<u>coincidence</u>	The presence of ionizing particles or other objects in two or more detectors simultaneously, or of two or more signals simultaneously in a circuit. <i>It was a coincidence that she was wearing a jersey like Laura s.</i>
commensurateness	A statement that expresses a personal opinion or belief or adds information.
communication	Something that is communicated by or to or between people or groups. <i>She gave him some hope of her return or at least of their future communication.</i>
comparability	The fact or quality of being similar and able to be compared. <i>There are differences in hospital recording practices that will affect the comparability of results.</i>
compatibility	A state in which two things are able to exist or occur together without problems or conflict. <i>Software compatibility is another important factor to consider.</i>
concurrence	A point at which three or more lines meet. <i>The number of possible concurrences in the diagram.</i>
<u>conformity</u>	Orthodoxy in thoughts and belief. <i>Conformity to regulations.</i>
congruity	The quality of agreeing; being suitable and appropriate.
<u>consistency</u>	The way in which a substance holds together; thickness or viscosity. <i>The sauce has the consistency of creamed butter.</i>
correlation	A statistic representing how closely two variables co vary it can vary from 1 perfect negative correlation through 0 no correlation to 1 perfect positive correlation. <i>What is the correlation between those two variables.</i>
<u>harmony</u>	Compatibility in opinion and action. <i>Delightful cities where old and new blend in harmony.</i>
letter writing	The conventional characters of the alphabet used to represent speech.
mail	Email. <i>In England they call mail the post.</i>
parallelism	The use of parallel processing. <i>Parallelism suggests a connection of meaning through an echo of form.</i>
proportionateness	The quality or fact of being proportionate.

<u>resemblance</u>	Similarity in appearance or external or superficial details. <i>They bear some resemblance to Italian figurines.</i>
similarity	A similar feature or aspect. <i>The similarity of symptoms makes them hard to diagnose.</i>
symmetricalness	(mathematics) an attribute of a shape or relation; exact reflection of form on opposite sides of a dividing line or plane.
<u>symmetry</u>	The quality of being made up of exactly similar parts facing each other or around an axis. <i>The political symmetry between the two debates.</i>
<u>uniformity</u>	The quality or state of being uniform. <i>An attempt to impose administrative and cultural uniformity.</i>
writing	Handwriting. <i>Parents want schools to concentrate on reading writing and arithmetic.</i>



Usage Examples of "Correspondence" as a noun

- *There is a simple correspondence between the distance of a focused object from the eye and the size of its image on the retina.*
- *Sophie wrote a letter to Rosamund, with whom she kept up a regular correspondence.*
- *His wife dealt with his private correspondence.*

Associations of "Correspondence" (30 Words)

addressee	The person to whom something is addressed. <i>The contents of the letters were calculated to cause distress to the individual addressee.</i>
airmail	Send or transport by airmail. <i>Letters to Europe from the U S are best airmailed.</i>
bulletin	Make public by bulletin.
communication	A letter or message containing information or news. <i>Satellite communications.</i>
consignee	The person to whom merchandise is delivered over.

<u>convey</u>	Take something or somebody with oneself somewhere. <i>Pipes were laid to convey water to the house.</i>
<u>deliverable</u>	Able to be delivered. <i>The company's primary method of measuring customer feedback on deliverables.</i>
email	Send a message by email. <i>I got three emails from my mother today.</i>
<u>envelope</u>	The bag containing the gas in a balloon. <i>The external envelope of the swimming pool.</i>
<u>interact</u>	Act together or towards others or with others. <i>He should interact more with his colleagues.</i>
letter	Inscribe letters or writing on. <i>The officer in the incident got in trouble for following the letter of the law.</i>
mail	A vehicle such as a train carrying mail. <i>He works for the United States mail service.</i>
mailbox	A computer file in which email messages received by a particular user are stored.
message	Send a message. <i>He sent a three word message.</i>
<u>messenger</u>	Send a document or package by messenger. <i>Could you have it messengered over to me.</i>
philately	The collection and study of postage stamps.
post	The system whereby messages are transmitted via the post office. <i>I'll post an article next week revealing the results of the poll.</i>
postage	The amount required to send a letter or parcel by post. <i>Proof of postage is required.</i>
postal	Done by post. <i>Postal services.</i>
postcard	A card for sending a message by post without an envelope, typically having a photograph or other illustration on one side. <i>He promised to send me a picture postcard.</i>
postmaster	A man in charge of a post office.
postscript	A note appended to a letter after the signature. <i>As a postscript to this Paul did finally marry.</i>
<u>respond</u>	Respond favorably or as hoped. <i>His back injury has failed to respond to treatment.</i>

send	Send a message or letter. <i>Send me your latest results.</i>
sender	A person who sends or transmits a message, letter, email, etc. <i>Senders of unwanted emails.</i>
spam	A tinned meat product made mainly from ham. <i>An autogenerated spam website.</i>
<u>symmetry</u>	The quality of being made up of exactly similar parts facing each other or around an axis. <i>This series has a line of symmetry through its centre.</i>
telegraphic	Of or by a telegraph or telegram. <i>The strange telegraphic speech of some aphasics.</i>
<u>transmit</u>	Transmit or serve as the medium for transmission. <i>Transmit a message.</i>
transport	A convict who was transported to a penal colony. <i>The invasion force sailed from Cadiz in twenty five transports.</i>
