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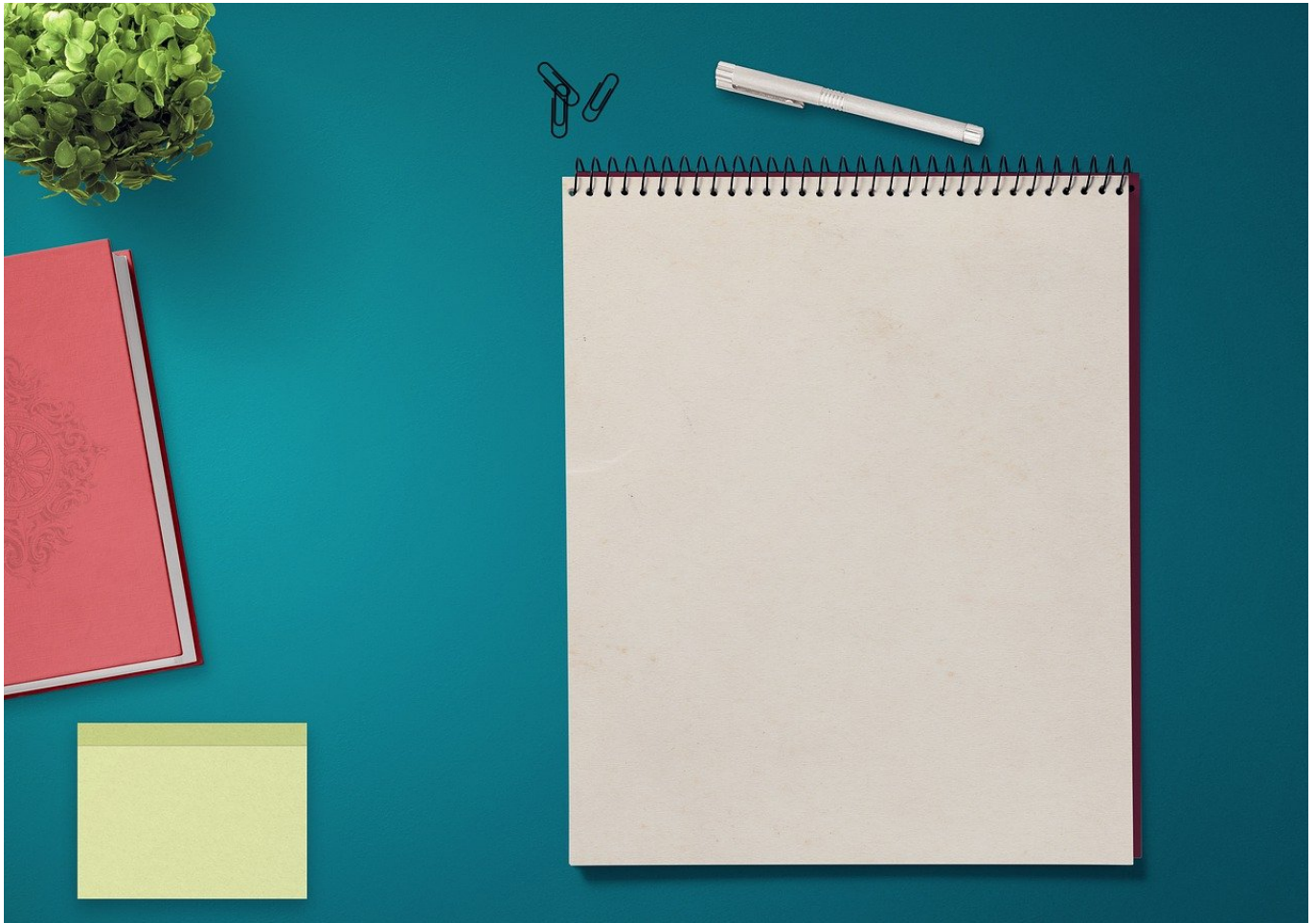

## Corresponds as a Verb

### Definitions of "Corresponds" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “corresponds” as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Exchange messages.*
- *Be compatible, similar or consistent; coincide in their characteristics.*
- *Be equivalent or parallel, in mathematics.*
- *Take the place of or be parallel or equivalent to.*



