## Craftsman as a Noun

### Definitions of "Craftsman" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “craftsman” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A professional whose work is consistently of high quality.*
- *A creator of great skill in the manual arts.*
- *A skilled worker who practices some trade or handicraft.*
- *(in the UK) a qualified private soldier in the Royal Electrical and Mechanical Engineers.*
- *A worker skilled in a particular craft.*



## Synonyms of "Craftsman" as a noun (13 Words)

- artificer** An enlisted man responsible for the upkeep of small arms and machine guns etc.
- artisan** (of food or drink) made in a traditional or non-mechanized way using high-quality ingredients.  
*Britain's **artisan** cheeses.*
- crafter** A creator of great skill in the manual arts.
- craftsperson** A person who is skilled at making things by hand (used as a neutral alternative).
- journeyman** A skilled worker who practices some trade or handicraft.  
*A **journeyman** carpenter.*
- maker** A business engaged in manufacturing some product.  
***Makers** of rubber products.*
- mechanic** A manual labourer or artisan.  
*A car **mechanic**.*

<b>operative</b>	Someone who can be employed as a detective to collect information. <i>The <b>operatives</b> clean the machines at the end of every shift.</i>
<b>smith</b>	Religious leader who founded the Mormon Church in 1830 (1805-1844). <i>We do not know whether the metals were mined and smelted by the <b>smith</b> or purchased from miners.</i>
<b>technician</b>	Someone known for high skill in some intellectual or artistic technique. <i>Liszt was one of the greatest piano <b>technicians</b> of all time.</i>
<b>tradesman</b>	A merchant who owns or manages a shop.
<b>tradesperson</b>	A person engaged in trading or a trade, typically on a relatively small scale. <i>A reputable <b>tradesperson</b>.</i>
<b>wright</b>	United States writer of detective novels (1888-1939).



## Usage Examples of "Craftsman" as a noun

- *Those craftsmen of post-war fiction.*
- *The tiles are handmade by trained craftsmen.*
- *Craftsman Browne.*

- *As an actor he was a consummate craftsman.*



## Associations of "Craftsman" (30 Words)

- adept** Someone who is dazzlingly skilled in any field.  
*He is an **adept** at imitation.*
- adroit** Quick or skillful or adept in action or thought.  
*An **adroit** negotiator.*
- artisan** A worker in a skilled trade, especially one that involves making things by hand.  
*Britain's **artisan** cheeses.*
- bricklayer** A craftsman skilled in building with bricks.
- builder** A person whose job is to construct or repair houses.  
*Empire **builder**.*

<b>carpenter</b>	Do the work of a carpenter. <i>The rails were <b>carpentered</b> very skilfully.</i>
<b>competence</b>	The legal authority of a court or other body to deal with a particular matter. <i>He found himself with an ample <b>competence</b> and no obligations.</i>
<b>competent</b>	(of a court or other body) accepted as having legal authority to deal with a particular matter. <i>The London Stock Exchange is the <b>competent</b> authority under the Financial Services Act.</i>
<b>craft</b>	An aircraft or spaceship. <i>A beautifully <b>crafted</b> object.</i>
<b>dexterous</b>	Skillful in physical movements; especially of the hands. <i>A <b>dexterous</b> keyboard player.</i>
<b>experienced</b>	Having experience; having knowledge or skill from observation or participation. <i>An <b>experienced</b> social worker.</i>
<b>expert</b>	A person with special knowledge or ability who performs skillfully. <i>An <b>expert</b> in healthcare.</i>
<b>handcraft</b>	Make something by hand. <i>We <b>handcraft</b> all our paper.</i>
<b>handmade</b>	Made by hand, not by machine, and typically therefore of superior quality. <i>His expensive <b>handmade</b> leather shoes.</i>
<b>mason</b>	A Freemason. <i>The chief <b>mason</b> at Westminster Abbey.</i>
<b>master</b>	Make a master copy of a film or recording. <i>In many ways dogs reflect the styles of their <b>masters</b>.</i>
<b>masterful</b>	Powerful and able to control others. <i><b>Masterful</b> technique.</i>
<b>plumber</b>	A craftsman who installs and repairs pipes and fixtures and appliances.
<b>practiced</b>	Having or showing knowledge and skill and aptitude. <i>A <b>practiced</b> marksman.</i>
<b>proficiency</b>	Skillfulness in the command of fundamentals deriving from practice and familiarity. <i>Practice greatly improves <b>proficiency</b>.</i>
<b>proficient</b>	A person who is proficient. <i>A <b>proficient</b> engineer.</i>
<b>repairman</b>	A skilled worker whose job is to repair things. <i>A TV <b>repairman</b>.</i>

- seasoned** (of food) having had salt, pepper, herbs, or spices added.  
*A **seasoned** traveler.*
- skilled** (of work) requiring special abilities or training.  
*A **skilled** trade.*
- skillful** Done with delicacy and skill.  
*The effect was achieved by **skillful** retouching.*
- tanner** A small coin of the United Kingdom worth six pennies; not minted since 1970.  
*Skincare companies are coming to the rescue of consumers with sunless **tanners**.*
- technician** A person skilled in the technique of an art or craft.  
*Liszt was one of the greatest piano **technicians** of all time.*
- veteran** A serviceman who has seen considerable active service.  
*A **veteran** of two world wars.*
- weaver** A songbird of tropical Africa and Asia, related to the sparrows and building elaborately woven nests.
- workmanlike** Worthy of a good workman.  
*The book is a **workmanlike** job with chronology and bibliography and index.*
