Cow as a Noun

Definitions of "Cow" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “cow” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *(in farming) a female domestic bovine animal which has borne more than one calf.*
- *A fully grown female animal of a domesticated breed of ox, kept to produce milk or beef.*
- *The female of certain other large animals, for example elephant, rhinoceros, whale, or seal.*
- *An unpleasant or disliked woman.*
- *Mature female of mammals of which the male is called `bull.*
- *Female of domestic cattle.*
- *(loosely) a domestic bovine animal, regardless of sex or age.*
- *An unpleasant person or thing.*
- *A large unpleasant woman.*



Synonyms of "Cow" as a noun (1 Word)

moo-cow Female of domestic cattle.

Cow as a Verb

Definitions of "Cow" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "cow" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Subdue, restrain, or overcome by affecting with a feeling of awe; frighten (as with threats).*



Synonyms of "Cow" as a verb (1 Word)

Subdue, restrain, or overcome by affecting with a feeling of awe; frighten (as with **overawe** threats.

*The eleven year old was **overawed** by the atmosphere.*

- agrarian** Relating to rural matters.
*The **agrarian** reforms.*
- agriculture** The practice of cultivating the land or raising stock.
- arable** Arable land or crops.
***Arable** farming.*
- aurochs** Large recently extinct long-horned European wild ox; considered one of the ancestors of domestic cattle.
- bovine** Relating to or affecting cattle.
***Bovine** tuberculosis.*
- brindled** Having a grey or brown streak or a pattern or a patchy coloring; used especially of the patterned fur of cats.
- buffalo** Any of several Old World animals resembling oxen including e g water buffalo Cape buffalo.
*She didn't like being **buffaloed**.*

bull	A formal proclamation issued by the pope usually written in antiquated characters and sealed with a leaden bulla. <i>He bullied through his demands.</i>
butter	Spread butter on. <i>Butter bread.</i>
cattle	Animals of a group related to domestic cattle including yak bison and buffaloes. <i>So many head of cattle.</i>
cowhand	A hired hand who tends cattle and performs other duties on horseback.
creamery	A factory that produces butter and cheese.
dairy	A farm where dairy products are produced. <i>I rely on soya as a substitute for dairy.</i>
farm	A farmhouse. <i>It takes several people to work the farm.</i>
farmer	A person to whom the collection of taxes was contracted for a fee.
farmland	Arable land that is worked by plowing and sowing and raising crops.
grazing	The act of grazing. <i>Large areas of rough grazing.</i>
heifer	Young cow.
hen	Used in names of birds especially waterbirds of the rail family e.g moorhen native hen. <i>Today's naughty hens don't want to share the stories with their other halves.</i>
livestock	Farm animals regarded as an asset. <i>Markets for the trading of livestock.</i>
milk	The milk from cows or goats or sheep as consumed by humans. <i>I am milking this for all it's worth.</i>
milkmaid	A woman who works in a dairy.
nomad	A member of a people that travels from place to place to find fresh pasture for its animals and has no permanent home. <i>Dolly was a nomad who had finally taken root in Hawaii.</i>
ox	Used in names of wild animals related to or resembling a domesticated ox e.g musk ox. <i>An ox cart.</i>
poultry	A domesticated gallinaceous bird thought to be descended from the red jungle fowl. <i>Anyone handling raw poultry should wash their hands thoroughly.</i>

ranch	Run a ranch. <i>A beef cattle ranch.</i>
rancher	A person who owns or operates a ranch.
<u>rural</u>	In, relating to, or characteristic of the countryside rather than the town. <i>Unpaved rural roads.</i>
tilth	The state of aggregation of soil and its condition for supporting plant growth. <i>He could determine whether the soil was of the right tilth.</i>
