- *Suggesting connivance.*
- *Enjoying or affording comforting warmth and shelter especially in a small space.*

- informal** Having or fostering a warm or friendly and informal atmosphere.
An *informal* atmosphere.
- intimate** Innermost or essential.
The *intimate* structure of matter.
- snug** Very tight or close-fitting.
A *snug* harbor.

- *A cozy arrangement with the police.*

| ease | Of share prices interest rates etc decrease in value or amount. <i>Shares eased 6p to 224p.</i> |
| easy | With ease easy is sometimes used informally for easily. <i>Knowing that I had done my best my mind was easy.</i> |
| familiarly | In an intimately familiar manner. |
| handy | Placed or occurring conveniently. <i>Keep credit cards handy.</i> |
| homely | (of a place or surroundings) simple but cosy and comfortable, as in one's own home. <i>Homely truths.</i> |
| informal | Having or fostering a warm or friendly and informal atmosphere. <i>An informal gathering of friends.</i> |
| intimate | Having a sexual relationship. <i>An intimate knowledge of the software.</i> |
| mild | Mild and pleasant. <i>The climate was mild and conducive to life or growth.</i> |
| nice | (especially of a difference) slight or subtle. <i>Too nice about his food to take to camp cooking.</i> |
| niche | Place something in a niche or recess. <i>Her bed was tucked into a niche in the wall.</i> |
| pacify | Cause to be more favorably inclined; gain the good will of. <i>He had to pacify angry spectators.</i> |
| plain | Express complaints discontent displeasure or unhappiness. <i>The coastal plain.</i> |
| relaxation | The restoration of equilibrium following disturbance. <i>Relaxation of censorship rules.</i> |
| relaxing | Reducing tension or anxiety. <i>A relaxing massage with aromatherapy oils.</i> |
| simple | Used to emphasize the fundamental and straightforward nature of something. <i>The simple passage of time was enough.</i> |

- simplicity** Absence of affectation or pretense.
*For the sake of **simplicity** this chapter will concentrate upon one theory.*
- simplify** Make simpler or easier or reduce in complexity or extent.
*This move will **simplify** our lives.*
- snug** Place (something) safely or cosily.
*A well shaped hood for a **snug** fit.*
- soft** In a relaxed manner or without hardship soft is nonstandard.
***Soft** voices.*
- unattractive** Lacking power to arouse interest.
*As **unattractive** as most mining regions.*
- warm** Psychologically warm friendly and responsive.
***Warm** clad skiers.*
