(usually accompanied by a desire to flee or fight.

feebleness The quality of lacking intensity or substance- Nathaniel Hawthorne.

Contemptible fearfulness.

pusillanimityThe **pusillanimity** of his answer surprised me.

spinelessness The quality of lacking a strong character; an irresolute disposition.

spiritlessness The trait of lacking enthusiasm for or interest in things generally.

timidity Lack of courage or confidence.

She believes everyone can overcome their **timidity**.



timorousness Fear of the unknown or unfamiliar or fear of making decisions.

A flaw or weak point. weakness

He has a weakness for chocolate.

Usage Examples of "Cowardice" as a noun

• His 11th-hour decision not to hold an election led to accusations of cowardice.

The unprovoked and **dastard**ly attack by Japan on December 7th.

The shameful failure to fulfil one's obligations.

dereliction The prosecution team were guilty of **dereliction** of duty for failing to

disclose evidence.

Marked by excessive self-indulgence and moral decay. effete

He chatted away exercising his rather **effete** charm.



fainthearted Lacking conviction or boldness or courage.

An anxious feeling. fear

The fear of God.

Lacking courage; ignobly timid and faint-hearted-P.B.Shelley. fearful

They are **fearful** of the threat of nuclear war.

Unpredictably excitable (especially of horses. **flighty** Her mother was a **flighty** Southern belle.

Thrown into a state of intense fear or desperation. frightened

The **frightened** child cowered in the corner.

Troubled persistently especially with petty annoyances. harried

Harried detectives answer ringing phones.

Failing to take proper care over something. negligent

Negligent in his correspondence.

pusillanimous Showing a lack of courage or determination; timid.

Fearful; frightened. scared

We re both **scared** of spiders.

(of an animal, especially a horse) nervous or excitable; easily scared. skittish

Skittish investors withdrew their money from equity markets.

Weak in willpower, courage or vitality. spineless

Spineless forms of prickly pear have been selected.

Thrown into a state of intense fear or desperation. terrified

The **terrified** horse bolted.

Fear of the unknown or unfamiliar or fear of making decisions. timidity

Showing or suffering from nervousness or a lack of confidence. timorous