## Synonyms of "Corresponds" as a verb (10 Words)

- agree** Show grammatical agreement.  
*Everybody **agrees** that jobs will go.*
- check** Put a check mark on or near or next to.  
*She glanced over her shoulder to **check** that the door was shut.*
- equate** Make equal, uniform, corresponding, or matching.  
*The level of prices will move to **equate** supply and demand.*
- fit** Be the right size or shape fit correctly or as desired.  
*She was about to be **fitted** for her costume.*
- gibe** Laugh at with contempt and derision.  
*Some cynics in the media might **gibe**.*
- jibe** Be compatible, similar or consistent; coincide in their characteristics.  
*Some cynics in the media might **jibe**.*

- match** Make equal uniform corresponding or matching.  
*He tried to **match** her nonchalance.*
- represent** Be representative or typical for.  
*It was **represented** to him that she would be an unsuitable wife.*
- stand for** Occupy a place or location, also metaphorically.
- tally** Gain points in a game.  
*Their signatures should **tally** with their names on the register.*



## Usage Examples of "Corresponds" as a verb

- *My Russian pen pal and I have been corresponding for several years.*



## Associations of "Corresponds" (30 Words)

<b><u>accede</u></b>	Take on duties or office. <i><b>Accede</b> to the throne.</i>
<b><u>acclimate</u></b>	Get used to a certain climate. <i>This should help new students <b>acclimate</b> to college life.</i>
<b><u>accord</u></b>	A written agreement between two states or sovereigns. <i>A peace <b>accord</b>.</i>
<b><u>accordance</u></b>	Conformity or agreement. <i>There is good <b>accordance</b> between the values.</i>
<b><u>adapt</u></b>	Adapt or conform oneself to new or different conditions. <i>The film was <b>adapted</b> from a Turgenev short story.</i>
<b><u>agree</u></b>	Show grammatical agreement. <i>The verb <b>agrees</b> with the final noun.</i>
<b><u>approbation</u></b>	Official recognition or approval. <i>A term of <b>approbation</b>.</i>
<b>approve</b>	Believe that someone or something is good or acceptable. <i>The budget was <b>approved</b> by parliament.</i>

<b>assent</b>	Agreement with a statement or proposal to do something. <i>A loud murmur of <b>assent</b>.</i>
<b><u>coincide</u></b>	Correspond in nature; tally. <i>The two events <b>coincided</b>.</i>
<b>comply</b>	(of an article) meet specified standards. <i>You must <b>comply</b> or else.</i>
<b>concur</b>	Happen or occur at the same time; coincide. <i>The authors <b>concurred</b> with the majority.</i>
<b><u>conform</u></b>	Adapt or conform oneself to new or different conditions. <i>The countryside should <b>conform</b> to a certain idea of the picturesque.</i>
<b>conformance</b>	Correspondence in form or appearance. <i><b>Conformance</b> testing.</i>
<b>conforming</b>	Adhering to established customs or doctrines (especially in religion).
<b><u>consent</u></b>	Agree to do something. <i>He had <b>consented</b> to serve as external assessor on the panel.</i>
<b><u>exactly</u></b>	Used to emphasize the accuracy of a figure or description. <i>He was doing precisely or <b>exactly</b> what she had told him to do.</i>
<b>fit</b>	Make fit. <i>A <b>fit</b> of coughing.</i>
<b>incidentally</b>	Of a minor or subordinate nature. <i><b>Incidentally</b> it was many months before the whole truth was discovered.</i>
<b><u>just</u></b>	Of an opinion or appraisal well founded justifiable. <i>It has <b>just</b> enough salt.</i>
<b><u>necessarily</u></b>	In such a manner as could not be otherwise. <i>It is <b>necessarily</b> so.</i>
<b>obediently</b>	In a manner that shows willingness to comply with an order or request; submissively. <i><b>Obediently</b> she slipped off her right shoe and stocking.</i>
<b><u>obligation</u></b>	A binding agreement committing a person to a payment or other action. <i>He is under an <b>obligation</b> to finish the job.</i>
<b>ok</b>	A state in south central United States. <i>Things are <b>okay</b>.</i>
<b>pertinent</b>	Relevant or applicable to a particular matter; apposite. <i>Practitioners must consider all factors <b>pertinent</b> to a situation.</i>
<b>respectively</b>	In the order given. <i>The brothers were called Felix and Max <b>respectively</b>.</i>

**simultaneous** Occurring, operating, or done at the same time.  
*A **simultaneous** withdrawal of troops.*

**simultaneously** At the same instant.  
*The telethon was broadcast **simultaneously** on 31 US networks.*

**together** (of a couple) married or in a sexual relationship.  
*They split up after ten years **together**.*

**yes** An affirmative answer or decision, especially in voting.  
*Answering with assured and ardent **yeses**.*
