<b>correlate with</b>	Bring into a mutual, complementary, or reciprocal relation.
<b><u>denote</u></b>	Make known; make an announcement. <i>This mark <b>denotes</b> purity and quality.</i>
<b><u>designate</u></b>	Decree or designate beforehand. <i>Certain schools are <b>designated</b> science schools.</i>
<b>dovetail with</b>	Fit together tightly, as if by means of a dovetail.
<b>equal</b>	Make equal uniform corresponding or matching. <i>One dollar <b>equals</b> 1 000 rubles these days.</i>
<b><u>equate</u></b>	Make equal, uniform, corresponding, or matching. <i>Customers <b>equate</b> their name with quality.</i>
<b>exchange letters</b>	Change over, change around, as to a new order or sequence.
