accompaniment or result. <i>He is implicated in the scheme to defraud the government.</i>
include	Specifically exclude someone from a group or activity. <i>The price includes dinner bed and breakfast.</i>
included	Enclosed in the same envelope or package. <i>All of Europe Britain included.</i>
inclusion	The practice or policy of providing equal access to opportunities and resources for people who might otherwise be excluded or marginalized, such as those who have physical or mental disabilities and members of other minority groups. <i>They have been selected for inclusion in the scheme.</i>
incorporate	Form a corporation. <i>Some schemes incorporated all these variations.</i>
involve	Require as useful, just, or proper. <i>His story completely involved me during the entire afternoon.</i>
involved	Emotionally involved. <i>The plot was too involved.</i>
join	Be or become joined or united or linked. <i>They joined up with local environmentalists.</i>
pertain	Be in effect or existence in a specified place or at a specified time. <i>The shop premises and stock and all assets pertaining to the business.</i>
positively	In a way that indicates the presence of a certain substance or condition. <i>The negotiations started positively with agreement on several issues.</i>
referent	Having reference. <i>The Morning Star and the Evening Star have the same referent the planet Venus.</i>
relate	Be relevant to. <i>She relates well to her peers.</i>
related	Belonging to the same family, group, or type; connected. <i>Income related benefits.</i>
