## Cottage as a Noun

### Definitions of "Cottage" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “cottage” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *(in the context of casual homosexual encounters) a public toilet.*
- *A small house, typically one in the country.*
- *A small house with a single story.*
- *A simple house forming part of a farm, used by a worker.*



## Synonyms of "Cottage" as a noun (9 Words)

<b><u>bungalow</u></b>	(in SE Asia) a large detached house with more than one storey.
<b>cabin</b>	A small house built of wood; usually in a wooded area. <i>Animals are not allowed in the <b>cabin</b> of the aircraft.</i>
<b>chalet</b>	A small cabin or house used by holidaymakers, forming a unit within a holiday complex.
<b>house</b>	The management of a gambling house or casino. <i>A <b>house</b> prefect.</i>
<b>lodge</b>	A North American Indian tent or wigwam. <i>A hunting <b>lodge</b>.</i>
<b>shack</b>	A roughly built hut or cabin.
<b>shanty</b>	Small crude shelter used as a dwelling.
<b>small house</b>	The slender part of the back.

**villa**

A rented holiday home abroad.  
*Madison **Villas**.*

## Associations of "Cottage" (30 Words)

### apartment

A suite of rooms usually on one floor of an apartment house.  
*A district of six storey **apartments** arranged along narrow streets.*

### bedroom

Denoting a small town or suburb whose residents commute to a nearby city.  
*She revealed the couple's **bedroom** secrets.*

### **bedside**

Space by the side of a bed (especially the bed of a sick or dying person).  
*He was summoned to the **bedside** of a dying man.*

### **building**

The occupants of a building.  
***Building** materials.*

### bungalow

A small house with a single story.

### ceiling

The inside planking of a ship's bottom and sides.  
*The government imposed a wage **ceiling** of 3 per cent.*

<b>condominium</b>	One of the dwelling units in a condominium. <i>Sudan was from 1899 an Anglo Egyptian <b>condominium</b>.</i>
<b>duplex</b>	Change into a duplex. <i>A <b>duplex</b> transaction.</i>
<b><u>dwelling</u></b>	Housing that someone is living in. <i>He built a modest <b>dwelling</b> near the pond.</i>
<b>edifice</b>	A complex system of beliefs. <i>It was an imposing <b>edifice</b>.</i>
<b>flophouse</b>	A dosshouse. <i>They are living in a <b>flophouse</b> and discovering that the streets are not paved with gold.</i>
<b>furnished</b>	(of accommodation) available to be rented with furniture. <i>A full sized fully <b>furnished</b> apartment.</i>
<b>home</b>	At or to or in the direction of one's home or family. <i>He grew up in a good Christian <b>home</b>.</i>
<b>homestead</b>	Land acquired from the United States public lands by filing a record and living on and cultivating it under the homestead law.
<b>hostess</b>	A woman steward on an airplane. <i>The perfect dinner party <b>hostess</b>.</i>
<b>house</b>	The management of a gambling house or casino. <i>A publishing <b>house</b>.</i>
<b><u>hut</u></b>	Provide with huts. <i>It will be advisable to <b>hut</b> the troops for their protection during the cold season.</i>
<b><u>letting</u></b>	The action of renting out a property. <i>The renovation of houses for <b>letting</b>.</i>
<b>lodge</b>	Be a lodger stay temporarily. <i>A hunting <b>lodge</b>.</i>
<b>lodging</b>	The act of lodging. <i>A fee for board and <b>lodging</b>.</i>
<b>manor</b>	One's own neighbourhood or area of operation. <i>They were the undisputed rulers of their <b>manor</b>.</i>
<b><u>mansion</u></b>	A terrace or mansion block. <i>Carlyle <b>Mansions</b>.</i>
<b>mews</b>	A group of stables, typically with rooms above, built round a yard or along an alley. <i>A <b>mews</b> house.</i>

<b><u>neighborhood</u></b>	An area within a city or town that has some distinctive features (especially one forming a community). <i>An ethnic <b>neighborhood</b>.</i>
<b>parlor</b>	A room in a private house or establishment where people can sit and talk and relax.
<b>rent</b>	Hold under a lease or rental agreement of goods and services. <i>We <b>rented</b> our apartment to friends while we were abroad.</i>
<b>rental</b>	Available to rent or lease. <i>A nominal <b>rental</b>.</i>
<b><u>residence</u></b>	The act of dwelling in a place. <i>The palace was designated the official <b>residence</b> of the head of state.</i>
<b><u>tenant</u></b>	Occupy property as a tenant. <i>The landlord can evict a <b>tenant</b> who doesn't pay the rent.</i>
<b><u>tenement</u></b>	(especially in Scotland or the US) a room or a set of rooms forming a separate residence within a house or block of flats.
