<a href="#"><u>empire</u></a>	A large commercial organization owned or controlled by one person or group. <i>The British created a great <b>empire</b>.</i>
<b>fatherland</b>	A person's native country, especially when referred to in patriotic terms. <i>Those whom many considered traitors to the <b>fatherland</b>.</i>
<b>general public</b>	A general officer of the highest rank.
<b>great outdoors</b>	A person who has achieved distinction and honor in some field.
<b>green belt</b>	A piece of open land for recreational use in an urban area.
<b>homeland</b>	An autonomous or semi-autonomous state occupied by a particular people. <i>He left his <b>homeland</b> to settle in London.</i>
<a href="#"><u>kingdom</u></a>	The spiritual reign or authority of God. <i>The <b>kingdom</b> of dreams.</i>
<b>land</b>	Living or travelling on land rather than in water or the air. <i>Many people are leaving the <b>land</b> and going to work in the city.</i>
<b>mother country</b>	A term of address for a mother superior.
<b>motherland</b>	The country where you were born.
<a href="#"><u>nation</u></a>	The people who live in a nation or country. <i>The world's leading industrialized <b>nations</b>.</i>
<b>native land</b>	Indigenous plants and animals.
<b>native soil</b>	A person born in a particular place or country.
<b>palatinate</b>	A territory in southwestern Germany formerly ruled by the counts palatine.
<b>parts</b>	The local environment. <i>He hasn't been seen around these <b>parts</b> in years.</i>
<b>people</b>	The common people generally. <i>My <b>people</b> live in Warwickshire.</i>
<b>populace</b>	People in general considered as a whole. <i>The party misjudged the mood of the <b>populace</b>.</i>

<b><u>population</u></b>	The number of inhabitants (either the total number or the number of a particular race or class) in a given place (country or city etc). <i>The <b>population</b> seemed to be well fed and clothed.</i>
<b>principality</b>	(in traditional Christian angelology) the fifth-highest order of the ninefold celestial hierarchy.
<b><u>province</u></b>	A district under an archbishop or a metropolitan. <i>It was his <b>province</b> to take care of himself.</i>
<b><u>public</u></b>	The people who watch or are interested in an artist, writer, or performer. <i>Some famous last words to give my <b>public</b>.</i>
<b><u>realm</u></b>	A knowledge domain that you are interested in or are communicating about. <i>This zoogeographical <b>realm</b> includes Africa south of the Atlas Mountains.</i>
<b>res publica</b>	A politically organized body of people under a single government.
<b>sovereign state</b>	A nation's ruler or head of state usually by hereditary right.
<b>state</b>	The three traditional states of matter are solids fixed shape and volume and liquids fixed volume and shaped by the container and gases filling the container. <i>Don t get into a <b>state</b>.</i>
<b><u>terrain</u></b>	A piece of ground having specific characteristics or military potential. <i>A <b>terrain</b> of low green hills.</i>
<b><u>territory</u></b>	A region marked off for administrative or other purposes. <i>Sorties into enemy <b>territory</b>.</i>
