Definitions of "Corresponds" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “corresponds” as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Exchange messages.*
- *Be compatible, similar or consistent; coincide in their characteristics.*
- *Be equivalent or parallel, in mathematics.*
- *Take the place of or be parallel or equivalent to.*

- agree** Show grammatical agreement.
*Everybody **agrees** that jobs will go.*
- check** Put a check mark on or near or next to.
*She glanced over her shoulder to **check** that the door was shut.*
- equate** Make equal, uniform, corresponding, or matching.
*The level of prices will move to **equate** supply and demand.*
- fit** Be the right size or shape fit correctly or as desired.
*She was about to be **fitted** for her costume.*
- gibe** Laugh at with contempt and derision.
*Some cynics in the media might **gibe**.*
- jibe** Be compatible, similar or consistent; coincide in their characteristics.
*Some cynics in the media might **jibe**.*

- match** Make equal uniform corresponding or matching.
*He tried to **match** her nonchalance.*
- represent** Be representative or typical for.
*It was **represented** to him that she would be an unsuitable wife.*
- stand for** Occupy a place or location, also metaphorically.
- tally** Gain points in a game.
*Their signatures should **tally** with their names on the register.*

- *My Russian pen pal and I have been corresponding for several years.*

- accede** Take on duties or office.
***Accede** to the throne.*
- acclimate** Get used to a certain climate.
*This should help new students **acclimate** to college life.*
- accord** A written agreement between two states or sovereigns.
*A peace **accord**.*
- accordance** Conformity or agreement.
*There is good **accordance** between the values.*
- adapt** Adapt or conform oneself to new or different conditions.
*The film was **adapted** from a Turgenev short story.*
- agree** Show grammatical agreement.
*The verb **agrees** with the final noun.*
- approbation** Official recognition or approval.
*A term of **approbation**.*
- approve** Believe that someone or something is good or acceptable.
*The budget was **approved** by parliament.*

assent	Agreement with a statement or proposal to do something. <i>A loud murmur of assent.</i>
<u>coincide</u>	Correspond in nature; tally. <i>The two events coincided.</i>
comply	(of an article) meet specified standards. <i>You must comply or else.</i>
concur	Happen or occur at the same time; coincide. <i>The authors concurred with the majority.</i>
<u>conform</u>	Adapt or conform oneself to new or different conditions. <i>The countryside should conform to a certain idea of the picturesque.</i>
conformance	Correspondence in form or appearance. <i>Conformance testing.</i>
conforming	Adhering to established customs or doctrines (especially in religion).
<u>consent</u>	Agree to do something. <i>He had consented to serve as external assessor on the panel.</i>
<u>exactly</u>	Used to emphasize the accuracy of a figure or description. <i>He was doing precisely or exactly what she had told him to do.</i>
fit	Make fit. <i>A fit of coughing.</i>
incidentally	Of a minor or subordinate nature. <i>Incidentally it was many months before the whole truth was discovered.</i>
<u>just</u>	Of an opinion or appraisal well founded justifiable. <i>It has just enough salt.</i>
<u>necessarily</u>	In such a manner as could not be otherwise. <i>It is necessarily so.</i>
obediently	In a manner that shows willingness to comply with an order or request; submissively. <i>Obediently she slipped off her right shoe and stocking.</i>
<u>obligation</u>	A binding agreement committing a person to a payment or other action. <i>He is under an obligation to finish the job.</i>
ok	A state in south central United States. <i>Things are okay.</i>
pertinent	Relevant or applicable to a particular matter; apposite. <i>Practitioners must consider all factors pertinent to a situation.</i>
respectively	In the order given. <i>The brothers were called Felix and Max respectively.</i>

simultaneous Occurring, operating, or done at the same time.
*A **simultaneous** withdrawal of troops.*

simultaneously At the same instant.
*The telethon was broadcast **simultaneously** on 31 US networks.*

together (of a couple) married or in a sexual relationship.
*They split up after ten years **together**.*

yes An affirmative answer or decision, especially in voting.
*Answering with assured and ardent **yeses**.*
