
Corresponds as a Verb

- Take the place of or be parallel or equivalent to.

Show grammatical agreement.

Everybody **agree**s that jobs will go.

check Put a check mark on or near or next to.

She glanced over her shoulder to ${\it check}$ that the door was shut.

Make equal, uniform, corresponding, or matching.

The level of prices will move to **equate** supply and demand.

Be the right size or shape fit correctly or as desired.

She was about to be **fit**ted for her costume.

gibe Laugh at with contempt and derision.

Some cynics in the media might **gibe**.

jibe Be compatible, similar or consistent; coincide in their characteristics.

Some cynics in the media might **jibe**.



Make equal uniform corresponding or matching. match


He tried to **match** her nonchalance.

represent

Be representative or typical for. It was **represent**ed to him that she would be an unsuitable wife.

stand for Occupy a place or location, also metaphorically.

Gain points in a game. **tally** Their signatures should **tally** with their names on the register.

accordance Conformity or agreement.

There is good **accordance** between the values.

Adapt or conform oneself to new or different conditions.

The film was **adapt**ed from a Turgenev short story.

Show grammatical agreement.

The verb **agree**s with the final noun.

Official recognition or approval.

approbationA term of **approbation**.

approveBelieve that someone or something is good or acceptable.

The budget was **approve**d by parliament.



assent Agreement with a statement or proposal to do something.

A loud murmur of **assent**.

coincideCorrespond in nature; tally.

The two events **coincide**d.

comply (of an article) meet specified standards.

You must **comply** or else.

concurHappen or occur at the same time; coincide.

The authors **concur**red with the majority.

Adapt or conform oneself to new or different conditions.

The countryside should **conform** to a certain idea of the picturesque.

conformance Correspondence in form or appearance.

Conformance testing.

conforming Adhering to established customs or doctrines (especially in religion.

consent Agree to do something.

He had **consent**ed to serve as external assessor on the panel.

Used to emphasize the accuracy of a figure or description.

He was doing precisely or **exactly** what she had told him to do.

fit Make fit.

A **fit** of coughing.

incidentally Of a minor or subordinate nature.

Incidentally it was many months before the whole truth was discovered.

Of an opinion or appraisal well founded justifiable.

iust

It has just enough salt.

In such a manner as could not be otherwise.

necessarily

It is necessarily so.

In a manner that shows willingness to comply with an order or request;

obediently submissively.

Obediently she slipped off her right shoe and stocking.

A binding agreement committing a person to a payment or other action.

He is under an **obligation** to finish the job.

ok A state in south central United States.

Things are **ok**ay.

Relevant or applicable to a particular matter; apposite.

Practitioners must consider all factors **pertinent** to a situation.

respectively In the order given.

The brothers were called Felix and Max respectively.



Occurring, operating, or done at the same time. **simultaneous**

A **simultaneous** withdrawal of troops.

 $\mathbf{simultaneously} \ \ \overset{\text{At the same instant.}}{\textit{The telethon was broadcast }} \mathbf{simultaneously} \ on \ 31 \ \textit{US networks.}$

(of a couple) married or in a sexual relationship. together

They split up after ten years together.

An affirmative answer or decision, especially in voting. <u>yes</u>

Answering with assured and ardent yeses.
