Cottage as a Noun

Definitions of "Cottage" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “cottage” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *(in the context of casual homosexual encounters) a public toilet.*
- *A small house, typically one in the country.*
- *A small house with a single story.*
- *A simple house forming part of a farm, used by a worker.*



Synonyms of "Cottage" as a noun (9 Words)

- bungalow** (in SE Asia) a large detached house with more than one storey.
- cabin** A small house built of wood; usually in a wooded area.
*Animals are not allowed in the **cabin** of the aircraft.*
- chalet** A small cabin or house used by holidaymakers, forming a unit within a holiday complex.
- house** The management of a gambling house or casino.
*A **house** prefect.*
- lodge** A North American Indian tent or wigwam.
*A hunting **lodge**.*
- shack** A roughly built hut or cabin.
- shanty** Small crude shelter used as a dwelling.
- small house** The slender part of the back.

villa

A rented holiday home abroad.
*Madison **Villas**.*

Associations of "Cottage" (30 Words)

apartment

A suite of rooms usually on one floor of an apartment house.
*A district of six storey **apartments** arranged along narrow streets.*

bedroom

Denoting a small town or suburb whose residents commute to a nearby city.
*She revealed the couple's **bedroom** secrets.*

bedside

Space by the side of a bed (especially the bed of a sick or dying person).
*He was summoned to the **bedside** of a dying man.*

building

The occupants of a building.
***Building** materials.*

bungalow

A small house with a single story.

ceiling

The inside planking of a ship's bottom and sides.
*The government imposed a wage **ceiling** of 3 per cent.*

condominium	One of the dwelling units in a condominium. <i>Sudan was from 1899 an Anglo Egyptian condominium.</i>
duplex	Change into a duplex. <i>A duplex transaction.</i>
<u>dwelling</u>	Housing that someone is living in. <i>He built a modest dwelling near the pond.</i>
edifice	A complex system of beliefs. <i>It was an imposing edifice.</i>
flophouse	A dosshouse. <i>They are living in a flophouse and discovering that the streets are not paved with gold.</i>
furnished	(of accommodation) available to be rented with furniture. <i>A full sized fully furnished apartment.</i>
home	At or to or in the direction of one's home or family. <i>He grew up in a good Christian home.</i>
homestead	Land acquired from the United States public lands by filing a record and living on and cultivating it under the homestead law.
hostess	A woman steward on an airplane. <i>The perfect dinner party hostess.</i>
house	The management of a gambling house or casino. <i>A publishing house.</i>
<u>hut</u>	Provide with huts. <i>It will be advisable to hut the troops for their protection during the cold season.</i>
<u>letting</u>	The action of renting out a property. <i>The renovation of houses for letting.</i>
lodge	Be a lodger stay temporarily. <i>A hunting lodge.</i>
lodging	The act of lodging. <i>A fee for board and lodging.</i>
manor	One's own neighbourhood or area of operation. <i>They were the undisputed rulers of their manor.</i>
<u>mansion</u>	A terrace or mansion block. <i>Carlyle Mansions.</i>
mews	A group of stables, typically with rooms above, built round a yard or along an alley. <i>A mews house.</i>

- neighborhood** An area within a city or town that has some distinctive features (especially one forming a community).
*An ethnic **neighborhood**.*
- parlor** A room in a private house or establishment where people can sit and talk and relax.
- rent** Hold under a lease or rental agreement of goods and services.
*We **rented** our apartment to friends while we were abroad.*
- rental** Available to rent or lease.
*A nominal **rental**.*
- residence** The act of dwelling in a place.
*The palace was designated the official **residence** of the head of state.*
- tenant** Occupy property as a tenant.
*The landlord can evict a **tenant** who doesn't pay the rent.*
- tenement** (especially in Scotland or the US) a room or a set of rooms forming a separate residence within a house or block of flats.
