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## Associations of "Cramming" (30 Words)

<b>batch</b>	Batch together assemble or process as a batch. <i>I had nothing to do but <b>batch</b> the reports.</i>
<b>bumper-to-bumper</b>	A mechanical device consisting of bars at either end of a vehicle to absorb shock and prevent serious damage.
<a href="#">congested</a>	(of a part of the body) abnormally full of blood. <i>The <b>congested</b> streets of the West End.</i>
<b>congestion</b>	Excessive crowding. <i>The new bridge should ease <b>congestion</b> in the area.</i>
<b>crowd</b>	Cause to herd drive or crowd together. <i>A <b>crowd</b> of insects assembled around the flowers.</i>
<b>crystallized</b>	Having become fixed and definite in form. <i>Samples of rock containing the <b>crystallized</b> mineral zircon.</i>
<b>impede</b>	Be a hindrance or obstacle to. <i>The sap causes swelling which can <b>impede</b> breathing.</i>
<a href="#">jam</a>	A hold obtained by jamming a part of the body such as a hand or foot into a crack in the rock. <i>Listeners <b>jammed</b> a radio station s switchboard with calls.</i>
<a href="#">mass</a>	Assemble or cause to assemble into a single body or mass. <i>Seaside towns that catered for the <b>masses</b>.</i>
<b>mob</b>	An Aboriginal extended family or community. <i>He stood out from the rest of the <b>mob</b> with his silver hair and stacked shoes.</i>
<a href="#">multitude</a>	A large indefinite number. <i>Father Peter addressed the <b>multitude</b>.</i>
<b>obstruct</b>	Block passage through. <i>An indirect free kick is awarded for intentionally <b>obstructing</b> an opponent.</i>

<b>occlude</b>	Stop, close up, or obstruct (an opening, orifice, or passage). <i><b>Occluded</b> within these crystals are other molecules.</i>
<b>overcrowd</b>	Crowd together too much. <i>Try not to <b>overcrowd</b> the leaflet with text.</i>
<b>pack</b>	Have the property of being packable or of compacting easily. <i>The lead hound gives tongue and the <b>pack</b> takes off following the line of scent.</i>
<b>pickle</b>	A pickled cucumber. <i>Assorted <b>pickles</b>.</i>
<b>pile</b>	Place or lay as if in a pile. <i>He placed the books in a neat <b>pile</b>.</i>
<b>plurality</b>	The number by which plurality exceeds the number of votes cast for the candidate placed second. <i>Some languages add an extra syllable to mark <b>plurality</b>.</i>
<b>rabble</b>	Ordinary people, especially when regarded as socially inferior or uncouth. <i>The British feel no compunction about ushering the gentry into the coach and packing the <b>rabble</b> off to debtor s prison.</i>
<b>rally</b>	Drive in a rally. <i>He singled to start a <b>rally</b> in the 9th inning.</i>
<b>riffraff</b>	Disparaging terms for the common people.
<b>riot</b>	Take part in a riot disturb the public peace by engaging in a riot. <i>A young lord leaving the city after a night of <b>riot</b>.</i>
<b>rout</b>	An overwhelming defeat. <i>The retreat degenerated into a <b>rout</b>.</i>
<b>sheaf</b>	Bundle into sheaves. <i>The corn and barley had to be <b>sheafed</b> and stooked.</i>
<b>stack</b>	Fill or cover a place or surface with stacks of things. <i>Texas s capital punishment law <b>stacks</b> the deck in favour of death over prison.</i>
<b>stuff</b>	Fill with a stuffing while cooking. <i>Are you doing <b>stuff</b> Kevin he asked.</i>
<b>throng</b>	A large gathering of people. <i>The pavements are <b>thronged</b> with people.</i>
<b>toast</b>	Propose a toast to. <i>He found himself the <b>toast</b> of the baseball world.</i>
