Associations of "Crack down" (30 Words)

abyss	A catastrophic situation seen as likely to occur. <i>The abyss between the two nations.</i>
aperture	A device that controls amount of light admitted. <i>The bell ropes passed through apertures in the ceiling.</i>
bifocal	A pair of glasses with bifocal lenses. <i>Bifocal eyeglasses.</i>
bifurcated	Divided into or made up of two parts. <i>Socially bifurcated populations.</i>
break	Become fractured break or crack on the surface only. <i>I was acting as referee and telling them to break.</i>
cleavage	The act of cleaving or splitting. <i>Holly and Bridget checked their cleavages and rearranged their hair.</i>
cleft	Split or divided. <i>A cleft chin.</i>
collapse	Collapse due to fatigue an illness or a sudden attack. <i>Some cots collapse down to fit into a holdall.</i>
crevice	A long narrow opening. <i>Many creatures hide in crevices in the rock.</i>
descending	Coming down or downward. <i>A rocky descending path.</i>
differential	An infinitesimal difference between successive values of a variable. <i>The differential features between benign and malignant tumours.</i>
differentiate	Evolve so as to lead to a new species or develop in a way most suited to the environment. <i>Little now differentiates the firm s products from its rivals.</i>

disjunction	The act of breaking a connection. <i>There is a disjunction between the skills taught in education and those demanded in the labour market.</i>
distinction	A discrimination between things as different and distinct on the basis of their characteristics or attributes. <i>She graduated with the highest distinction.</i>
diverge	Develop in a different direction. <i>The coverage by the columnists diverged from that in the main news stories.</i>
divergent	Diverging from another or from a standard. <i>Divergent thinking.</i>
divide	Force, take, or pull apart. <i>3 divides into 15.</i>
divided	Distributed in portions (often equal) on the basis of a plan or purpose. <i>A divided party leadership.</i>
falling	Coming down freely under the influence of gravity. <i>Falling temperatures.</i>
fissure	Break into fissures or fine cracks. <i>The bacteria survive around vents or fissures in the deep ocean floor.</i>
flop	With a flopping sound. <i>He landed on the bed with a great flop.</i>
gap	Make an opening or gap in. <i>The explosion made a gap in the wall.</i>
incised	Cut or impressed into a surface. <i>An incised design.</i>
interstice	A small structural space between tissues or parts of an organ. <i>The interstices of a network.</i>
partible	Involving or denoting a system of inheritance in which a deceased person's estate is divided equally among the heirs. <i>The entire family lost status as a consequence of partible inheritance.</i>
rupture	The act of making a sudden noisy break. <i>One of the boys was ruptured and needed to be fitted with a truss.</i>
separated	Separated at the joint. <i>A separated shoulder.</i>
snap	A card game in which cards from two piles are turned over simultaneously and players call snap as quickly as possible when two similar cards are exposed. <i>Snap your fingers.</i>

split
