

- Take the place of or be parallel or equivalent to.
- Exchange messages.
- Be compatible, similar or consistent; coincide in their characteristics.
- Be equivalent or parallel, in mathematics.
- Communicate by exchanging letters, emails, or other messages.
- Be analogous or equivalent in character, form, or function.
