Too many to be counted (often used hyperbolically).  
*The oft quoted statement has been repeated **innumerable** times.*

### [legion](#)

Great in number.  
*Her fans are **legion**.*

### **manifold**

Having many different forms or elements.  
***Manifold** reasons.*

### **multifarious**

Many and of various types.  
*A vast **multifarious** organization.*

### **multitudinous**

Consisting of or containing many individuals or elements.  
***Multitudinous** rugs kept us warm.*

Countless or extremely great in number.  
***Myriad** stars.*
