### Definitions of "Cozy" as an adjective


According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "cozy" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Having or fostering a warm or friendly and informal atmosphere.*
- *Suggesting connivance.*
- *Enjoying or affording comforting warmth and shelter especially in a small space.*



## Synonyms of "Cozy" as an adjective (4 Words)

- cosy** Giving a feeling of comfort, warmth, and relaxation.  
A *cosy* deal.
- informal** Having or fostering a warm or friendly and informal atmosphere.  
An *informal* atmosphere.
- intimate** Innermost or essential.  
The *intimate* structure of matter.
- snug** Very tight or close-fitting.  
A *snug* harbor.



## Usage Examples of "Cozy" as an adjective

- *The small room was cozy and intimate.*
- *A cozy nook near the fire.*
- *Had a cozy chat.*
- *A cozy arrangement with the police.*



## Associations of "Cozy" (30 Words)

- assuage** Provide physical relief, as from pain.  
*The letter **assuaged** the fears of most members.*
- balmy** Informal or slang terms for mentally irregular.  
*The **balmy** days of late summer.*
- calm** The absence of strong emotions calm feelings.  
*The night was clear and **calm**.*
- casual** A youth belonging to a subculture characterized by the wearing of expensive casual clothing and frequently associated with football hooliganism.  
*A **casual** meeting.*
- clement** Inclined to show mercy.  
*It is a very **clement** day.*
- comfortable** (of a hospital patient) not in pain or in danger.  
*They appear very **comfortable** in each other's company.*

<b>comforted</b>	Made comfortable or more comfortable in a time of distress. <i>The news make her feel <b>comforted</b>.</i>
<b>convenient</b>	Large and roomy convenient is archaic in this sense. <i>I phoned your office to confirm that this date is <b>convenient</b>.</i>
<b>conveniently</b>	In a convenient manner. <i>This house is very <b>conveniently</b> located.</i>
<b>ease</b>	Of share prices interest rates etc decrease in value or amount. <i>Shares <b>eased</b> 6p to 224p.</i>
<b>easy</b>	With ease easy is sometimes used informally for easily. <i>Knowing that I had done my best my mind was <b>easy</b>.</i>
<b>familiarly</b>	In an intimately familiar manner.
<b>handy</b>	Placed or occurring conveniently. <i>Keep credit cards <b>handy</b>.</i>
<b>homely</b>	(of a place or surroundings) simple but cosy and comfortable, as in one's own home. <i><b>Homely</b> truths.</i>
<b>informal</b>	Having or fostering a warm or friendly and informal atmosphere. <i>An <b>informal</b> gathering of friends.</i>
<b>intimate</b>	Having a sexual relationship. <i>An <b>intimate</b> knowledge of the software.</i>
<b>mild</b>	Mild and pleasant. <i>The climate was <b>mild</b> and conducive to life or growth.</i>
<b>nice</b>	(especially of a difference) slight or subtle. <i>Too <b>nice</b> about his food to take to camp cooking.</i>
<b>niche</b>	Place something in a niche or recess. <i>Her bed was tucked into a <b>niche</b> in the wall.</i>
<b>pacify</b>	Cause to be more favorably inclined; gain the good will of. <i>He had to <b>pacify</b> angry spectators.</i>
<b>plain</b>	Express complaints discontent displeasure or unhappiness. <i>The coastal <b>plain</b>.</i>
<b>relaxation</b>	The restoration of equilibrium following disturbance. <i><b>Relaxation</b> of censorship rules.</i>
<b>relaxing</b>	Reducing tension or anxiety. <i>A <b>relaxing</b> massage with aromatherapy oils.</i>
<b>simple</b>	Used to emphasize the fundamental and straightforward nature of something. <i>The <b>simple</b> passage of time was enough.</i>

- simplicity** Absence of affectation or pretense.  
*For the sake of **simplicity** this chapter will concentrate upon one theory.*
- simplify** Make simpler or easier or reduce in complexity or extent.  
*This move will **simplify** our lives.*
- snug** Place (something) safely or cosily.  
*A well shaped hood for a **snug** fit.*
- soft** In a relaxed manner or without hardship soft is nonstandard.  
***Soft** voices.*
- unattractive** Lacking power to arouse interest.  
*As **unattractive** as most mining regions.*
- warm** Psychologically warm friendly and responsive.  
***Warm** clad skiers.*
