casket	A small wooden box for cremated ashes. <i>A small brass casket containing four black opals.</i>
<u>chest</u>	A small cabinet for medicines, toiletries, etc. <i>An oak chest.</i>
coffer	A decorative sunken panel in a ceiling. <i>There is not enough money in the coffers to finance the reforms.</i>
<u>container</u>	A discrete environment set up within an operating system in which one or more applications may be run, typically assigned only those resources necessary for the application to function correctly. <i>A container ship.</i>
conveyance	The legal process of transferring property from one owner to another. <i>Such protective measures might be taken before the conveyance is concluded.</i>
crateful	The quantity contained in a crate.
drum	A military drummer. <i>He could hear the drums before he heard the fifes.</i>
hamper	A restraint that confines or restricts freedom (especially something used to tie down or restrain a prisoner). <i>A picnic hamper.</i>
machine	A person who acts with the mechanical efficiency of a machine. <i>He was endorsed by the Democratic machine.</i>
means of transport	How a result is obtained or an end is achieved.
motor vehicle	Machine that converts other forms of energy into mechanical energy and so imparts motion.
motorized vehicle	A medium for the expression or achievement of something.
<u>pack</u>	A convenient package or parcel as of cigarettes or film. <i>A pack of wolves will encircle an ailing prey.</i>
<u>package</u>	A package holiday. <i>Someone had left a suspicious package.</i>
packet	The contents of a packet. <i>One man was fined 25 for dropping a crisp packet from his car window.</i>
packing case	Carrying something in a pack on the back.
receptacle	An organ or structure which receives a secretion, eggs, sperm, etc. <i>Fast food receptacles.</i>
strongbox	A strongly made box for holding money or valuables; can be locked.

trunk

The main part of an artery, nerve, or other anatomical structure from which smaller branches arise.

*He put his golf bag in the **trunk**.*

- *Pack (something) in a crate for transportation.*



Synonyms of "Crate" as a verb (6 Words)

- bale** Make up into bales.
*The straw is left on the field to be **baled** later.*
- bundle** Make into a bundle.
*He was **bundled** into a van.*
- pack** Load with a pack.
*He **packs** a gun and keeps it at the ready.*
- package** Put into a box.
*It s a question of trying to **package** the book properly.*
- parcel** Make something into a parcel by wrapping it.
***Parcel** rope.*
- wrap** Place an arm, finger, or leg round.
*Words are **wrapped** to the next line if they are too long.*

attache	A specialist assigned to the staff of a diplomatic mission.
backpack	Hike with a backpack. <i>A week s backpacking in the Pyrenees.</i>
<u>bag</u>	The amount contained in a bag. <i>An estimated bag of 3 000 ducks.</i>
box	The quantity contained in a box. <i>He gave her a box of chocolates.</i>
bundle	Make into a bundle. <i>She made a bundle selling real estate.</i>
<u>burden</u>	Impose a task upon, assign a responsibility to. <i>The tax burden on low wage earners.</i>

carousel	A tournament in which groups of knights took part in demonstrations of equestrian skills. <i>They were waiting for their bags to appear on the carousel.</i>
carrousel	A conveyer belt that carries luggage to be claimed by air travelers.
case	Enclose in or as if in a case. <i>It was a case of bad judgment.</i>
knapsack	A soldier's or hiker's bag with shoulder straps, carried on the back, and typically made of canvas or other weatherproof material.
load	Fill or place a load on. <i>There s loads to see here even when it rains.</i>
lug	Carry with difficulty. <i>She began to lug her suitcase down the stairs.</i>
luggage	Cases used to carry belongings when traveling. <i>Carrying emotional luggage from the past.</i>
<u>pack</u>	Seal with packing. <i>A pack of girls in Georgia s class have been making her life a misery.</i>
<u>package</u>	A package holiday. <i>Someone had left a suspicious package.</i>
packet	Make up into or wrap up in a packet. <i>Packeted fruit pies.</i>
packing	A charge made when delivering goods to cover the cost of packing them. <i>Polystyrene packing.</i>
paperback	A book with paper covers. <i>The paperback edition of her biography.</i>
<u>parcel</u>	Make something into a parcel by wrapping it. <i>Parcel rope.</i>
pile	Place or lay as if in a pile. <i>For uniform color and texture tailors cut velvet with the pile running the same direction.</i>
pocket	Enclose as though in a pocket. <i>A pocket German dictionary.</i>
portmanteau	A large travelling bag, typically made of stiff leather and opening into two equal parts. <i>Podcast is a portmanteau a made up word coined from a combination of the words iPod and broadcast.</i>
pouch	Put into a pouch. <i>He pouched his fifth first prize by beating Higginson in the final.</i>

sack	Put in a sack. <i>Any official found to be involved would be sacked on the spot.</i>
sheaf	A package of several things tied together for carrying or storing. <i>He waved a sheaf of papers in the air.</i>
shipping	Ships considered collectively, especially those in a particular area or belonging to a particular country. <i>A shipping company.</i>
stow	Fill by packing tightly. <i>Stow the cart.</i>
stuff	Fill with a stuffing while cooking. <i>He s into all that running and swimming and stuff.</i>
<u>suitcase</u>	A case with a handle and a hinged lid, used for carrying clothes and other personal possessions. <i>Three huge suitcases and a plethora of hand baggage.</i>
<u>unpack</u>	Remove (something) from a suitcase, bag, or package. <i>I haven t unpacked yet.</i>
