- *An advisory, deliberative, or administrative body of people formally constituted and meeting regularly.*
- *An assembly of theologians and bishops and other representatives of different churches or dioceses that is convened to regulate matters of discipline or doctrine.*
- *(Christianity) an assembly of theologians and bishops and other representatives of different churches or dioceses that is convened to regulate matters of discipline or doctrine.*
- *A body of people elected to manage the affairs of a city, county, or other municipal district.*
- *Denoting housing provided by a local council at a subsidized rent.*

- A body serving in an administrative capacity.

administration	The process or activity of running a business, organization, etc. <i>A career in arts administration.</i>
advisory body	An announcement that usually advises or warns the public of some threat.
advisory group	An announcement that usually advises or warns the public of some threat.
<u>assembly</u>	The regular gathering of the teachers and pupils of a school at the start or end of the day. <i>They demanded the right of assembly.</i>
<u>board</u>	A flat portable surface usually rectangular designed for board games. <i>Pete set the pieces out on the board.</i>

board of directors	A flat portable surface (usually rectangular) designed for board games.
<u>cabinet</u>	A wooden box or piece of furniture housing a radio, television set, or speaker. <i>A cabinet meeting.</i>
<u>chamber</u>	A large underground cavern. <i>A burial chamber.</i>
commission	A work produced in response to a commission. <i>The motor was out of commission.</i>
committee	In the UK the whole House of Commons when sitting as a committee. <i>A committee is a group that keeps minutes and loses hours.</i>
<u>conclave</u>	The meeting place for a conclave.
<u>conference</u>	A discussion among participants who have an agreed (serious) topic. <i>A conference call.</i>
congress	A meeting of elected or appointed representatives. <i>An international congress of mathematicians.</i>
convocation	A legislative or deliberative assembly of a university. <i>The arguments delayed the convocation of the first congress planned for February 1992.</i>
delegates	A person appointed or elected to represent others.
delegation	A body of delegates or representatives; a deputation. <i>The delegation of power to the district councils.</i>
<u>diet</u>	A legislative assembly in certain countries (e.g., Japan). <i>Screen violence is becoming the staple diet of the video generation.</i>
<u>executive</u>	Suitable for a senior business executive. <i>The union executive.</i>
governing body	The act of governing; exercising authority.
<u>government</u>	The study of government of states and other political units. <i>He had considerable experience of government.</i>
legislature	Persons who make or amend or repeal laws. <i>The Nevada state legislature passed a law to prohibit dumping of nuclear waste.</i>
local authority	Anesthetic that numbs a particular area of the body.
local government	Anesthetic that numbs a particular area of the body.
<u>ministry</u>	Building where the business of a government ministry is transacted. <i>A ministry of Christian healing.</i>

panel

A list of medical practitioners registered in a district as accepting patients under the National Health Service or, formerly, the National Insurance Act.

*A control **panel**.*

parliament

A legislature similar to the UK Parliament in other nations and states.

*It is uncommon to see a **parliament** of owls in the wild.*

senate

Assembly possessing high legislative powers.

*The **senate** must ratify any treaty with a two thirds majority.*

trustees

Members of a governing board.

Associations of "Council" (30 Words)

adjudicate	Bring to an end; settle conclusively. <i>The Committee adjudicates on all betting disputes.</i>
<u>adopt</u>	(of a local authority) accept responsibility for the maintenance of (a road). <i>This approach has been adopted by many big banks.</i>
appoint	Decree. <i>He was appointed deputy manager.</i>
chieftain	The head of a tribe or clan. <i>Powerful feudal chieftains.</i>
<u>city</u>	A town created a city by charter and usually containing a cathedral. <i>Ancient Troy was a great city.</i>
community	A body of nations or states unified by common interests. <i>The scientific community.</i>

customs	The place at a port, airport, or frontier where officials check incoming goods, travellers, or luggage. <i>An inflow of customs duties to the Treasury.</i>
enact	Act out; represent or perform as if in a play. <i>Mystery Plays were staged and enacted by members of the guilds.</i>
enactment	A legal document codifying the result of deliberations of a committee or society or legislative body. <i>The enactment of equal pay legislation.</i>
enforcement	The act of compelling observance of or compliance with a law, rule, or obligation. <i>The strict enforcement of environmental regulations.</i>
extraterritorial	Situated outside a country's territory. <i>An extraterritorial decree of assassination from abroad.</i>
federal	Any federal law enforcement officer. <i>A federal Europe.</i>
ghetto	Any segregated mode of living or working that results from bias or stereotyping. <i>No escape from the ghetto of the typing pool.</i>
imposition	A thing that is imposed, in particular an unfair or unwelcome demand or burden. <i>He listened but resented the imposition.</i>
indian	Any of the languages spoken by Amerindians.
law	An individual rule as part of a system of law. <i>Law enforcement.</i>
legislate	Make laws, bills, etc. or bring into effect by legislation. <i>Constitutional changes will be legislated.</i>
legislation	The process of making or enacting laws. <i>Housing legislation.</i>
local	A local train or bus service. <i>Researching local history.</i>
lombard	A member of a Germanic people who invaded northern Italy in the 6th century.
lore	A body of traditions and knowledge on a subject or held by a particular group, typically passed from person to person by word of mouth. <i>Early peoples passed on plant and animal lore through legend.</i>
ordain	Make (someone) a priest or minister; confer holy orders on. <i>He was ordained a minister before entering Parliament.</i>

ordinance	An authoritative rule. <i>His strict observance of religious ordinances was no doubt quickened by the remorse he felt.</i>
reenact	Enact or perform again. <i>They reenacted the battle of Princeton.</i>
regulation	In accordance with regulations of the correct type. <i>Fiscal regulations are in the hands of politicians.</i>
sequester	Take legal possession of (assets) until a debt has been paid or other claims have been met. <i>In November 1956 the property was sequestered by the authorities.</i>
subdivision	A section of a section; a part of a part; i.e., a part of something already divided. <i>The subdivision of existing subjects.</i>
tariff	A list of import or export tariffs. <i>The reduction of trade barriers and import tariffs.</i>
<u>tax</u>	Levy a tax on. <i>She knew that the ordeal to come must tax all her strength.</i>
tribal	Members of tribal communities especially in South Asia. <i>People don't want political parties stuck in rigid tribal boundaries.</i>
