## Associations of "Covet" (30 Words)

<b><u>aspiration</u></b>	A cherished desire. <i>There is no <b>aspiration</b> if the syllable begins with s.</i>
<b><u>aspire</u></b>	Direct one's hopes or ambitions towards achieving something. <i>Other people will <b>aspire</b> to be like you.</i>
<b><u>beg</u></b>	Acquire food or money from someone by begging. <i>I <b>beg</b> to second the motion.</i>
<b>covetous</b>	Immoderately desirous of acquiring e.g. wealth. <i> Casting <b>covetous</b> eyes on his neighbor s fields.</i>
<b><u>crave</u></b>	Ask for. <i>I must <b>crave</b> your indulgence.</i>
<b><u>craving</u></b>	An intense desire for some particular thing. <i>A <b>craving</b> for chocolate.</i>
<b>desideratum</b>	Something that is needed or wanted. <i>Integrity was a <b>desideratum</b>.</i>
<b>desire</b>	Something that is desired. <i>John spake unto him and <b>desired</b> him in like manner and contestation as before.</i>
<b><u>envious</u></b>	Showing extreme cupidity; painfully desirous of another's advantages. <i>I m <b>envious</b> of their happiness.</i>
<b><u>famine</u></b>	Hunger. <i>Drought resulted in <b>famine</b> throughout the region.</i>
<b>grasping</b>	The act of gripping something firmly with the hands (or the tentacles). <i><b>Grasping</b> commercialism.</i>
<b>greedy</b>	Wanting to eat or drink more than one can reasonably consume. <i><b>Greedy</b> for money and power.</i>
<b>hanker</b>	Desire strongly or persistently. <i>He <b>hankered</b> after a lost golden age.</i>
<b>hankering</b>	A yearning for something or to do something. <i>He had a <b>hankering</b> to return to Scotland.</i>
<b>hope</b>	Be optimistic be full of hope have hopes. <i>I had high <b>hopes</b> of making the Olympic team.</i>
<b><u>hunger</u></b>	Feel or suffer hunger. <i>He <b>hungered</b> for a sense of self worth.</i>

<b><u>insatiable</u></b>	Of a person having an insatiable appetite or desire for something especially sex. <i>You re <b>insatiable</b> she cried as she pushed him away.</i>
<b><u>jealous</u></b>	Showing extreme cupidity; painfully desirous of another's advantages. <i>A <b>jealous</b> husband.</i>
<b><u>long</u></b>	A long period. <i>How <b>long</b> have you been working.</i>
<b><u>longing</u></b>	A yearning desire. <i>Her <b>longing</b> eyes.</i>
<b>need</b>	Have need of. <i>This shirt <b>needs</b> washing.</i>
<b>ravening</b>	Devouring or craving food in great quantities. <i><b>Ravening</b> creditors.</i>
<b><u>starve</u></b>	Be hungry; go without food. <i>The political prisoners <b>starved</b> to death.</i>
<b>thirst</b>	A strong desire for something. <i>A few could drink while many <b>thirsted</b>.</i>
<b><u>unquenchable</u></b>	Not able to be quenched. <i>His enthusiasm was <b>unquenchable</b>.</i>
<b>want</b>	Hunt or look for want for a particular reason. <i>The wheel <b>wants</b> greasing.</i>
<b><u>wish</u></b>	Hope for have a wish. <i>Her <b>wish</b> to be a mother.</i>
<b>wishing</b>	A specific feeling of desire. <i>He was above all <b>wishing</b> and desire.</i>
<b><u>yearn</u></b>	Desire strongly or persistently. <i>She <b>yearned</b> for a glimpse of him.</i>
<b>yearning</b>	Involving or expressing yearning. <i>A <b>yearning</b> hope.</i>
