Associations of "Correspondingly" (30 Words)

accede	Yield to another’s wish or opinion. <i>Accede to the throne.</i>
acclimate	Get used to a certain climate. <i>It will take a few days to get acclimated to the altitude.</i>
accord	Allow to have. <i>The powers accorded to the head of state.</i>
accordance	Conformity or agreement. <i>There is good accordance between the values.</i>
adapt	Adapt or conform oneself to new or different conditions. <i>A large organization can be slow to adapt to change.</i>
agree	Be in accord be in agreement. <i>He agreed to leave her alone.</i>
approbation	Official approval. <i>A term of approbation.</i>
approve	Officially agree to or accept as satisfactory. <i>The budget was approved by parliament.</i>
assent	Agreement with a statement or proposal to do something. <i>A loud murmur of assent.</i>
coincide	Be the same. <i>The members of the College coincide in this opinion.</i>
comply	(of an article) meet specified standards. <i>You must comply or else.</i>
concur	Happen simultaneously. <i>We strongly concur with this recommendation.</i>
conform	Adapt or conform oneself to new or different conditions. <i>The kitchen does not conform to hygiene regulations.</i>

conformance	Correspondence in form or appearance. <i>Conformance to international standards.</i>
conforming	Adhering to established customs or doctrines (especially in religion).
<u>consent</u>	Give permission for something to happen. <i>He had consented to serve as external assessor on the panel.</i>
<u>exactly</u>	In exact terms; without vagueness. <i>What exactly are you looking for.</i>
fit	Be the right size or shape fit correctly or as desired. <i>A fit subject for discussion.</i>
incidentally	Introducing a different topic; in point of fact. <i>The infection was discovered only incidentally at post mortem examination.</i>
<u>just</u>	Of an opinion or appraisal well founded justifiable. <i>A just and lasting peace.</i>
<u>necessarily</u>	In such a manner as could not be otherwise. <i>It is necessarily so.</i>
obediently	In an obedient manner. <i>She obediently followed the housekeeper's instructions.</i>
<u>obligation</u>	A binding agreement committing a person to a payment or other action. <i>He is under an obligation to finish the job.</i>
ok	Being satisfactory or in satisfactory condition. <i>Things are okay.</i>
pertinent	Being of striking appropriateness and pertinence. <i>She asked me a lot of very pertinent questions.</i>
respectively	Separately or individually and in the order already mentioned (used when enumerating two or more items or facts that refer back to a previous statement). <i>The brothers were called Felix and Max respectively.</i>
<u>simultaneous</u>	Occurring or operating at the same time. <i>Simultaneous translation.</i>
simultaneously	At the same instant. <i>They spoke simultaneously.</i>
together	Self-confident, level-headed, or well organized. <i>They both spoke together.</i>
<u>yes</u>	An affirmative answer or decision, especially in voting. <i>Answering with assured and ardent yeses.</i>
