### Definitions of "Courtship" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “courtship” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A man's courting of a woman; seeking the affections of a woman (usually with the hope of marriage).*
- *The behaviour of male birds and other animals aimed at attracting a mate.*
- *A period during which a couple develop a romantic relationship before getting married.*
- *Behaviour designed to persuade someone to marry or develop a romantic relationship with one.*
- *The action of attempting to win a person's favour or support.*



## Synonyms of "Courtship" as a noun (14 Words)

<b>advances</b>	A tentative suggestion designed to elicit the reactions of others.
<b>affair</b>	Business and financial dealings. <i>The board admitted responsibility for the <b>affair</b>.</i>
<b>attentions</b>	A courteous act indicating affection. <i>She tried to win his heart with her many <b>attentions</b>.</i>
<b>courting</b>	A man's courting of a woman seeking the affections of a woman usually with the hope of marriage.
<b>dating</b>	Use of chemical analysis to estimate the age of geological specimens.
<b>engagement</b>	The act of giving someone a job. <i>The war's most significant <b>engagements</b> were fought to keep these sea lanes open.</i>
<b>going out</b>	The act of departing.
<b>going steady</b>	The act of departing.
<b>keeping company</b>	A cell in a jail or prison.

<b>love affair</b>	Sexual activities (often including sexual intercourse) between two people.
<b>pursuit</b>	The action of the eye in following a moving object. <i>Those whose business is the <b>pursuit</b> of knowledge.</i>
<b><u>romance</u></b>	The group of languages derived from Latin. <i>He asked her for a date and <b>romance</b> blossomed.</i>
<b>suit</b>	A lawsuit. <i>He could not compete with John in Marian s eyes and his <b>suit</b> came to nothing.</i>
<b>wooing</b>	A man's courting of a woman; seeking the affections of a woman (usually with the hope of marriage).

- *Its was a brief and intense courtship.*
- *He married his wife after a whirlwind courtship.*
- *His courtship of Emma was idyllically happy.*
