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Associations of "Cramming" (30 Words)

batch	Batch together assemble or process as a batch. <i>I had nothing to do but batch the reports.</i>
bumper-to-bumper	A mechanical device consisting of bars at either end of a vehicle to absorb shock and prevent serious damage.
<u>congested</u>	(of a part of the body) abnormally full of blood. <i>The congested streets of the West End.</i>
congestion	Excessive crowding. <i>The new bridge should ease congestion in the area.</i>
crowd	Cause to herd drive or crowd together. <i>A crowd of insects assembled around the flowers.</i>
crystallized	Having become fixed and definite in form. <i>Samples of rock containing the crystallized mineral zircon.</i>
impede	Be a hindrance or obstacle to. <i>The sap causes swelling which can impede breathing.</i>
<u>jam</u>	A hold obtained by jamming a part of the body such as a hand or foot into a crack in the rock. <i>Listeners jammed a radio station s switchboard with calls.</i>
<u>mass</u>	Assemble or cause to assemble into a single body or mass. <i>Seaside towns that catered for the masses.</i>
mob	An Aboriginal extended family or community. <i>He stood out from the rest of the mob with his silver hair and stacked shoes.</i>
<u>multitude</u>	A large indefinite number. <i>Father Peter addressed the multitude.</i>
obstruct	Block passage through. <i>An indirect free kick is awarded for intentionally obstructing an opponent.</i>

occlude	Stop, close up, or obstruct (an opening, orifice, or passage). <i>Occluded within these crystals are other molecules.</i>
overcrowd	Crowd together too much. <i>Try not to overcrowd the leaflet with text.</i>
<u>pack</u>	Have the property of being packable or of compacting easily. <i>The lead hound gives tongue and the pack takes off following the line of scent.</i>
pickle	A pickled cucumber. <i>Assorted pickles.</i>
pile	Place or lay as if in a pile. <i>He placed the books in a neat pile.</i>
<u>plurality</u>	The number by which plurality exceeds the number of votes cast for the candidate placed second. <i>Some languages add an extra syllable to mark plurality.</i>
rabble	Ordinary people, especially when regarded as socially inferior or uncouth. <i>The British feel no compunction about ushering the gentry into the coach and packing the rabble off to debtor s prison.</i>
<u>rally</u>	Drive in a rally. <i>He singled to start a rally in the 9th inning.</i>
riffraff	Disparaging terms for the common people.
<u>riot</u>	Take part in a riot disturb the public peace by engaging in a riot. <i>A young lord leaving the city after a night of riot.</i>
rout	An overwhelming defeat. <i>The retreat degenerated into a rout.</i>
sheaf	Bundle into sheaves. <i>The corn and barley had to be sheafed and stooked.</i>
<u>stack</u>	Fill or cover a place or surface with stacks of things. <i>Texas s capital punishment law stacks the deck in favour of death over prison.</i>
stuff	Fill with a stuffing while cooking. <i>Are you doing stuff Kevin he asked.</i>
throng	A large gathering of people. <i>The pavements are thronged with people.</i>
<u>toast</u>	Propose a toast to. <i>He found himself the toast of the baseball world.</i>
