Associations of "Crafted" (30 Words)

accomplished	Well educated and having good social skills. <i>An accomplished pianist.</i>
adroit	Clever or skilful. <i>An adroit negotiator.</i>
artisan	A worker in a skilled trade, especially one that involves making things by hand. <i>Street markets where local artisans display handwoven textiles painted ceramics and leather goods.</i>
artistry	Creative skill or ability. <i>The artistry of the pianist.</i>
capability	The susceptibility of something to a particular treatment. <i>Their nuclear weapons capability.</i>
competence	The quality of being adequately or well qualified physically and intellectually. <i>Courses to improve the competence of staff.</i>
craftsmanship	Skill in a particular craft. <i>I admire his engineering skills and craftsmanship.</i>
creativity	The ability to create. The use of imagination or original ideas to create something; inventiveness. <i>Firms are keen to encourage creativity.</i>
customize	Modify (something) to suit a particular individual or task. <i>Customize a car.</i>
dexterity	Adroitness in using the hands. <i>Her dexterity with chopsticks.</i>
exquisite	Delicately beautiful. <i>Her exquisite taste in painting.</i>

finesse	Great subtlety and tact in handling or manipulating people or difficult situations. <i>Orchestral playing of great finesse.</i>
handmade	Made by hand, not by machine, and typically therefore of superior quality. <i>His expensive handmade leather shoes.</i>
ingenuity	The quality of being clever, original, and inventive. <i>Considerable ingenuity must be employed in writing software.</i>
knack	A tendency to do something. <i>John had the enviable knack of falling asleep anywhere.</i>
originality	The ability to think and act independently. <i>He congratulated her on the originality of her costume.</i>
proficiency	The quality of having great facility and competence. <i>He demonstrated his proficiency in Chinese.</i>
skill	Train (a worker) to do a particular task. <i>Training firms are already seeing a boost from companies looking to skill employees in cloud technologies.</i>
skilled	(of work) requiring special abilities or training. <i>Skilled legal advice.</i>
sleight	Adroitness in using the hands. <i>Except by sleight of logic the two positions cannot be harmonized.</i>
tact	Skill and sensitivity in dealing with others or with difficult issues. <i>The inspector broke the news to me with tact and consideration.</i>
talent	Natural aptitude or skill. <i>Simon is a talent to watch.</i>
talented	Having a natural aptitude or skill for something. <i>A talented young musician.</i>
technical	Of or relating to technique or proficiency in a practical skill. <i>Technical terms.</i>
technique	A way of carrying out a particular task, especially the execution or performance of an artistic work or a scientific procedure. <i>An established athlete with a very good technique.</i>
toolmaker	Someone skilled in making or repairing tools.
virtuosity	Great skill in music or another artistic pursuit. <i>A performance of considerable virtuosity.</i>
workmanlike	Worthy of a good workman. <i>A steady workmanlike approach.</i>

workmanship The degree of skill with which a product is made or a job done.
*Cracks on the motorway were caused by poor **workmanship**.*
