<b><u>container</u></b>	A discrete environment set up within an operating system in which one or more applications may be run, typically assigned only those resources necessary for the application to function correctly. <i>A <b>container</b> ship.</i>
<b>conveyance</b>	The legal process of transferring property from one owner to another. <i>Such protective measures might be taken before the <b>conveyance</b> is concluded.</i>
<b>crateful</b>	The quantity contained in a crate.
<b>drum</b>	A military drummer. <i>He could hear the <b>drums</b> before he heard the fifes.</i>
<b>hamper</b>	A restraint that confines or restricts freedom (especially something used to tie down or restrain a prisoner). <i>A picnic <b>hamper</b>.</i>
<b>machine</b>	A person who acts with the mechanical efficiency of a machine. <i>He was endorsed by the Democratic <b>machine</b>.</i>
<b>means of transport</b>	How a result is obtained or an end is achieved.
<b>motor vehicle</b>	Machine that converts other forms of energy into mechanical energy and so imparts motion.
<b>motorized vehicle</b>	A medium for the expression or achievement of something.
<b><u>pack</u></b>	A convenient package or parcel as of cigarettes or film. <i>A <b>pack</b> of wolves will encircle an ailing prey.</i>
<b><u>package</u></b>	A package holiday. <i>Someone had left a suspicious <b>package</b>.</i>
<b>packet</b>	The contents of a packet. <i>One man was fined 25 for dropping a crisp <b>packet</b> from his car window.</i>
<b>packing case</b>	Carrying something in a pack on the back.
<b>receptacle</b>	An organ or structure which receives a secretion, eggs, sperm, etc. <i>Fast food <b>receptacles</b>.</i>
<b>strongbox</b>	A strongly made box for holding money or valuables; can be locked.

The main part of an artery, nerve, or other anatomical structure from which smaller branches arise.

*He put his golf bag in the **trunk**.*

- bale** Make up into bales.  
*The straw is left on the field to be **baled** later.*
- bundle** Make into a bundle.  
*He was **bundled** into a van.*
- pack** Load with a pack.  
*He **packs** a gun and keeps it at the ready.*
- package** Put into a box.  
*It s a question of trying to **package** the book properly.*
- parcel** Make something into a parcel by wrapping it.  
***Parcel** rope.*
- wrap** Place an arm, finger, or leg round.  
*Words are **wrapped** to the next line if they are too long.*

<b>carousel</b>	A tournament in which groups of knights took part in demonstrations of equestrian skills. <i>They were waiting for their bags to appear on the <b>carousel</b>.</i>
<b>carrousel</b>	A conveyer belt that carries luggage to be claimed by air travelers.
<b>case</b>	Enclose in or as if in a case. <i>It was a <b>case</b> of bad judgment.</i>
<b>knapsack</b>	A soldier's or hiker's bag with shoulder straps, carried on the back, and typically made of canvas or other weatherproof material.
<b>load</b>	Fill or place a load on. <i>There s <b>loads</b> to see here even when it rains.</i>
<b>lug</b>	Carry with difficulty. <i>She began to <b>lug</b> her suitcase down the stairs.</i>
<b>luggage</b>	Cases used to carry belongings when traveling. <i>Carrying emotional <b>luggage</b> from the past.</i>
<b>pack</b>	Seal with packing. <i>A <b>pack</b> of girls in Georgia s class have been making her life a misery.</i>
<b>package</b>	A package holiday. <i>Someone had left a suspicious <b>package</b>.</i>
<b>packet</b>	Make up into or wrap up in a packet. <i><b>Packeted</b> fruit pies.</i>
<b>packing</b>	A charge made when delivering goods to cover the cost of packing them. <i>Polystyrene <b>packing</b>.</i>
<b>paperback</b>	A book with paper covers. <i>The <b>paperback</b> edition of her biography.</i>
<b>parcel</b>	Make something into a parcel by wrapping it. <i><b>Parcel</b> rope.</i>
<b>pile</b>	Place or lay as if in a pile. <i>For uniform color and texture tailors cut velvet with the <b>pile</b> running the same direction.</i>
<b>pocket</b>	Enclose as though in a pocket. <i>A <b>pocket</b> German dictionary.</i>
<b>portmanteau</b>	A large travelling bag, typically made of stiff leather and opening into two equal parts. <i>Podcast is a <b>portmanteau</b> a made up word coined from a combination of the words iPod and broadcast.</i>
<b>pouch</b>	Put into a pouch. <i>He <b>pouched</b> his fifth first prize by beating Higginson in the final.</i>

*Any official found to be involved would be **sacked** on the spot.*
- sheaf** A package of several things tied together for carrying or storing.  
*He waved a **sheaf** of papers in the air.*
- shipping** Ships considered collectively, especially those in a particular area or belonging to a particular country.  
*A **shipping** company.*
- stow** Fill by packing tightly.  
***Stow** the cart.*
- stuff** Fill with a stuffing while cooking.  
*He s into all that running and swimming and **stuff**.*
- [suitcase](#) A case with a handle and a hinged lid, used for carrying clothes and other personal possessions.  
*Three huge **suitcases** and a plethora of hand baggage.*
- [unpack](#) Remove (something) from a suitcase, bag, or package.  
*I haven t **unpacked** yet.*
